The number of train accidents (excluding trespassing at unmanned crossings) has decreased – 93 in 2010–11 to 77 in 2011–12; 68 in 2012–13 and 71 in 2013–14. The number of the dead and injured in these accidents have been declining. Here is a look at the numbers






