'Charity commissioner meant to supervise, not enforce morality'

Holding that the Charity Commissioner's powers are meant for supervision and not for enforcing moral accountability, the Bombay High Court quashed an order directing a Nashik-based school to publish a public apology in two widely circulated newspapers.

The apology had been ordered after parents accused the school of misleading them by claiming that it was affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE). Justice Amit Borkar, on January 29, ruled that Section 41A of the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act gives the Charity Commissioner limited powers to oversee the financial and proprietary administration of public trusts. These powers, the court said, do not extend to addressing grievances that are unconnected with trust property or income.

Justice Borkar noted that if "proper administration" were

interpreted in a moral sense, Section 41A would become "an open-ended source of authority, which the legislature has consciously avoided".

The court noted that in the present case, the complaint before the Charity Commissioner did not allege misuse of trust funds, illegal alienation of property, improper investments, failure to maintain statutory records, or breach of fiduciary duties. Instead, the grievance concerned the school's alleged misrepresentation about CBSE affiliation and its impact on parents and students.

The judge further said that

directing the school to issue a public apology did not protect trust property, regulate trust income, or ensure statutory compliance. "Section 41A is thus a power of supervision and not of moral correction. Its purpose is to preserve the financial and proprietary aspect of public trusts," the court said.

According to the school, its managing body, RB Bohora Educational & Welfare Trust, was registered in 1998 and permitted to establish New Era English School in 1999. The school obtained SSC Board affiliation in 2002. In 2004, following requests from parents, the trust sought CBSE affiliation, but the CBSE rejected the application after an inspection in February 2009, as well as a subsequent appeal.

Based on these facts, some parents approached the Charity Commissioner, Nashik. The High Court, however, quashed the June 28, 2010 order directing the school to publish a public apology.

I am a single mother who has a 36-year-old unmarried daughter. She refuses to get married, but I have often espied her masturbating in her room. I am worried. Please advise.



Six bio-toilets at Coastal Rd, pay ₹5 per use

MUMBAI

The BMC has installed six bio-toilets along the Coastal Road promenade. Located at pedestrian underpasses (PUPs), they are under the 'Pay & Use' system, with a fee of ₹5 for both men and women. These facilities are located at key points: near Amarsons Garden (PUP 2), Akruti Building parking area (PUP 4), Haji Ali Junction (PUP 6), in front of Worli Dairy (PUP 11), near Bindumadhav Thackeray Chowk (PUP 12), and on Khan Abdul Gaffar Khan Road, north of Bindumadhav Thackeray Chowk (PUP 14). These state-of-the-art modular biodegradable toilets measure 20 x 8 ft and are powered by a 1 kW solar energy system. The facility features two toilets for women (one Western-style and one Indian-style), two for men, one for children, and one Western-style toilet for differently-abled users. Additional amenities include six urinals, three washbasins, three sensor-based flush systems, three soap dispensers, a sanitary pad incinerator, a sanitary pad vending machine, a 1,000-liter water tank, and a 3,000-liter DRDO bio-digester.

More than 1,600 CCTV cameras, 6 police teams help solve abduction case of 3mth-old baby

Hint of baby's sock in CCTV footage helped mom identify her and put the police on the abductor's trail

In a case where crucial leads repeatedly hit dead ends, it was a tiny detail – a toddler's sock – along with footage from nearly 1,600 CCTV cameras that helped the Mumbai police crack the kidnapping of a three-month-old baby girl. The six-day operation led to the arrest of three accused and the safe rescue of the infant.

The incident occurred on January 22 at around 6pm, when complainant Farzana Mansuri, 23, a resident of Kausa, Mumbai, was crossing Khadi Machine Road near DCB Bank with her two daughters. An unknown woman wearing a burqa initiated a conversation, took Mansuri's three-month-old daughter, Afia Khatoon, in her lap, and fled. A kidnapping case was registered under Section 137(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita.

BABY'S SOCK BECAME CLUE
Initial CCTV footage from the crime scene showed the burqa-clad woman leaving the area in an auto-rickshaw towards Mumbai railway station. Police teams began tracking her movements through CCTV cameras across stations on the



Mumbai-CSMT-Vangani route.

While reviewing footage, officers noticed a sock peeping out from beneath the burqa, worn on the baby's foot. This proved to be a crucial identifying detail.

"Our teams re-scanned the footage and noticed another burqa-clad woman. Though the toddler was fully covered, a few inches of the baby's socks were visible, based on which the mother identified her child," said a senior police officer.

At Mumbai railway station, the woman was seen handing over the baby to a couple before leaving the station. The couple later alighted at Thane railway station, changed the cloth wrapping the baby, and the woman altered her veil in an apparent attempt to mislead investigators.

Baby traced to Akola, 3 arrested

During further scrutiny, the police identified a third suspicious burqa-clad woman exiting Mumbai station. Acting on local intelligence, police detained her from the Ishaanagar area. She was identified as Nasreen Iqbal Shaikh.

During interrogation, Shaikh revealed that the baby had been sent to Khetri village in Patur taluka of Akola district. A police team immediately proceeded to Akola and conducted a raid, safely rescuing baby Afia. Two more accused – Mohammad Gulab, 31, and his wife Khairunnisa, 30 – were arrested from the location.

Commendable work

Senior officials including Joint Commissioner of Police Datta Nalawade, Additional Commissioner of Police Ashok Dudhe, Deputy Commissioner of Police Ganesh Gawde, Assistant Commissioner of Police (Mumbai Division) Parag Agawane, Senior Police Inspector Anil Shinde, Police Inspector (Crime) Babasaheb Pawar, Assistant Police Inspector Vishal Mane, and the entire police team were commended for their efforts.

BBATRC in Taloja

Former CJI Bhushan Gavai, on Saturday, inaugurated the Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Advocate Training and Research Centre (BBATRC).
