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Iran's parliament sacks minister over alleged mismanagement

Tehran: Iran's parliament voted on Sunday to fire the country's industries minister over alleged mismanagement amid widespread dissatisfaction with the government. Parliament Speaker Mohammad Bagher Qalibaf said 162 of 272 lawmakers present

voted in favour of dismissing Reza Fatemi Amin. The chamber has 290 seats. Fatemi Amin survived a previous impeachment in 2022. The decision came following discussion among lawmakers and government officials who questioned the minister.

Nepal's President Paudel discharged

Kathmandu: Nepal's President Ramchandra Paudel has been discharged from a hospital in New Delhi after undergoing treatment for a chest-related ailment and he will return to Kathmandu on Sunday night, the President's office said. Paudel, 78, was airlifted to India on April 19 for treatment at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, after he complained of shortness of breath. "President Paudel is flying back to Kathmandu through Nepal Airlines flight after he was discharged from the hospital," the President's office said.

Pak leader Elahi booked in graft case

Islamabad: After the terror case, new charges have been filed against Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) President and former Punjab chief minister Chaudhry Pervaiz Elahi, ARY News reported. The Anti-Corruption Establishment Gujranwala filed a case against Elahi citing a source report, in which Elahi has been accused of taking a bribe worth Rs 2 billion for the contract of a development scheme. Haji Tariq, the owner of SDO Highway Gujarat and previously arrested Sohail Asghar Chaudhry have also been named in the case.

Philippines: Military raid kills 7 rebels

Manila: Seven suspected left-wing rebels were on Sunday killed in a raid by the military in the Philippines. Army Captain Jefferson Mariano said the troops assaulted a New People's Army (NPA) hideout in Northern Samar province after villagers reported the rebels' presence there. Mariano said the military used air and artillery to penetrate the lair heavily fortified with anti-personnel mines, resulting in 30-minute fighting. After the dash, Mariano said troops recovered seven bodies and several guns and ammunition.

Man kills 3, self over pigeon races

Madrid: A man fatally shot three people before turning his gun on himself, the Portuguese police said on Sunday, in what the local media described as a dispute among rival pigeon racers. Andreia Goncalves, police commissioner in the city of Setubal, said there was a dispute between four men and one of them had killed the others before shooting himself. She called the deaths as "an isolated situation" related to an unresolved issue between the men.

Emergency aid reaches Sudan as fighting continues

An aircraft carrying eight tonnes of emergency medical aid landed on Sunday in Sudan to resupply hospitals devastated by more than two weeks of fighting between forces loyal to rival generals. The supplies are enough to treat hundreds of wounded, as the civilian death toll from the countrywide violence topped 400.

The conflict erupted on April 15 between the nation's army and its paramilitary force, and threatens to thrust Sudan into a raging civil war.

More than two-thirds of hospitals in areas with active fighting are out of service, a national doctors' association has said, citing a shortage of medical supplies, health workers, water and electricity.

On Sunday, the aircraft carrying medical aid took off from Jordan and landed in the city of Port Sudan, said the International Committee of the Red Cross.

The supplies, including anaesthetics, dressings, sutures and other surgical material, are enough to treat more than 1,000 people wounded in the conflict, the ICRC said.

"The hope is to get this ma-

terial to some of the most critically busy hospitals in the capital" of Khartoum and other hot spots, said Patrick Youssef, ICRC's regional director for Africa.

Youssef said the agency has been in contact with the top command of both sides to ensure that medical assistance could reach hospitals safely.

Youssef said more medical aid was ready to be flown into Khartoum pending necessary clearances and security guarantees.

Sudan's healthcare system is near collapse with dozens of hospitals out of service. Multiple aid agencies have

had to suspend operations and evacuate employees.

The Sudan Doctors' Syndicate, which monitors casualties, said on Sunday that over the past two weeks, 425 civilians were killed and 2,091 wounded.

The Sudanese Health Ministry on Saturday put the overall death toll, including fighters, at 528, with 4,500 wounded.

Some of the deadliest battles have raged across Khartoum. The fighting pits the army chief, Gen Abdel Fattah Burhan, against Gen. Mohammed Hamdan Dagalo, the head of a paramilitary group known as the Rapid

3 killed 8 hurt in separate shooting incidents in US

Three people were killed while eight were injured in three different incidents of shooting that took place in Seattle, New Orleans and Mississippi.

Two men were killed and a person was wounded during a shooting in a Seattle park on Saturday night, the police said.

Police reached at Cal Anderson Park around 10:30 pm, after getting a call. Officers found three men with gunshot wounds and provided first aid. One man succumbed to his injuries at the scene, the police said.

Two others were transported in the Capitol Hill neighbourhood to Har-

borview Medical Centre, where the second man died, the police said.

A shooting outside a well-known New Orleans restaurant killed an employee, and one bullet penetrated the restaurant and wounded a Chicago tourist visiting for the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival.

Interim New Orleans police Superintendent Michelle Woodfork told reporters that the shooting happened outside Mandina's Restaurant in

New Orleans' Mid-City neighbourhood.

The 54-year-old Chicago woman was visiting for Jazz Fest and was at Mandina's "to celebrate birthday of a friend," when she was shot, Woodfork said.

In yet another incident, six high school students were injured after gunfire erupted at a house party in southern Mississippi. The shootings happened overnight Saturday in Bay St. Louis, about 46 kilometres west of Biloxi.



Imran sees ill intentions in poll reschedule

Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman **Imran Khan** blamed the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM)-led government's "ill-intentions" behind its proposal to hold elections simultaneously after this year's budget, local media reported. The budget is traditionally presented within the first two weeks of June and the federal government has maintained that it would be too early to hold general elections the next month, stressing for holding polls later this year, Geo News reported.

The federal government and the opposition party PTI are in negotiations over a date for holding elections across the country on directions of the Supreme Court - and a final meeting is expected next week.

"(The government) is saying that first, it would pass the budget, and then hold the election. This shows its 'ill-intention,'" Khan - who was ousted as the prime minister in April last year - said during a session with PTI workers in Lahore.



Mann Ki Baat is story of New India, says Jaishankar

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's *Mann ki Baat* is the story of a changing India - a 'New India' - and is a connection between India and the world, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Sunday as he joined the community members at a special event to listen 100th episode of the monthly radio programme.

Jaishankar, who is here after his visit to Guyana, Panama, Colombia and Dominican Republic, made the remarks while addressing the community event, attended by the members of the Indian community on Sunday.

"In many ways, the story of *Mann Ki Baat* is the story of the last nine years, is the story of changing India. It is the emergence of a 'New India', it is the connection between India and the world - that this is today a different India, a more aware India, in many ways, I would say a more aspirational India which is connecting to the world," Jaishankar said.

Jaishankar highlighted the impact that the conversations and ideas in *Mann Ki Baat* have had on the people in India and how it has motivated them.

He said while there have been episodes that have motivated and inspired people

The resolution in Senate was introduced by Indian-American Senator Kevin Thomas and in the Assembly by Indian-American Assembly woman Jenifer Rajkumar. The New Jersey General Assembly resolution has been introduced by Assemblyman Raj Mukherji. Edison Mayor Sam Joshi also presented a resolution.

Uzbekistan votes for rights reforms

Voters in Uzbekistan, the most populous former Soviet Central Asian republic, cast ballots on Sunday in a referendum on a revised constitution that promises human rights reforms but also would allow the country's president to stay in office until 2040.

Approval appears certain. Backers have conducted an array of promotional events featuring local celebrities, and elections in Uzbekistan are widely regarded as non-competitive.

With four hours until the polls closed, the central elec-

tions commission reported turnout at more than 62 per cent, well above 50per cent threshold for referendum to be valid. The proposed changes include lengthening presidential term from five to seven years, while retaining the existing two-term limit.

Although President Shavkat Mirziyoyev is in his second term, the change in term length would allow him to run twice more after his current tenure ends in 2026.

Other changes include abolishing capital punishment and boosting legal protections for citizens, including those accused of crimes.
