'GoliKa Jawab Gole Se': PM Modi On India's Decisive Response In Operation Sindoor

BHOPAL,(AGENCIES):

"Golikajawabgole se diyajayega (a bullet will be answered with artillery)," Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared on Saturday, sending a blunt warning to terrorists, their sponsors and Pakistan, as he described Operation Sindoor as India's most decisive counter-terror strike to date. Addressing the Lokmata Devi Ahilyabai Mahila Sashaktikaran Mahasammelan in Bhopal, PM Modi said that Operation Sindoor marked India's biggest offensive against terrorism. "Operation Sindoor is India's biggest attack on terrorists and their bases. It stands as a symbol of the nation's strength," he said. He further stressed that India's response reflects the collective resolve of the nation. "Today, the voice of 140 crore Indians says - if you fire bullets, be ready to face the consequences," he

added. Linking the recent Pahalgam terror attack, which triggered Operation Sindoor, to a broader assault on India's civilisation, PM Modi said, "In Pahalgam, terrorists not only spilled Indian blood, they attacked our culture and tried to divide our society. Above all, they dared to challenge India's Nari Shakti (women power)." Underscoring the role of women officers in the operation, PM Modi praised the Border Security Force (BSF) for its frontline contribution. "From Jammu to Punjab, Rajasthan to Gujarat, our BSF daughters manned the frontlines and fiercely responded to cross-border firing. From command and control centres to demolishing enemy posts, BSF's daughters displayed remarkable valour," he said. Taking the theme of Nari Shakti further, PM Modi highlighted the growing role of women in India's rise across sectors. "Today, a large number of our daughters are



becoming scientists, doctors, engineers, and pilots. In our major space missions too, many women scientists are leading the way. In the Chandrayaan-3 mission alone, over 100 women scientists and engineers contributed to its success," he said. Issuing a sharp warning to terror networks and their backers, PM Modi said Operation Sindoor has delivered a clear message: "Proxy war through terrorists

will no longer work. We will strike inside enemy territory, and those who support terrorists will also have to pay a heavy price." The Prime Minister revealed that Indian forces struck terror camps "hundreds of kilometres inside enemy territory, in areas even Pakistan's army could not imagine." PM Modi also explained the cultural symbolism behind the operation's name. "India is a

land of culture and values. In our tradition, sindoor symbolises women power. Even Lord Hanuman, immersed in devotion to Lord Ram, wears sindoor. In Shakti worship, sindoor is offered - and today, that very sindoor has become a symbol of India's valour," he said. Connecting the tribute to Ahilyabai Holkar with his governance vision, Modi said, "Today, our government works on the same principles that Lokmata Ahilyabai lived by. 'Nagrik Devo Bhavah' - citizens are like gods - is the mantra of our governance. Women-led development is now the central axis of our growth model. In every major government scheme, women are at the core." He concluded by saying that India now places full faith in its daughters to safeguard both development and national security. "Whether it is fighting Naxals or cross-border terrorism, our

daughters are becoming the shield of India's security," PM Modi said. Operation Sindoor, launched in the aftermath of the Pahalgam attack, targeted multiple terror infrastructure sites across the border, marking a significant escalation in India's counter-terrorism posture. During his visit to Bhopal, the Prime Minister also inaugurated a series of development projects, including the Indore Metro's Yellow Line Super Priority Corridor, operationalisation of Datia and Satna airports, and laid the foundation for ghat construction projects worth over Rs 860 crore on the Kshipra River for the Simhastha Mahakumbh 2028. He also released a commemorative Rs 300 coin and stamp honouring Lokmata Ahilyabai Holkar, and transferred funds for the construction of 1,271 Atal Gram Sushasan Bhawans across Madhya Pradesh.

India Has Stayed Strong In Crisis Due To Constitution, Says CJI Gava

Chief Justice of India (CJI) B R Gavaisaid that whenever the country has faced a crisis, it has remained united and strong, and that the Constitution should be credited for this. The CJI was addressing a function after the inauguration of advocate chambers and a multi-level parking at the Allahabad High Court here. "When the Constitution was being made and its final draft was presented before the Constituent Assembly, at that time some people used to say that the Constitution is too federal while some used to say that it is too unitary. "Baba SahebBhimraoAmbedkar had replied that the Constitution is neither wholly federal nor wholly unitary. But one thing I can tell you is that we have given a Constitution which will keep India united and strong both in times of peace and war," CJI Gavai said. He said India has been on the path of development after independence due to the



Constitution. "Today we see what is the condition of our neighbouring countries. And India is making a journey towards development after independence. Whenever there has been a crisis in the country, it has remained united and strong. The credit for this should be given to the Constitution," he said. "It is our fundamental duty to reach out to the last citizen of this country who needs justice. Be it the legislature, the executive or the judiciary, everyone has to reach out to that citizen," the CJI told the gathering.

Actor Dino Morea's Brother's Firm Received ₹18 Lakh From Mithi River Scam Accused: EOW

MUMBAI,SURESH DHERE:

The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Mumbai Police, which is investigating the multi-crore Mithi River desilting scam, found that ₹18 lakh was transferred to UBO Ridez, a company where Santino Morea - brother of Bollywood actor Dino Morea - serves as a director. According to police officials, the funds were transferred by Ketan Kadam, one of the prime accused in the case. "We are investigating the reason for the transfer of funds from Ketan Kadam's account to UBO Ridez," an officer from the EOW told. Ketan Kadam is associated with Vodar India LLP and was arrested earlier this month for his alleged involvement in the scam related to the desilting of the Mithi River. Investigators noted that both Vodar India LLP and UBO Ridez - an electric cart company - operated out of the same address near Famous Studio in Worli, Mumbai. Officials also confirmed that Ketan Kadam's wife, Sheetal Kadam, is a director at UBO



Ridez, along with Santino Morea. Following the registration of a First Information Report (FIR), the EOW conducted a search at the company's shared office premises. Both Dino Morea and Santino Morea were summoned and questioned twice earlier this week by the EOW in connection with the financial transaction and their association with the companies under scrutiny. The investigation is ongoing, and authorities are examining financial records and company documents to determine the nature of the transaction and whether it was linked to the alleged scam.

Bengal Man Beheads Sister-In-Law, Walks On Street With Her Severed Head, Then Surrenders

A man in Bengal's South 24 Parganas district killed his sister-in-law by beheading her, then walked around in the streets carrying the severed head and the weapon before walking into the Basanti Police Station to surrender to the police. The police took the accused, identified as Bimal Mondal, into custody and are currently interrogating him to ascertain the cause behind the crime. The officials suspect that the woman, Sati Mondal, who was married to the elder brother of the accused, was killed over a family dispute. "We suspect a family feud may have led to the chilling murder. He showed



no remorse when he surrendered before us. He was carrying both the severed head and the murder weapon. His behaviour suggests he is not in a normal state of mind," a district police official was quoted as saying by IANS. According to an eyewitness cited by IANS, the accused seemed so angry that one dared to stop him. He was also cursing the victim as he marched with the severed head on the

streets. "He screamed that he had paid back for the injustice done to him for so many years. His rage was so intense that no one dared to stop him while he was roaming around with the weapon and the severed head, though some passers-by captured the video on their mobile phones," said an eyewitness. The incident has left locals in shock. Another person residing in the area revealed that there had been frequent quarrels between the victim and the accused in the last few days. The person also added that the accused had threatened the victim. "However, none of us imagined the family dispute would end in such a horrific act," a neighbour said.

Decomposed Woman's Body Found In Suitcase In UP: 'Maggots On Corpse, Injury Marks On Face'

A woman's body, believed to be in her late 20s, was discovered stuffed into a suitcase near a forest area along the Delhi-Lucknow NH-9 in Pilakhua, Hapur, on Friday morning. The woman has not been identified yet. Additional SP Vineet Bhatnagar stated that the woman likely died several days ago, citing the decomposed state of the body and maggot infestation. "There are injury marks on the face, and a grey scarf was wrapped around her neck. It appears that she was strangled. The exact cause of death will be known after the postmortem report arrives," he said. According to Bhatnagar, the woman was wearing a light pink salwar and a yellow floral kurta. Black threads were tied around her waist, wrist and ankle. A pair



of pink-coloured slippers was also found in the suitcase. Forensic teams have collected samples, and we have shared details with police from adjoining districts and on social media for identification. Bhatnagar mentioned that the body was discovered nearly a kilometre off the highway in an area lacking CCTV cameras and with minimal foot traffic. He assured that police teams have been formed to investigate and vowed to crack the case soon. Further investigation into the matter is underway.

Covid-19 Scare: Centre On Alert, Maharashtra Reports 84 New Cases | Top Updates

MUMBAI, NUZHAT AZAMI:

Covid-19 cases in India are on the rise, with the Centre continuously monitoring and stepping up preparations to handle any situation. The sudden spike in cases across the country has raised concerns. Union Minister of State for Health and AYUSH (Independent Charge), Prataprao Jadhav, on Friday offered reassurance regarding preparations and said, "Both our Central Health Department and the AYUSH Ministry are fully alert and closely monitoring the situation across all states. We have spoken with the respective Health and AYUSH Secretaries, as well as other concerned ministers."

Here's the latest Covid-19 updates: - Maharashtra reported 84 new Covid-19 cases on Friday, bringing the total number of cases reported this year to 681, according to the state public health department. There are currently 467 active cases in the state. - Rajasthan's Health Minister, Gajendra Singh said on Friday that the state reported 54 cases and one death. He clarified that the death was linked to comorbidities, particularly tuberculosis, and that the current circulating variant resembles the common flu. - In Karnataka, a 63-year-old man who tested positive for Covid-19



died at a private hospital in Mysuru, bringing the total number of deaths in the state to three. - According to a health department statement, the patient died due to septic shock with MODS (Multiple Organ Dysfunction Syndrome), AKI (Acute Kidney Injury) with oliguria, Covid pneumonia with ARDS (Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome) and hyponatraemia. - Mizoram also reported its first two cases of the year. The government issued an advisory urging people not to panic. - Meanwhile, Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said on Thursday that a small number of Covid cases have been reported in the state, but there is no cause for concern. Testing and treatment facilities, including medicines, oxygen, and ICU beds, have been ensured. - On 26 May, the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) stated that while Covid-19 cases are resurfacing in parts of the country, the circulating variants are currently exhibiting mild symptoms similar to the Omicron strain.

Thane Engineer Held For Spying Provided Data On Warship, Submarines To Pakistan

Amid India's crackdown on terrorism, the Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) arrested a Thane-based engineer for providing sensitive information about warships and submarines to a Pakistani intelligence operative. The accused shared information using sketches, diagrams, and audio notes in exchange for money. Identified as 27-year-old mechanical engineer Ravindra Verma, the resident of Kalwa was arrested on Wednesday. The police investigation revealed that Verma knowingly and repeatedly provided sensitive information. "In exchange for the information, he received money from various bank accounts from India and abroad," an official told. Police also revealed that Verma was lured into passing classified



information after being honey-trapped by a Pakistani agent posing as a woman on Facebook. Verma's employment as a junior engineer with a defence technology firm granted him access to the Naval Dockyard in south Mumbai. To provide the information, he would board naval ships and submarines. It is suspected that Verma shared the names of these vessels with the

Pakistani agent. "During his visits to the Naval Dockyard, he was not allowed to carry a mobile phone inside. Therefore, after finishing his work there, he used to share sensitive information about warships and submarines by making sketches or diagrams. Sometimes, he would also share information through audio notes," the official added. Verma had been in contact with the Pakistani agent since 2024 after receiving Facebook friend requests from accounts named Payal Sharma and Ispreet. Both agents pretended to be Indian citizens working on a project requiring information on warships. "He was fully aware of his actions and the recipient of the sensitive information. He received money in exchange for providing the information," the official stated.

Orders issued for appointment of sanitation workers in Thane Municipal Corporation on hereditary basis

Success in the pursuit of Deputy Chief Minister EknathShinde and MP Naresh Mhaske Happy atmosphere among sanitation workers

Thane, Dinesh Singh :

The administration issued appointment orders for 15 people who will join the municipal service on the inheritance rights of retired, voluntarily retired and deceased sanitation workers from Thane Municipal Corporation today, creating an atmosphere of joy among all sanitation workers. Deputy Chief Minister EknathShinde and MP NareshMhaske had repeatedly followed up with the government to ensure that the inheritance rights of the sanitation workers' heirs are

implemented. This follow-up has been successful and the path for the heirs of the sanitation workers to get inheritance rights has now been cleared and MP NareshMhaske has directed the administration to make the pending inheritance rights appointments immediately. The heirs of the retired, deceased or voluntarily retired sanitation workers of Thane Municipal Corporation are entitled to inheritance rights as per the recommendations of the Lad-Page Committee, under which there is a

provision for their appointment in the cadre of sanitation workers in the Municipal Corporation's establishments. In this regard, the government's decision of February 2024 regarding granting inheritance rights to all sanitation workers was challenged in the Aurangabad Bench of the Hon'ble High Court. In this writ petition, the Hon'ble High Court had lifted the stay order of January 8, 2025 and directed the government to issue appointment orders to the heirs of all sanitation workers



with inheritance rights. In line with this decision, the Ministry of Social Justice and Finance has ordered to issue appointment orders to the heirs of all sanitation workers

by the end of January 2025. The continuous follow-up by Deputy Chief Minister EknathShinde and MP NareshMhaske in this regard paved the way for the government to appoint sanitation workers on the basis of inheritance. In this regard, under the guidance of Commissioner SaurabhRao, the Thane Municipal Corporation administration has launched a special campaign and orders were issued by the administration today (30.05.2025) for the heirs of 15 sanitation workers

who have retired, voluntarily retired or died in the Municipal Corporation. Also, orders will be issued by the administration soon for the appointment of the heirs of the remaining sanitation workers in a phased manner. Due to the appointment of the heirs of the sanitation workers today, there is an atmosphere of joy among all the employees and they have expressed their gratitude to Deputy Chief Minister EknathShinde, MP NareshMhaske, Municipal Commissioner SaurabhRao and the administration.

Illegal Structures Demolished During Drainage Inspection in Dombivli East's Ayre Village

Dombivli, Shrikant Khuperkar :

The Kalyan Dombivli Municipal Corporation (KDMC) has demolished unauthorized structures found encroaching upon a public drainage line in Ayre village, located in G Ward of Dombivli East, during a routine inspection and cleaning drive. On May 29, 2025, Assistant Commissioner HemaMumbarkar from KDMC's G Ward carried out an on-site inspection as part of ongoing pre-monsoon gutter and nala cleaning. During the visit, the civic team discovered



illegal construction in the form of chawl-like structures built over civic drainage infrastructure. The inspection revealed 15 unauthorized foundations (plinths) and 5 fully constructed rooms, all built in violation of civic regulations. These structures were encroaching directly over the drainage and public nala, raising concerns about obstruction of water flow and sanitation risks. In response, the anti-encroachment squad from G Ward promptly carried out demolition of the illegal structures, ensuring the area was cleared and cleanliness was restored. KDMC reiterated its strict policy against encroachments: "No form of unauthorized construction or encroachment will be tolerated. We will continue to take strict action wherever violations are found," the civic body stated.

Kolshewadi Police Crack Two-Wheeler Theft Case, Arrest Youth with Stolen Scooter

Acting on a confidential tip-off, the crime detection team of Kolshewadi Police Station arrested a 22-year-old man involved in a recent two-wheeler theft and recovered a stolen scooter worth 50,000. The accused has also confessed to stealing two more motorcycles from the jurisdiction of Vishnunagar Police Station, Dombivli (West). According to police, an FIR (Crime No. 367/2025) was registered on May 12 under IPC Section 379 for the theft of a red Honda Activa (MH-05-ET-9349). Under the guidance of Senior Police Inspector Ganesh Nhaide, the crime detection team began probing the case and received a tip-off about a suspicious individual in Ambivli, Kalyan. The team detained the suspect - Karan Annasaheb Gaikwad (22), a resident of RS Tekdi, Dhammadip Nagar, Mohane, Tal. Kalyan, Dist. Thane, originally from Karjgaon, Sonai, Tal. Newasa, Dist. Ahilyanagar. Upon interrogation, Gaikwad admitted to stealing the scooter, which was promptly



recovered from his possession. Further questioning revealed that Gaikwad had also committed two other bike thefts within the limits of Vishnunagar Police Station. Investigations are ongoing to trace additional offenses and accomplices, if any. The successful operation was carried out under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner of Police (Zone 3, Kalyan) AtulZhende, Assistant Commissioner of Police (Kalyan Division) KalyanjGhete, and

Senior PI Ganesh Nhaide. The detection team included: Police Sub-Inspector DarshanPatil; Police Constables Rajesh Kapdi (6256), Bhagwat Saundane (3112), MilindBorse (1532), ShantaramSangle (1226), BhagwanSangle (6548), and Police Shipai Dilip Sonawale (2656). The Kolshewadi Police have urged citizens to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities to help curb vehicle thefts in the area.

Punjab Mail Enters 114th Year: A Glorious Journey Through Time

Mumbai, Shrikant Khuperkar :

Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus, Mumbai: On June 1, 2025, one of Indian Railways' most iconic trains — the Punjab Mail — completes 113 years of continuous service and rolls proudly into its 114th year. A living legacy on rails, the Punjab Mail has not just transported passengers but has also carried with it the spirit of a nation in motion for over a century.

From Peshawar to Firozpur: A Historic Voyage

When the Punjab Mail first steamed out of the now-defunct Ballard Pier Mole Station in Mumbai on June 1, 1912, India was a different land. The train, operated by the Great Indian Peninsula Railway (GIPR), originally ran all the way to Peshawar, covering a formidable 2,496 kilometers in around 47 hours. Its route passed through the heart of undivided India — Itarsi, Agra, Delhi, and Lahore — before terminating at Peshawar Cantonment. This was more than a train journey; it was a corridor connecting regions, people, and cultures across colonial India. By 1914, the train began originating from Bombay Victoria Terminus (now Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus) and became a daily service on the busy Bombay-Delhi route. Travel time was gradually cut to 27 hours and 10 minutes by the early 1920s, before additional stops in the 1970s extended it back to 29 hours. Today, the Punjab Mail runs between Mumbai and Firozpur Cantonment, covering 1,928 km in 33 hours and 35 minutes, halting at 52 stations. While the route has changed with the times, the train's legacy remains intact.

Coaches, Comfort, and Change
In its early days, the Punjab Mail had six coaches — three for passengers and three for postal mail, carrying nearly 288 people. The mid-1930s saw the introduction of Third Class coaches, making the train more accessible to the common man. In 1945, the Punjab Mail became one of the few to offer air-conditioned coaches, marking a leap in passenger comfort. The diesel era began in 1968, with the train being hauled by diesel locomotives up to Jhansi, and eventually up to Delhi and Firozpur by the mid-1970s. A unique feature in the late 1970s and early 1980s was the use of dual-current WCAM/1



locomotives, allowing the train to switch from electric to diesel traction after Igatpuri. In a major upgrade, Linke Hofmann Busch (LHB) coaches replaced the old rake on December 1, 2020, enhancing safety and ride quality. The once-beloved restaurant car was phased out in favor of a modern pantry car.

Today, the Punjab Mail enjoys more than 250% occupancy, a testament to its continued relevance and the emotional connection it holds for generations of travelers. Its current coach configuration includes: 1 AC First Class cum AC-2 Tier, 2 AC-2 Tier, 6 AC-3 Tier, 6 Sleeper Class, 4 General Second Class, 1 Generator Van, 1 SLR (Second Luggage and Guard Van)

Each journey is a blend of nostalgia and necessity, with passengers ranging from seasoned railway enthusiasts to families

and workers who depend on its reliability. A Century-Old Symbol of Continuity
The Punjab Mail is more than just a train. It's a moving monument of India's railway heritage. From the colonial era to the modern electric age, it has adapted with grace, retained its charm, and continued to serve — bridging distances, connecting cities, and telling a story that still rolls on steel wheels. As it enters its 114th year, the Punjab Mail stands not just as a train, but as a symbol — of resilience, of legacy, and of the unstoppable rhythm of India.

Edible Oil To Get Cheaper Soon As Govt Cuts Basic Customs Duty To 10%; Details Here

New Delhi, (Agencies):

In a major decision aimed at reducing domestic cooking oil prices and boosting local processing, the Centre has slashed the basic customs duty on crude palm oil, crude soyabean oil, and crude sunflower oil from 20% to 10%. The decision, effective immediately, is expected to ease retail inflation and reinvigorate India's vegetable oil refining industry. A notification issued by the finance ministry on Friday confirmed the revision, stating that the total effective import duty on these three crude oils now stands at 16.5%, including surcharge and cess, down from 27.5%. The basic customs duty on refined oil remains unchanged at 32.5%. Currently, the effective duty on refined oil is 35.75%. The move comes at a critical time, as India — the world's largest importer of edible oils — imported 159.6 lakh tonnes of edible oils valued at Rs 1.32 lakh crore during the 2023-24 oil marketing year (November-October).



India meets over 50% of its edible oil needs through imports, with palm oil sourced from Malaysia and Indonesia, and soyabean oil primarily from Brazil and Argentina. This significant gap between crude and refined oil duties has been a long-standing demand of industry bodies like SEA and the Indian Vegetable Oil Producers' Association (IVPA), who argue that the influx of cheaper refined oils under trade agreements has harmed domestic refiners. "The government's decision to increase the duty differential between crude and refined oils from 8.25%

to 19.25% is a bold and timely move. It will discourage imports of refined palmolein and shift demand back to crude palm oil, thereby revitalising the domestic refining sector," said Sanjeev Asthana, president of the Solvent Extractors' Association of India (SEA). Solvent Extractors Association of India's (SEA) executive director B V Mehta said the basic custom duty on crude palm oil, crude soyabean oil and crude sunflower oil has been reduced to 10 per cent from the earlier 20 per cent. Sudhakar Desai, president of IVPA, said, "We thank the

government for accepting the IVPA recommendation to increase the duty differential between crude and refined edible oils to 19.25%. This is a significantly bold move towards ensuring Make in India and also protecting the sector from the influx of refined oils causing capacity injury to the vegetable oil sector." According to IVPA data, refined palm oil imports surged from 4.58 lakh metric tonnes during June-September 2024 to 8.24 lakh metric tonnes between October 2024 and February 2025 — accounting for nearly 30% of total palm oil imports. Much of this surge was attributed to zero-duty imports under SAFTA, which created trade distortions and undercut domestic processors. The revision in import duties is expected to bring immediate relief to consumers through reduced prices of packaged cooking oils, while simultaneously strengthening domestic refining capacities and ensuring fair returns for Indian oilseed farmers.

From EPFO To Form 16 To Mutual Fund, Credit Card Rules: Know Key Financial Changes From June 1

New Delhi, (Agencies):

Starting June 1, 2025, several financial rule changes will take effect that could impact your finances. From mutual fund regulations to credit card updates, EPFO advancements, and fixed deposit interest rate revisions, here are the key personal finance changes to be aware of.

SEBI's New Rules for Overnight Mutual Funds

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has revised the cut-off timings for overnight mutual fund schemes. Effective June 1, 2025, the new cut-off time will be 3

pm for offline transactions and 7 pm for online transactions. Transactions made after these times will be processed the next business day, potentially affecting the applicable net asset value (NAV). Overnight mutual funds invest in government securities maturing in one day and are favoured for their low-risk profile. This move aims to streamline fund operations, particularly for pledging.

Credit Card Rule Changes
Credit card users, especially those with Kotak Mahindra Bank, HDFC Bank, and Axis Bank cards, should note several changes this month. From 1 June, Kotak Mahindra



Bank will introduce caps on reward points across categories such as fuel, rent, utility bills, and insurance. A 1% transaction fee will apply to

fuel payments exceeding the monthly threshold. Rent and education payments will also incur a 1% charge regardless of the amount. Other charges will apply to wallet loads and online gaming. From 10 June, HDFC Bank will revise its lounge access policy for Tata Neu Infinity and Tata Neu Plus cardholders. Lounge access will be offered via vouchers based on spending, replacing the previous swipe-based system. From 20 June, Axis Bank will begin phased changes to its REWARDS Credit Card, impacting cashback, reward points, lounge access, and eligible spending

categories.

EPFO 3.0 Expected Rollout

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) is expected to launch EPFO 3.0 in June, according to DD News. It is expected to facilitate instant PF withdrawals through ATMs and UPI, balance checks via UPI apps, and faster claim processing. A more efficient grievance redressal system is also anticipated.

Form 16 Deadline For ITR Filing

The deadline for employers to issue Form 16 to salaried employees is June 15. This certificate is crucial for income tax return filing.

Aadhaar Deadline

June 14 is the last day for free Aadhaar detail updates on the myAadhaar portal. Subsequently, updates will cost Rs 25 online and Rs 50 at Aadhaar centres.

LPG Price Revision

Oil companies revise LPG cylinder prices on the first of each month. Following a price cut in May, a new update is expected on June 1.

FD Interest Rate Cuts

Suryoday Small Finance Bank will reduce its fixed deposit rates by up to 60 basis points from June 1 for deposits below Rs 3 crore. The new rates will range from 4% to 8.4%.

KDMC Initiates Long-Pending Road Widening and Drainage Work in Ward '1'; Action Taken Against Encroachments

KALYAN , Shrikant Khuperkar :
The Kalyan Dombivli Municipal Corporation (KDMC) has finally commenced the long-delayed road widening and drainage work in Ward '1', a development awaited by local residents for the past two years. The project, which had been stalled due to encroachments and administrative hurdles, was restarted today under the proactive leadership of Additional Commissioner Mr.Yogesh Godse and Deputy Commissioner Mr.Avdhut Tawde. The work began in Manere village, where initial resistance was faced from a few shop owners and local residents. Their objections led to a brief moment of tension in the area. However, the situation was quickly brought under control with the help of local police personnel who ensured law and order was maintained. Taking swift and firm action, KDMC officials carried out eviction proceedings against 11 unauthorized shopkeepers, who were found to be obstructing the developmental work. Illegal sheds, platforms, and various construction materials that were creating physical barriers were removed on the spot. As part of the operation, the municipal team also located an old underground drainage line in the disputed area. The drainage system was



successfully reconnected to the main stormwater drain network as per the official markings and plans, allowing the work to move forward. Following the eviction drive and clearance of obstacles, road widening and drainage development resumed without delay. To ensure public safety, KDMC has installed reflective radium strips and prominent 'DANGER' signage around the work zone. This prompt and decisive action by the municipal administration has cleared a major bottleneck in the area's development. Local citizens, who had been facing difficulties due to narrow roads and poor drainage, will soon benefit from broader roadways and an upgraded sewage management system. KDMC's initiative has been appreciated by residents who now hope that other pending infrastructure projects in the city will also be taken up on priority.

One person died and two children were injured when the protective wall of KBK International School collapsed in the Balyani area of Kalyan

One child was killed and two others were injured when a wall collapsed on a child playing in a field near a school

Dombivli, Pramod Kumar :
A tragic incident occurred on Friday when a wall of KBK International Private School in the slum area of Balyani in Ambivali near Kalyan collapsed, killing one child and seriously injuring two others. This has brought the issue of unauthorized sitting chawls to the fore. The protective wall of KBK International Private School near SK Nagar in Balyani area under TitwalaKalyan Rural Police Station collapsed around 4 pm on Friday. The school wall is adjacent to the Shree Kupachawl, which is adjacent to the school, and children in the area were playing in this chawl and in a dangerous place. Suddenly, a pan fell on the playing child, killing 11-year-old Anshukumar Singh. While 10-year-old AbhishekSahani and 6-year-old Shoab Sheikh were seriously injured. Both the children are undergoing treatment in the hospital and



doctors at Rukminibai Hospital declared that Anshukumar Singh died in the incident. This incident has spread mourning in the Chawl area near Kebike School in Balyani area. Local Chalkari residents alleged that the protective wall of Kebike School had become dangerous. They had complained to the school administration about this. However, this incident occurred due to the negligence of the school administration while repairing it haphazardly. This incident has brought to the fore the issue of private school building construction and protective wall. With the connivance of

political leaders and administrative officers of A" Ward, the number of illegal Chawls in Titwala, Ambivali, Vadavali, Balyani, Umbarli has increased to a large extent. Due to the large economic turnover, illegal constructions have been carried out without any hindrance, resulting in an increase in the number of incidents.

Editor's Say

Why Modi Won't Let Go of the BJP's Reins

The inexplicable delay in finding a replacement for J.P. Nadda as president of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has set tongues wagging sharply. Nadda was last given an extension till June 2024, and when he was inducted in the Union Cabinet it was understood that the ruling party would soon have a new president. Then, the state polls in Maharashtra and, later, in Haryana were cited as reason for not letting Nadda go. Students of realpolitik are not naïve enough to suggest that Nadda is so indispensable to the BJP's organisational health and vitality. Even the junior-most functionary in the ruling party knows and believes that it is "those two" – a euphemism for Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union home minister Amit Shah – who call the shots in organisational matters, however small and insignificant. Nadda's position, in fact, is far more pitiable than that of Mallikarjun Kharge as the Congress president (vis-à-vis Rahul Gandhi). In the larger Sangh Parivar – from Nagpur to Jhandewalan – there are many detractors of the Modi-Shah duo and the twosome's stranglehold over the BJP is deeply resented. These detractors remain eternally hopeful that at some point or the other, the top RSS leadership would say 'enough is enough' with the overdose of the Modi Cult. These detractors have convinced themselves that even if the "Sangh" is in no position to do anything about Prime Minister Modi's defiance of the Nagpur brass, Mohan Bhagwat and Co. still have the reach and the resolve to impose a president of their choice on the ruling party who would, then, slow down, if not choke, the Modi-Shah sway over the organisation.

Middle hierarchy of the RSS is no longer in thrall of 'idealism' and 'nobility'

The realists, however, believe that the prime minister-home minister duo already have a measure of the sanghsarchalak and his intimate advisers. Nagpur lost out to New Delhi long ago as the swayamsevak got a taste of governmental power and patronage; by all accounts, the middle hierarchy of the RSS is no longer in thrall of the "idealism" and "nobility" that was once famously infused by Golwalkar. The vast majority in the Sanghparivar is no longer unfamiliar with the corrupting allure of power. With contamination comes compromise and a weakening of the "will" that the Sangh believes distinguishes itself from other outfits in the land. Yet, there is a small minority in the parivar that believes earnestly that in this centenary year, the Nagpur bosses would want to recoup their reputation for high moral idealism. As it is, there is a great deal of discomfort and disillusionment among RSS leaders at the almost institutionalised corruption in the ranks of BJP-led governments across the country. The hope is that the Bhagwat team would want to be able to hoist a president of its preference on the BJP. The delay in finding a replacement for Nadda is understood as an outcome of the unresolved tussle between Nagpur and New Delhi over a mutually agreeable name. However, there is also a realisation that "Nagpur" no longer wields, if it ever did, a veto in the matter. At best, it is entitled to "consultation" but not "consent." Even in the best of times, a prime minister is obliged to ensure that his/her party does not become a site for resistance and trouble. Indira Gandhi had cast this principle in stone in 1969. Whenever a prime minister could not uphold this principle, their authority lost lustre. Manmohan Singh had to use all his skills of patience and persuasion to ensure that "10 Janpath" was not seen as a source of hostility, despite all the talk of Sonia Gandhi exercising "extra-constitutional authority." And, to be sure, in 2014 Narendra Modi, as a prime ministerial candidate, promised to restore the PMO's pre-eminence in the constitutional scheme of things. As prime minister, this is the only promise he can be said to have fulfilled comprehensively. So, it would really matter very little whether Dharmendra Pradhan or Manohar Lal Khattar or Devendra Fadnis gets the nod to be the replacement for J.P. Nadda. The party-government equation will not change in any radical manner – certainly not to the prime minister's disadvantage. Amit Shah would continue to be the de facto president. An organisation that once used to pat itself on the back for its 'integrity' and the importance of 'sanghathan' has now fallen prey to the familiar virus of the Leader's presumed charisma de-institutionalising the political party. Even the BJP's traditional strength – the thousands, if not millions, of Sangh foot-soldiers making their presence felt on election day – is no longer deemed as a valued asset.

Modi elaborately preening himself as the Warrior-Hero

It is Modi's popularity and stature – and his administrative ability to ensure the playing field remains un-level – that is seen as sufficient to make voters put their seal on the BJP's candidates. Meanwhile, the prime minister is elaborately preening himself as the Warrior-Hero of the "Four Day War", officially named as "Operation Sindoor." Rather shrewdly, he has repeatedly affirmed that the Operation Sindoor has only been paused, not abandoned. We remain positioned on the battle-field, under his command and inspiration. As the field commander he would demand complete and total autonomy and loyalty to carry on the war. A conflict that is good for arresting the BJP's decline in public esteem and that helps allows the war-drummers to play the jingoistic numbers. For now, he is on top of his game in working up the mood against Pakistan and stoking nationalistic fervour. This mobilisation is as much aimed at the Opposition parties as at those in Nagpur who may still discover their spine. The contest between the Modi establishment and the RSS is far from over; the RSS has a hundred years of institutional memory and learning, while Narendra Modi has in his toolkit all the agencies of the Union government. Modi is probably not unaware that in the near future someone in Nagpur may want to remind him of his own 'no-one-above-75-should-aspirer-for-public-office' dictum. He will not yield to the wisdom or preference of the Sanghparivar on this ground. That is a larger battle and it will be become a critical clash if the RSS is able to impose its own name as NJP president. Watch out.

By Calling For the Boycott of Foreign Goods, Modi Contradicts Himself

The video showing Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with the cream of India's foreign policy establishment, playing with the children of American tycoon Elon Musk, was an exceptional moment in the history of Indian Prime Ministers' foreign tours. Modi described his experience as "delightful." Even Musk, the richest person in the world, would have been delighted as his electric car company Tesla and internet service Starlink had received approval for business in India. Nobody can grudge such moments of happiness the rich and the powerful are so bountifully blessed with. Those who dream of stealing a moment of delight by driving out of the Tesla showroom in a shining car, will, however, have to grapple with a gnawing sense of guilt now. That's because Modi has asked Indians not to buy foreign goods. Nothing, absolutely nothing foreign should be bought except 1 or 2% essential commodities not manufactured by India. We do make cars and have companies providing internet services. So, curtains for Musk. Difficult to guess at this stage whether Modi's diktat for boycott of foreign goods left Musk's ears burning. Or, the wily businessman understands the futility of such political rhetoric better than gullible Indians who start burning cheap Chinese goods on the streets across the country.

As Indian delegations negotiate with US on tariff, Modi's call to boycott foreign goods

The Indian delegations visiting the United States in the last few weeks are obviously not there to play with Musk's children. They are seriously negotiating a workable tariff deal with the American establishment after President Donald Trump triggered a global turmoil by his disruptive intervention. While Indian officials are shaken and worried about the outcome, Trump chose to announce that the Modi Government had agreed to lower tariffs on American goods. What's the purpose of this exercise when American goods are to be boycotted? Why hasn't Modi asked Indian officials to withdraw from negotiations and focus on bolstering domestic manufacturing? Or Modi himself knows his vain posturing is aimed more at diverting attention from the real national crises than the actual boycott of foreign goods? This wasn't a theoretical "vocal for local" call that Modi gave years ago. He was unambiguous and forceful, saying, "The Operation Sindoor started with military power but will continue with people's power. Every individual should shoulder responsibility for the goal of 'Viksit

Bharat'. We should take a resolve – to take Indian economy from the fourth position to the third, we will not use any foreign product henceforth. We should compel businessmen in every village to take a pledge for not selling foreign goods. No matter how much profit accrues to the traders, they must not sell foreign items. But look at the misfortune, even the Ganesh idol comes from abroad. Ganesh with small eyes. Ganesh's eyes don't even open. Even Holi colours are coming from outside. You too go to your homes and make a list of foreign items you use. For the success of Operation Sindoor, make a list of foreign items and stop using them. We don't even realise how foreign items have invaded our homes. Even the tooth pin is foreign. We don't even know. If the country has to be saved, if the country has to be rebuilt, we should understand Operation Sindoor is not merely a military operation. We have to win this battle with the strength of 140 crore people. Be vocal for local. I am not saying throw out what you have. But take a pledge not to buy again." The Prime Minister is hinting at China without naming it (though he never misses an opportunity to call out Pakistan), with his reference to Ganesh with small eyes. He says people don't even know how these items have flooded their homes. Right. But the Prime Minister should know how these cheap, non-essential Chinese goods have flooded the Indian markets. Can a single item cross the border without Modi's permission? It is because of Modi's policies that the trade deficit with China multiplied in the last decade; from 37.8 billion dollars in 2014 to around 100 billion dollars in 2025. It's the Government's doing, not caused by citizens' lust for Chinese goods. Was Modi not aware of this trend when he was describing Xi Jinping as his "plus one" friend and singing about the vitality of Indo-China relationship? Has Modi instructed the team of the Commerce Ministry negotiating tariff deals with America to bluntly tell them India is going to boycott foreign goods? What's the point of a deal when we are not going to purchase American stuff? Does Modi understand the economic implications when the world knows boycott of foreign goods is the policy of the Indian State? Has he decided to walk out of the World Trade Organization (WTO) and other international commitments?

Modi taking avoidable risks of vitiating the diplomatic relations

Such critical decisions with widespread consequences cannot be handled like turn-key projects. Nobody has any quarrel with the idea of self-reliance but the country has to be gradually prepared for cutting off the



global link. Today's middle class is wholly dependent on foreign goods – from cars to mobile phones, from fridge to laptops, from medicines to toys. Can we tell Americans Coca Cola will not be consumed in India from today? Can our pharmaceutical industry survive without Chinese imports? It's a shame that we depend on China even for fertilizers. But what has the Government done to rectify this abnormal situation over the last decade? Make-in-India is a flop and the insanity of demonetisation destroyed middle and small enterprises. Barely days before Modi's boycott call, Uttar Pradesh boasted of huge investment proposals by Chinese companies in footwear sector. Yes, footwear, not electronics. Before taking concrete measures to ensure self-reliance, how can the Prime Minister come up with fanciful ideas of boycott? The Prime Minister runs the risk of inviting criticism of trying to hijack the political discourse by such wild interventions. By linking Operation Sindoor to the task of boycott of foreign goods, he is taking avoidable risks of vitiating the diplomatic relations. Operation Sindoor was Pakistan-centric but he is now saying the project will come to fruition only by boycotting all foreign goods. Has he intentionally equated other countries with antagonistic Pakistan in his desperation for diversionary tricks from the real crises India is faced with? Economists believe the best way to rev up growth is to boost the purchasing power of the masses and make money flow in the markets. Both domestic savings and investments have declined under Modi and unemployment has peaked menacingly. Foreign Direct Investments also slowed down while the debt situation worsened alarmingly. Instead of addressing the underlying factors for sluggish growth, Modi chose to raise the bogey of foreign goods, a lowly trick that will only aggravate the crisis. But taking Modi seriously on such political rhetoric is fraught with risks. He has been inconsistent with his articulation, demonstrating a muddled-up thinking and poor understanding of economic realities. His strategies are often aimed more at consolidating his own shaky position than harbingering any real change. The joint statement issued during his recent visit to the United States barely a few months ago did not reflect any plan to boycott foreign goods. It said: "Today, President Trump and

Prime Minister Modi launched a new initiative – the US-India COMPACT (Catalyzing Opportunities for Military Partnership, Accelerated Commerce & Technology) for the 21st Century – to drive transformative change across key pillars of cooperation. "Apart from a 10-year defence cooperation framework, the joint statement talked of expansion of trade and investment. It was decided to more than double total bilateral trade to 500 billion dollars by 2030. Will boycott of foreign goods act as a catalyst to this objective? The statement repeatedly stresses agro-trade, energy security partnership and strengthening the supply chains.

When the PM had listed trade as an area for cooperation with other countries

In his address to the US Congress in 2023, Modi said, "We live by the motto of Vasudhaiv Kutumbkam or The World is One Family. Our engagement with the world is for everyone's benefit. The 'One Sun, One World, One Grid' seeks to join us all in connecting the world with clean energy. 'One Earth, One Health' is a vision for global action to bring quality healthcare to everyone. The same spirit is also seen in the theme when we Chair the G20 – 'One Earth, One Family, One Future'."

Do we find any trace of animus against foreign goods in these words?

He added, "When Indians fly more, a single order for aircrafts creates more than a million jobs in forty four states in America. When an American phone maker invests in India, it creates an entire ecosystem of jobs and opportunities, in both countries. When India and the US work together on semiconductors and critical minerals, it helps the world in making supply chains more diverse, resilient and reliable." Addressing the European Commission, Modi said, "I would like to identify some priority areas of cooperation. The first is trade and investment. It is crucial to conclude a mutually beneficial FTA and Investment Protection Agreement as soon as possible. The second is strengthening the Supply Chain Resilience. Our capabilities can complement each other in sectors such as electronics, semiconductors, telecom, engineering, defence, and pharma. Modi went on to identify many more areas of cooperation. In January 2023, addressing the Global South Summit, he said, "We all appreciate the principle of globalisation. India's philosophy has always seen the world as one family." The music is entirely different, unsuitable for the new theme of boycott of foreign goods. Modi will forget this rhetoric when he flies in luxurious foreign-made aircraft, travels in foreign-made safe cars and uses his imported goggles and phones.

The Pandavas of Delhi

In Delhi, we had organized a national convention of journalists under the banner of 'Voice of Media.' Since journalists from across the country were to attend, I had reached Delhi early for preparations. Once I was confident that everything was set, I breathed a sigh of relief. My friend and fellow member of 'Voice of Media,' Chetan Bandewar, was with me. When Bandewar got into the mood, he said, "Let's go shopping." I nodded in agreement.

Delhi's markets are a world of their own—Sarajini Nagar, Lajpat Nagar, Chandni Chowk—each place has a unique flavor, a distinct charm. Going shopping with Chetan Bandewar is never just about buying things; it's always an adventurous journey.

"Let's go to Sarajini Nagar," Chetan said. I widened my eyes.

"That's where people throw bags over their shoulders and rush to buy clothes!"

"Exactly! Journalists don't just chase stories; they collect experiences too!" His words made me laugh, and off we went.

While Chetan was scouting for big brands, my eyes were drawn to the roadside shops. I sat down at a spot, while Bandewar immersed himself in browsing branded clothes. There, on the edge of the pavement, I witnessed a different scene.

Beside me, a blind boy was polishing shoes, listening attentively to another boy reading. The story being read aloud was 'Mahajan ki Shaadi' by Premchand, and the boy's voice carried a rhythm so captivating that I just sat quietly, listening.



People came and went, getting their shoes polished and paying silently. Four boys were polishing shoes in a row, while one kept reading aloud. After some time, as the crowd thinned, they seemed to find a little break in their work.

I moved forward and said, "Brother, I'd like my shoes polished too." The boy silently extended his hand, saying, "Give them here." He polished them so beautifully and sincerely that it felt like I wouldn't need another polish for a whole year.

While he polished my shoes, I struck up a conversation with the five boys. The blind boy and the other four were real brothers. As I spoke to them, I realized what dire circumstances they had overcome. If one has the will, anything is possible. These were Delhi's true Pandavas.

Dipesh, Raju, Vikas, Ajay, and Shriram—these five brothers lost their parents in an accident three years ago. Within four months, their uncle kicked them out of the house. Left with nowhere to go, they came to Delhi. They spent four months living on the streets, then found shelter in an ashram. Their days were spent polishing shoes, and their nights were devoted to studying. That's still their routine.

Dipesh is in 12th grade. Raju is in 11th. Vikas is in 9th. Ajay is in 7th. Little Shriram is in 5th. Shriram lost his eyesight in the same accident that took their parents. I was speechless after learning about his academic performance and love for studies. These five brothers had never scored less than 90%.

The care and dedication with which they polished my shoes—it felt like my

shoes wouldn't need attention for another year.

While I was talking, Shriram began to cry remembering their parents. Dipesh comforted him, playing the role of a father. Just then, two girls arrived. Introducing them, Dipesh said, "They are our sisters—Vanita and Sita. Both are orphans. They wanted to study, so we helped them. Today, both are in school."

Sita added, "Dipesh and his brothers have helped many children pursue their education." Listening to her, I was overwhelmed. What generosity these brothers had! Each of their stories was more incredible than the last. Their hard work, their devotion to education, their commitment to helping others, their hunger to read and learn something new every day—it was all extraordinary.

I reached into my pocket and gave them all the money I had. As always, the arrangements for our return were being handled by Chetan Bandewar.

Chetan returned, holding two bags. "Let's go," he said, and we began to leave. I told him about the five brothers on the way, and even he was deeply moved. My feet were reluctant to move away from those Pandavas, and Chetan was pulling me forward.

Though I physically left that place, my mind remained with the five brothers and their incredible work. Those who have nothing often do everything. And those with absolutely nothing dare to dream of touching the sky. Isn't that remarkable?

Around you too, you'll find many such dreamers reaching for the sky... Please, do help them. Will you?

Jay Shah Reaches Munich Before Champions League Final, Meets UEFA President

ICC chairman and former BCCI secretary Jay Shah on Friday met UEFA president Aleksander Čeferin in Munich, two days ahead of the Champions League final between Inter Milan and Paris Saint-Germain, which will be played at the Allianz Arena on Sunday, June 1. Shah mentioned that the meeting with Čeferin ahead of the big final was to ensure that cricket's global outreach continued. While cricket boasts a vast fan base, with millions following games, tournaments and careers of their favourite players, several parts of Europe still haven't immersed themselves in the sport.

"Honoured to represent cricket in Munich ahead of the @championsleague Final and have discussions with UEFA President



Aleksander Čeferin," Shah tweeted on Saturday morning. ICC has several global outreach initiatives which it uses to promote cricket. Its flagship community outreach program, named 'Cricket for Good', aims to use the sport's power to impact children and families worldwide, addressing problems like nutrition deficiency, education and child protection. Champions League final PSG are the favourites to win their first UEFA

Champions League title when the French club take on Inter Milan in Saturday's final. The final will be a special occasion for Achraf Hakimi, Paris Saint-Germain's Moroccan right-back, who won the Serie A title with Inter four years back. Hakimi is the best full-back in the world when it comes to attacking and he has scored or set up 22 goals this season. Federico Dimarco has a key role to play in Inter's 3-5-2 formation, in which his attacking contribution is crucial. However, he had a torrid time against Lamine Yamal in the semi-finals. Denzel Dumfries does the same job on the right as Dimarco on the left for Inter, with the Dutchman a marauding wing-back who offers so much to his team going forward, he has scored 11 goals this season.

Karim Benzema Scores Twice As Al-Ittihad Beat Al-Qadsiah To Win Saudi Cup

Al-Ittihad's Karim Benzema scored twice, leading his team to a 3-1 victory over Al-Qadsiah in the Saudi Cup final on Friday, completing a domestic double. Laurent Blanc's side controlled the game to secure the cup for the 10th time, while Al-Qadsiah ended the match with 10 men after Ezequiel Fernandez was sent off in the 81st minute. Moussa Diaby nearly gave Al-Ittihad the lead but missed a chance in the 21st minute. Al-Qadsiah's former Spanish defender Nacho avoided conceding a penalty when the ball touched his hand, as the referee did not award a spot kick despite a VAR check in the 32nd minute. Benzema opened the scoring for the Saudi Pro League champions by using his chest to convert Steven Bergwijn's precise cross 11 minutes before halftime. Houssein Aouar made it 2-0 in the 43rd minute, following up after Koen



Casteels saved a header from Benzema. Al-Qadsiah's Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang reduced the deficit from the penalty spot in first-half stoppage time. After the break, Benzema, the SPL Player of the Season, hit the bar, but Al-Ittihad played cautiously to maintain their lead. Al-Ittihad keeper Predrag Rajkovic saved Aubameyang's shot in the

80th minute, and Al-Qadsiah suffered a major setback when Ezequiel Fernandez received a second yellow card, forcing them to play with 10 men in the final minutes. Then, 2022 Ballon d'Or winner Benzema scored his side's third goal, firing in Diaby's low cross in stoppage time, before Aubameyang's shot hit the woodwork.

Singapore Open: Chirag-Satwik Make Winning Return, Lakshya Sen Withdraws Midgame

Star Indian badminton doubles duo of Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy made a winning return at the Singapore Open Super 750 badminton event on Wednesday as the nation's top-rated doubles pairing posted a resounding victory over Malaysia's Choong Hon Jian and Muhammad Haikal. Shetty and Rankireddy required just 40 minutes to dispatch the Hon

Jian and Haikal 21-16, 21-13 in the round of 32 encounter, which also turned out to be the Indian pairing's first appearance after their withdrawal from the All England Championships. However, Indian singles star Lakshya Sen was forced to pull out midway through his fixture against Lin Chun-Yi of Chinese Taipei. Sen opened the encounter with a 21-15 opening game win before Chun-Yi pulled back in the second game to

level proceedings with a 21-17 win. Sen, who was trailing 5-13 in the decider, has to retire from the contest citing lower back issues. "Lakshya had to retire from his Singapore Open match due to lower back pain and spasm, which he had been experiencing since last Saturday during practice in Singapore," Lakshya's father and coach DK Sen said. "Despite trying his best, he wasn't fully fit. The pain worsened during



the match, and to prevent further injury, he pulled out of the third set. Our team will now focus on his recovery for upcoming tournaments. "Recovery is our top priority now. We're working hard to get Lakshya fit and ready for Indonesia. "Rohan Kapoor and Ruthvika Shivani Gadde moved into the pre-quarters, with their 21-16, 21-19 win over the American pair of Chen Zhi Yi and Francesca

Corbett in 35 minutes in mixed doubles. Aakarshi Kashyap, Unnati Hooda and Anupama Upadhyaya all went down in the women's singles event as they lost in contrasting fashion to their opponents on the day. Kashyap lost 21-17, 13-21, 7-21 to Han Yue in a 58-minute contest, while Hooda also relinquished an early advantage as she went down 21-13, 9-21, 15-21 in a 56-minute to Wang Zhi Yi.

Russia Claims Quad Nations Forcing India Into Military Alliance: 'Trying To Involve...'

Moscow , (Agencies) :

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov has claimed that India's joined the QUAD alliance, comprising the United States, Japan, and Australia, ostensibly for trade; however, the member nations were reportedly already coordinating naval and other military exercises. "We spoke to our Indian friends back then and they told us that their interest in joining the Quad is exclusively of trade or economic nature and cooperation in other peaceful areas," he said at a security conference in Eurasia in the city of Perm, as quoted by media reports. He highlighted that Quad member countries were actively pushing for naval and military exercises outside the official Quad framework. Lavrov further warned that these actions were part of a broader strategy to militarise the alliance, adding, "they try to involve all the four countries into these exercises. And I'm sure that our Indian friends, they can see this provocation clearly." He also called for



reviving the Russia-India-China (RIC) trilateral format. He said the "time has come" to restart RIC meetings, adding that, in his view, India and China have reached an understanding on easing border tensions. "I would like to confirm our genuine interest in the earliest resumption of the work within the format of the troika — Russia, India, China — which was established many years ago on the initiative of (ex-Russian prime minister)

Yevgeny Primakov, and which has organised meetings more than 20 times at the ministerial level since then, not only at the level of foreign policy chiefs, but also the heads of other economic, trade and financial agencies of the three countries," Lavrov was quoted as saying by TASS. The RIC platform, originally launched in the late 1990s, has remained dormant since the deadly Galwan clashes between Indian and Chinese troops in June 2020. While

Russia had hinted at trilateral engagement during the BRICS Summit in Kazan in 2024, Lavrov's latest pitch marks the most explicit call to formally revive the RIC mechanism since Galwan. Lavrov's renewed pitch signals much more than just a procedural revival — it reflects Moscow's shifting diplomatic calculus amid changing global alignments. Earlier, Lavrov had alleged that the West is attempting to create a rift between India and China to foster antagonism between the neighbouring countries. While speaking at a meeting of a diplomatic club, he had asserted that Western strategies in the Asia-Pacific region are designed to fuel tensions between the two Asian nations. "Take note of the current developments in the Asia-Pacific region, which the West has started calling the Indo-Pacific region to give its policy a clear anti-China orientation — expecting thereby to additionally clash our great friends and neighbours India and China," Lavrov had said.

Message To Putin? Zelenskyy's Pick Of 'To Kill A Tyrant' At Kyiv Book Fair Sparks Buzz

Kyiv , (Agencies) :

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and his wife, Olena, on Friday caught attention during a visit to a literary fair in Kyiv — not just for their presence, but for the book they took home. Among several titles the couple picked up at the 13th annual Book Arsenal fair was "To Kill a Tyrant" by Italian academic Aldo Andrea Cassi. The book's full title, "To Kill a Tyrant: A History of Tyrannicide from Caesar to Gaddafi," explores historical examples of the killing of dictators and raises the question: "Is it right or wrong to kill a tyrant? And if it is, who decides?" Zelenskyy chose the Ukrainian-language version of the book. While he did not say whether the purchase was meant to send a message, the symbolism has not gone unnoticed. He has repeatedly referred to Russian President Vladimir Putin as a dictator throughout the ongoing war, now in its third year. The Ukrainian President shared photos and a short video from the fair on his official social media accounts, including X. One photo showed Olena Zelenska browsing



through a copy of "To Kill a Tyrant," with Zelenskyy standing beside her. In his post, Zelenskyy praised the fair and Ukraine's cultural resilience. "Today, we visited the Book Arsenal together — now in its 13th year. And this speaks volumes about the resilience of Ukrainians and the strength of our culture," he wrote. "Despite the full-scale war, the publishing industry continues to grow, the world hears our country, and our people are building connections with the world — and this is truly inspiring," he added. He went on to list other titles they added to their home library, including "From Father to Son" by Franco Nembrini,

"The Lyrics Of Mariupol Bomb Shelters" by Oksana Stomina, and "The Twilight of an Empire: The Russo-Ukrainian War in the Eyes of a Historian" by Serhiy Plokhyy. Zelenskyy thanked Ukrainian writers, publishers, and translators for their role in keeping the country's culture alive and relevant during wartime. "We are grateful to everyone who develops publishing in Ukraine — the authors, the publishers, and the translators who open the world to Ukrainians and introduce Ukraine to the world through our books. We thank everyone who supports Ukrainian culture. It is important."

Israel Issues Ultimatum To Hamas On Hostage Deal As Trump Says Gaza Ceasefire 'Very Close'

Israel on Friday said Hamas must accept a hostage deal in Gaza or "be annihilated", as US President Donald Trump announced that a ceasefire agreement was "very close". It came amid dire conditions on the ground, with the United Nations warning that Gaza's entire population was at risk of famine. Defence Minister Israel Katz said Hamas must agree to a ceasefire proposal presented by US envoy Steve Witkoff or be destroyed, after the Palestinian militant group said the deal failed to satisfy its demands. "The Hamas murderers will now be forced to choose: accept the terms of the 'Witkoff Deal' for the release of the hostages — or be annihilated." Israel has repeatedly said that the destruction of Hamas was a key aim of the war. Negotiations to end nearly 20 months of war in Gaza have so far failed to achieve a breakthrough, with Israel resuming operations in March following a short-lived truce. In the United States,

Trump told reporters "they're very close to an agreement on Gaza", adding: "We'll let you know about it during the day or maybe tomorrow." Food shortages in Gaza persist, with aid only trickling in after the partial lifting by Israel of a more than two-month blockade. Jens Laerke, a spokesman for the UN humanitarian agency, called Gaza "the hungriest place on Earth". "It's the only defined area — a country or defined territory within a country — where you have the entire population at risk of famine," he said. Later, the UN condemned the "looting of large quantities of medical equipment" and other supplies "intended for malnourished children" from one of its Gaza warehouses by armed individuals. Aid groups have warned that desperation for food and medicine among Gazans was causing security to deteriorate.

'Crusade' against Israel

Israel has doubled down on its settlement expansion in the occupied



West Bank, while defying calls from French President Emmanuel Macron and other world leaders for a two-state solution. This week Israel announced the creation of 22 new settlements in the Palestinian territory, which Israel has occupied since 1967. London said the move was a "deliberate obstacle" to Palestinian statehood while Egypt called it "a provocative and blatant new violation of international law and

Palestinian rights". The 57-member Organisation of Islamic Cooperation, which includes Egypt, also condemned Israel's decision. On Friday, Katz vowed to build a "Jewish Israeli state" in the West Bank. Israeli settlements in the Palestinian territory are considered illegal under international law and seen as a major obstacle to a lasting peace in the decades-long Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Katz framed the move as a

direct rebuke to Macron and others pushing for recognition of a Palestinian state. Macron on Friday said that recognition of a Palestinian state, with some conditions, was "not only a moral duty, but a political necessity". Israel's foreign ministry accused the French president of undertaking a "crusade against the Jewish state". Separately, a diplomatic source told AFP that Saudi Foreign Minister Faisal bin Farhan would make the first visit of its kind to the West Bank on Sunday.

'Children in pieces'

The White House announced on Thursday that Israel had "signed off" on a new ceasefire proposal submitted to Hamas. The Palestinian group said the deal failed to satisfy its demands, but stopped short of rejecting it outright, saying it was "holding consultations" on the proposal. Gaza's civil defence agency told AFP that at least 45 people had been killed in Israeli attacks on Friday, including seven in a strike

targeting a family home in Jabalia in the northern Gaza Strip. Palestinians sobbed over the bodies of their loved ones at Gaza City's Al-Shifa Hospital following the strike, AFP TV footage showed. "These were civilians and were sleeping at their homes," said neighbour Mahmud al-Ghaf, describing "children in pieces". The Israeli military did not immediately respond to a request for comment, but said separately that the air force had hit "dozens of targets" across Gaza over the past day. The health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza said on Friday that at least 4,058 people had been killed since Israel resumed operations on March 18, taking the war's overall toll to 54,321, mostly civilians. Hamas's 2023 attack on Israel resulted in the deaths of 1,218 people, also mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on official figures. Of the 251 hostages seized during Hamas's attack, 57 remain in Gaza, including 34 the Israeli military says are dead.

Hansal Mehta Reviews Seth Rogen's 'The Studio': 'We Curse The System But We're Part Of It'

Hansal Mehta has reviewed Seth Rogen's 'The Studio'. The show offers a behind-the-scenes look at the absurdities of Hollywood through a comedic lens. Rogen stars as Matt Remick, the newly appointed head of Continental Studios, a position he secures despite lacking the creative vision typically associated with such a role. His character is portrayed as someone who, while passionate about filmmaking, often finds himself out of his depth in the high-pressure environment of studio management. Hansal Mehta lauded the show and called it "necessary" in today's time. Hansal Mehta wrote on X, "I saw the trailers and I was kicked. This looked like the show - sharp, satirical, self-aware. I read the early reviews, and the buzz was real. So I dove in, eager, almost giddy with anticipation. Then came Episode 1. And I was... overwhelmed.

Slapstick? Superficial? Was this really it? I wondered - had the PR outpaced the product? Or was I just not getting it? But then... the magic unfolded. Gradually. Subtly. Smartly." The director explained, "What seemed like parody started revealing layers. The humour stayed broad, but the irony deepened. The pathos began to creep in. By the second and third episodes, I was in - fully. This wasn't just a spoof of an industry we all love to hate. This was an ode. A love letter. added, "Seth Rogen has pulled off something rare - a modern slapstick sitcom laced with surprising insight and aching empathy. Characters that felt like cartoons at first slowly became people. I was reflecting on our world - this mad, broken, beautiful business of creativity and commerce. The camera doesn't just observe; it crashes into rooms, lingers on silent defeat, and dances with delusion. What they've pulled off is a spectacle - but not the kind the industry usually sells. This is a spectacle that feels real. Real in its pain, its absurdity, its backstage drama. And in doing so, The Studio becomes a mirror to a world that thrives on illusion - and yet somehow delivers truth," Hansal Mehta concluded. The Studio is available for streaming on Apple TV+. The series features a stellar ensemble cast, including Catherine O'Hara, Kathryn Hahn, Ike Barinholtz, and Chase Sui Wonders.
