Peaceful rallies held across 25 cities calling attention to violence against Hindus in Bangladesh

WASHINGTON : (AGENCY)

Despite extreme winter weather conditions--including freezing temperatures, snow, and icy roads--peaceful awareness rallies were successfully held today across 25 cities throughout the United States, marking a coordinated nationwide effort to draw attention to the ongoing violence and persecution faced by Hindu and other minority communities in Bangladesh. The rallies were part of a non-partisan, humanitarian awareness initiative, bringing together community members, faith leaders, and concerned citizens to stand in solidarity with innocent civilians who have lost their lives due to targeted attacks based on religious identity. Gatherings took place at public civic spaces such as city halls and civic centers, where participants observed moments of silence, offered prayers, and peacefully called for protection of vulnerable minorities. Despite hazardous weather conditions across many regions, participation



remained strong--underscoring the resolve of those who believe that concern for human life and dignity transcends weather and geography. From the Midwest to the East and West Coasts, individuals assembled peacefully to raise awareness about reported incidents of lynching, arson, sexual violence, and targeted killings. "These rallies were peaceful, dignified, and humanitarian in purpose," said Daipayan Deb, a key coordinator of the initiative. "People showed up despite

difficult conditions because silence in the face of violence is not neutrality. Awareness is the first step toward accountability, and peaceful civic engagement remains one of the strongest tools available to civil society." "This was about standing up for human dignity, not politics. When innocent lives are targeted, compassion must be louder than fear or inconvenience," said Deepti Mahajan, also a key coordinator of the initiative. "These gatherings reflected unity across communities,

faiths, and regions--peaceful voices coming together for justice and humanity. Of note, Bangladeshi Hindu Americans who attended the rallies expressed deep concern about the survival of Hindus amid the ongoing violence in Bangladesh. Importantly, the complacency of the Bangladesh government is concerning, as it has not effectively addressed the safety of Hindus and other minorities," said Geeta Sikand, also a key coordinator of the initiative. "What we witnessed today was quiet strength--

prayer, presence, and purpose--demonstrating that awareness begins with showing up," said Divya Jain, another key coordinator of the initiative. In multiple cities, local elected officials and civic leaders attended the gatherings or formally acknowledged them, recognizing the importance of peaceful civic expression and the role of community-led efforts in highlighting global human-rights concerns. Media outlets at the local, national, and international levels were engaged, and coverage from all participating cities is being consolidated for broader distribution. Each rally followed

Xi Jinping, Vladimir Putin discuss 'grand plan' on ties; Russia oil income set to plunge thanks to US-India deal

Chinese leader Xi Jinping told Russian President Vladimir Putin that their two countries should work out a "grand plan" for the development of bilateral relations, their video call Wednesday coming against the backdrop of analysts and traders saying that Moscow faces a steep drop in oil income if US President Donald Trump successfully pressures India to stop importing Russian crude. Xi spoke via an interpreter with Putin and parts of the conversation were broadcast on Russian state television. India is key to Russia's oil revenue because losing its top purchaser of seaborne exports would force Moscow to slash prices to find other buyers. Trump has over the past year already claimed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi agreed to stop buying Russian oil. India never halted imports, however, citing its need for energy security and for cheap oil. The Kremlin says energy cooperation with



India, its second largest oil buyer after China, is strong after Putin visited India in December 2025. But Indian refiners are taking a cautious approach to Russian oil purchases, which is already hurting Moscow's income. Russian oil imports dropped 22 per cent to 1.38 million barrels per day in December from November, their lowest since January 2023, reducing Russia's share in Indian imports to 27.4 per cent while OPEC's share rose to 53.2 per cent, according to Reuters' calculations. That follows a peak in India's Russian oil imports at around 2 million barrels

per day in June 2025. "Any further reduction would already be meaningful, because there is only one relevant alternative buyer -- China -- which has also its limitations in taking in sanctioned crude," said David Wech from Vortexa consultancy. The pressure on Russia is increasing as oil discounts widen and fewer buyers are willing to take the risk, Wech said. Prices for Russian oil have sunk to record lows, while Russia's budget shows a deficit due to a shortfall in energy revenues, according to a government official. Adding to the problems, the number of tankers with Russian

Baloch leader alleges shifting narratives by Pak to counter independence movement

Baloch pro-independence leader Hyrbyair Marri has accused the Pakistani military establishment and political elite of repeatedly changing narratives to discredit the Baloch freedom



movement, stating that these efforts have consistently failed as support for Balochistan's independence has grown. In a post shared on social media, as cited by Marri's post, he claimed that Pakistan initially attempted to portray the Baloch struggle as a communist-backed movement allegedly supported by the Soviet Union. According to Marri, when that narrative lost credibility, the state shifted focus to what he described as the "myth of three sardars," presenting a handful of tribal leaders as the sole drivers of unrest in Balochistan. Marri asserted that this narrative also col-

lapsed as, according to him, tens of thousands of Baloch youth joined the movement and large sections of the population began openly demanding independence. He alleged that Pakistan has now adopted a new line of argument, branding supporters of Baloch independence as paid agents of India, a claim he described as false and short-lived. As cited by Marri's post, he further drew parallels with Iran's policies in Baloch-majority regions, accusing what he termed "Persian occupiers" of using similar labels and narratives to undermine political dissent. He claimed that such rhetoric reflects frustration over what he sees as diminishing control over Baloch regions on both sides of the border. Marri also called for unity between people in Iranian-occupied Balochistan (IOB) and Pakistan-occupied Balochistan (POB), urging them to strengthen what he described as a shared freedom struggle. He concluded by asserting that the days of Iranian and Pakistani control over Balochistan are "numbered." A leading Baloch activist has challenged Pakistan's assertions of operational success in Balochistan, saying the state is masking an ongoing

Iran's president seeks 'fair and equitable' negotiations, while US shoots down drone

Iran's president said on Tuesday he instructed the country's foreign minister to "pursue fair and equitable negotiations" with the United States, the first clear sign from Tehran it wants to try to negotiate as tensions remain high with Washington after the Mideast country's bloody crackdown on nationwide protests last month.

The announcement came as a US Navy fighter jet shot down an Iranian drone that was approaching an American aircraft carrier early Tuesday morning. The Iranian Mission to the UN did not immediately comment on the incident. The US military announced the downing of the drone on Tuesday evening. White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt said Trump special envoy Steve Witkoff has been planning to hold talks with Iranian officials in Turkey later this week, and the talks are still scheduled despite the drone incident. It was the first direct acknowledgment of the talks by the White House. "President Trump is always wanting to pursue diplomacy first, but obviously it takes two to tango," Leavitt said. "You need a willing partner to achieve diplomacy and that's some-



thing that special envoy Witkoff is intent on exploring and discussing." The shift toward negotiations marked a major turn for reformist President Masoud Pezeshkian, who had broadly warned Iranians for weeks that the turmoil in his country had gone beyond his control. It also signals that the president received support from Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei for talks that the 86-year-old cleric previously had dismissed. Turkey has been working behind the scenes to make the talks happen there later this week as US Mideast envoy Steve Witkoff is travelling in the region. A Turkish official later said the location of talks was uncertain but that Turkey was ready to support the process. Foreign ministers from Oman, Pakistan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United

Arab Emirates have also been invited to attend the talks, if they happen, according to the official who spoke on condition of anonymity as they did not have permission to speak to journalists. But whether Iran and the US can reach an agreement remains to be seen, particularly as US President Donald Trump now has included Iran's nuclear programme in a list of demands from Tehran in any talks. Trump ordered the bombing of three Iranian nuclear sites during the 12-day war Israel launched against Iran in June. On Tuesday, Araghchi spoke by phone with his counterparts from Oman, Qatar, Turkey and Kuwait, but did not mention a possible venue. Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmail

Baghaei told Iranian state TV that the talks are still expected to happen in the next few days but that the details, including where it will take place, is still being discussed. Oman, Turkey, and other regional countries have all offered to host negotiations. US Central Command said the drone "aggressively approached" the aircraft carrier on Tuesday, with "unclear intent" and it "continued to fly toward the ship despite deescalatory measures taken by US forces operating in international waters." The Shahed-139 drone was shot down by an F-35C fighter jet from the USS Abraham Lincoln, which was sailing about 805 kilometres from Iran's southern coast, Central Command spokesman Capt Tim Hawkins said. The incident took place just before sunrise. In a separate incident later Tuesday, Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps forces harassed a merchant vessel flying the American flag and carrying an American crew, Hawkins said. Two boats and an Iranian Mohajer drone approached the ship, Stena Imperative, "at high speeds and threatened to board and seize the tanker," Hawkins' statement said.

13-year-old boy swims for four-hour in rough sea to save mother, younger siblings in Australia

A 13-year-old boy has been widely praised for an extraordinary act of courage after swimming for four hours through rough seas to raise the alarm and save his mother and two younger siblings, who were swept out to sea off the coast of Western Australia. The incident occurred on Friday afternoon while the Appelbee family were on holiday in Quindalup, around 200 km south of Perth. Strong winds pushed the family's inflatable paddleboards and a kayak offshore from Geographe Bay, leaving them stranded as conditions rapidly deteriorated. As the family drifted further out to sea, Joanne Appelbee, 47, asked her son Austin to kayak south to shore to seek help. However, the kayak soon began taking on water, forcing the teenager to abandon it and attempt a 4 km swim back to land. Wearing a life-jacket, Austin battled fading daylight, strong currents and rough seas. After two hours, he removed the jacket to help him swim more efficiently. Speaking later to Australia's national broadcaster ABC, Austin described the fear and



exhaustion he endured during the ordeal. He said he focused on positive thoughts to keep going, even recalling childhood characters to distract himself from the danger. "I was very puffed out, but I couldn't feel how tired I was," he said. After finally reaching the beach, Austin collapsed from exhaustion before running nearly 2 km. to find a phone. He called emergency services, calmly requesting helicopters, planes and boats. Unsure if his family were still alive, he later passed out and was taken to hospital. Western Australia Police received the distress call around 6 pm and launched a multi-agency search and rescue operation involving water police, volunteer marine rescue crews and a rescue helicopter. At about 8:30 pm, Austin's mother, his brother Beau, 12, and sister Grace, eight, were located approximately 14.5 km offshore.
