# Pan masala cess revenue to be shared with states: FM

**NEW DELHI:** In a unique move of cooperative federalism, Union finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday told the Lok Sabha that the revenue from the proposed capacity-based cess on pan masala will be shared with states to be used in "health-related" activities.

While introducing the bill in the House, the minister explained the reason for bringing two separate legislations for demerit goods — the Central Excise (Amendment) Bill, 2025 on tobacco and its products, and the Health Security National Security Cess Bill, 2025 on pan masala. She said a new cess has been proposed as excise could not be levied on pan masala on the basis of capacity.

Speaking about the cess, she said in Hindi: "Aur States ke sath bhi, scheme ke dwara, hum share bhi kar rahe hain. Ye hai is kanoon ka ek unique point. (And, we are also sharing it with states through [a] scheme. This is one of the unique points of this legislation)."

As per the Constitution, a cess is imposed for a specific purpose and its revenue is not shared with states as it is not considered part of the divisible pool of taxes.

On Thursday, while the bill related to the cess was moved in the Lower House, the other bill that sought to levy central excise on tobacco and tobacco products, was considered by the Rajya Sabha. After the debate on the excise bill, it was returned to the Lok Sabha, thus completing the Parliamentary process to enact the legislation. The Lok Sabha had passed the excise bill on

Wednesday after an intense debate. Replying to a discussion on the bill on tobacco and tobacco products in the Rajya Sabha, Sitharaman said, "This is an excise duty, not a cess. This excise duty will join the taxable pool and will be devolved to the states as per the recommendations of the Finance Commission."

She allayed apprehensions of members that the levy on the demerit item would impact tobacco farmers. "There are several schemes which will take care of the welfare of the tobacco farmers. The Crop Diversification Programme (CDP) under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) is on and it runs in 10 major tobacco-growing states since 2015-16 under which farmers are encouraged to shift to alternative crops/cropping system," she said.

Over 1.12 lakh acres of land has been shifted from growing tobacco to other crops between 2017-18 and 2021-22, she said. The 10 states are Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Gujarat, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and West

Bengal.

Reacting to the issues raised by Trinamool Congress MP Sagarika Ghose pertaining to the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme in West Bengal, the finance minister said: "As per the MGNREGA Act, 2005, it is the responsibility of the state government to ensure transparency and accountability in the implementation of the scheme."

Based on central teams' inspection reports highlighting implementation issues, the ministry of rural development sent several communications to the state for their rectification. However, no noticeable improvements were observed in the state, she said.

"Consequently, funds to West Bengal were stopped since March 2022, under section 27 of the Act due to non-compliance with Central Government directives," she added.

Refuting the charge that West Bengal has been ignored by the centre, she said, "In fact, it is the TMC government that is hurting the growth of the people of West Bengal."

# Oppn criticises law panel's argument backing ONOE

**NEW DELHI:** Opposition lawmakers on Thursday questioned the Law Commission's support to the proposed power to the Election Commission of India (ECI) to defer polls — as envisaged in Article 82A(5) of the 'One Nation, One Election' bill that proposes simultaneous polls in the country — and rejected the law panel's argument that the said bill does not require ratification by at least 50% of the state assemblies.

In its submission to the joint parliamentary committee (JPC) examining the Constitution (129th Amendment) Bill and the Union Territories Laws (Amendment) Bill, the Law Commission said the provisions in the proposed legislation are correct and suitable without any fear of ambiguity and do not "disturb the basic structure of the Constitution."

During the briefing, law panel also noted that the bill does not require ratification by at least 50% of the states to come into force.

"The Law Commission is of the view that the proposed amendment to the Constitution does not in any manner disturb the basic structure of the Constitution of India. The proposed amendment is not falling within the proviso to Article 368(2) of the Constitution and does not require state ratification," a person aware of the details said.

The law panel argued that the powers proposed to be given to ECI for the purpose of simultaneous election in the proposed bill are a natural extension of its extant powers and there is no question of any excessive delegation to it, the person added. Functionaries aware of the

details said Opposition lawmakers, including Congress MP Manish Tewari, noted that under the Constitution, states are co-equal and not subservient to the Union legislature. Tewari as well as Trinamool Congress MP Kalyan Banerjee emphasised that the bill violated the basic structure. They pointed to Article 1, which defines India as a "Union of States" to put across the point that if the amendment bill affects the states, it impacts federalism, which comes under the ambit of basic structure. Tewari, functionaries said, maintained that if there was an interplay between state and the Centre, federalism kicks in. Therefore, ratification of states was important to pass the bill.

The Law Commission told the JPC that it was of the view that the provisions of the bill could be enacted by Parliament without there being any question on their constitutional validity. "The Bill can, accordingly, be enacted by Parliament through the procedure prescribed in Article 368 of the Constitution without there being any necessity of state ratification," the law panel said.

# ROAD PROJECTS LED TO LARGEST FOREST DIVERSION SINCE '20: CENTRE

**NEW DELHI:** Road projects led to the largest forest area diversion in the last five years, the Union environment ministry's response in Rajya Sabha on Thursday revealed.

Road projects led to diversion of 22233.44 ha of forests since 2020; followed by 18913.64 ha for mining; and 17434.38 ha for hydel and irrigation projects. Around 13859.31 ha was also diverted for power transmission lines.

Minister of state for environment, Kirti Vardhan Singh shared this information in Rajya Sabha in response to AITC MP, Dola Sen's questions regarding environment and forest clearances granted and rejected by the Central government since 2020.

According to Singh, the Centre granted 1,766 environmental clearances in the past five years, with the highest, 582, for infrastructure projects. In 2024-25, forest clearances were granted to one airport; 298 for communication posts; 409 for drinking water; 41 for mining; 500 for roads; and 21 for industry, among others.

# JPC holds first meeting to discuss 130th Constitution amendment

**NEW DELHI:** The joint parliamentary committee (JPC) on 130th Constitution amendment held its first meeting on Thursday and decided to meet the parties that boycotted the panel and visit states, even as the Opposition questioned the motive of the bill in the first sitting.

The Constitution (One Hundred and Thirtieth Amendment) Bill, 2025, which was introduced in the Lok Sabha on August 20 this year, aims to remove the Prime Minister, chief ministers or ministers facing corruption or serious offence charges if they remain in detention for 30 consecutive days. The two other bills have been brought to apply similar provisions to Union territories of Delhi, Puducherry, and

Jammu & Kashmir.

Many INDIA bloc parties, including the Congress, the TMC, the Left, the DMK, the SP and the RJD had boycotted the panel as they didn't want to be a part of the panel that might endorse the legislation.

Currently, AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi, NCP (Sharad Pawar) lawmaker Supriya Sule, Akali Dal MP Harsimrat Kaur Badal and YSRCP's S Niranjan

Reddy are the Opposition leaders in the panel.

According to functionaries, Owaisi is learnt to have told the committee that there were several laws that allow detention of persons for extended periods of time and would make elected representatives accountable to investigative agencies, instead of the voters who elect them.

"Everybody agreed that there should be decriminalisation of politics. It was also decided that we should also go to states and invite all segments of the society," JPC chairperson and BJP lawmaker Aparajita Sarangi told reporters.

The next meeting of the committee is scheduled to be held on December 17 when representatives of the ministries of home and law and justice will brief them about the bills.

**RS FLAGS DELAYS DUE TO JUDICIAL VACANCIES**

**NEW DELHI:** Judicial vacancies were discussed in the Rajya Sabha's Question Hour on Thursday, with members warning that delays in filling posts were directly affecting access to justice.

"The principle of criminal jurisprudence is that whoever has been arrested under pre-trial, bail is the rule, not jail... but when cases don't move for days and weeks, bail matters don't move forward, where will people get justice?" said Congress MP Shaktisinh Gohil, said while highlighting 297 high court vacancies across the country, including 16 in Gujarat. The discussion arose during a question addressed to law minister Arjun Ram Meghwal.

**NEW COASTLINE HELPS IN BETTER PLANNING: MoES**

**NEW DELHI:** The updated coastline of India (11,098.81 km) supports better planning for developmental activities such as ports, infrastructure, tourism zones, and disaster-risk assessments, enabling governments to prepare more effectively for cyclones, erosion, flooding, the ministry of earth sciences (MoES) informed Rajya Sabha.

Improved baseline data from the revised coastline supports India's maritime in improved management of territorial waters and exclusive economic zone (EEZ) boundaries, and enhances security, Jitendra Singh, MoES minister said. He was responding to questions by YSRCP MP Babu Golla Rao.

# '177K died in road crashes in 2024'

**NEW DELHI:** Road crash fatalities rose to 177,177 in 2024, the Union government told Parliament on Thursday, a number that makes it the worst year in terms of road accidents. Fatalities increased 2.5% from 172,890 in 2023; roughly 485 people died every day across India in road accidents in 2024.

S Velmurugan, chief scientist and head of the traffic engineering and safety division at the Central Road Research Institute (CRRI), said India's road crash deaths data corresponds to a trend seen in the global north in previous decades.

"The latest rise in road fatalities is not surprising because India has still not reached the saturation point that many developed countries hit in the late 1990s, where numbers plateaued and then steadily dipped. In contrast, India continues to see a boom in vehicle ownership and rapid highway

construction, but the safety standards meant to accompany this growth are not being implemented fully on the ground," he added.

He said speeding and faulty road engineering primarily contribute to India's crash burden, making enforcement the most decisive intervention. He said on many occasions highways cutting through a settlement fail to provide basic pedestrian facilities that become a direct trigger for crashes.

"Enforcement must be ruthless and systemic. Catching speeding at

a single camera point is no longer useful because drivers slow down when they see a sign. Sectional speed monitoring between toll plazas—which we now have every 40-50 km—should become standard. If a vehicle covers that stretch suspiciously fast, there should be immediate penal action."

The road crash death toll for 2024 was shared by union road transport minister Nitin Gadkari while replying to a question by DMK MP A Raja. As part of his reply, Gadkari said the Stockholm Declaration on Road Safety, adopted at the third Global Ministerial Conference on Road Safety in February 2020, had set a new global target to reduce road traffic deaths and injuries by 50% by 2030; India is a signatory.

He also said India's fatality rate per lakh population is 11.89 compared with China's 4.3 and 12.76 in the US, according to World Road Statistics, 2024.

**NEW DELHI:** India will lead the Council of Member States of the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance (International IDEA) for the year 2026 after Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Gyanesh Kumar formally assumed the chairship in Stockholm on Wednesday.

As chair, Kumar will steer the council's work with a focus on the theme "Democracy for an inclusive, peaceful, resilient and sustainable world". Mauritius and Mexico will serve as vice chairs for the year.

Kumar said the chairship will be "decisive, ambitious and action oriented", with India set to guide the council's work around two pillars — reimagining democracy for the future, and independent & professional election management bodies for sustainable democracy.

# PAK MAN CROSSES INTO INDIA OVER 'ILLICIT' AFFAIR

**BARMER:** An alleged illicit relationship forced a Pakistani man to cross over into India, where he was caught by the BSF in Rajasthan's Barmer. The incident took place on November 26 in Jatoni ki Beri.

Security forces initially suspected cross-border espionage, but interrogation later revealed that the intrusion was driven entirely by personal reasons, police said. BSF personnel apprehended the intruder, Hindal (24), after he was found hiding inside a cattle shed belonging to locals. A resident of Nayatla village in Pakistan's Tharparkar district and had reportedly crossed only a few metres into Indian territory before taking cover in the shed. Security agencies said formal protocols will be followed before the man is repatriated to Pakistan.

# Sitar damaged on Air India flight: Shankar

**NEW DELHI:** Anoushka Shankar has said her sitar was damaged on an Air India flight, telling the airline in a social media post that "even an Indian instrument isn't safe with them" and this is the first time in 15 or 17 years that this has happened.

The musician posted a video on Instagram on Wednesday showing a deep crack through the lower rounded end of the instrument. "You're the country this music belongs to and this is the first time anything like this has happened to my instrument in 15 or 17 years. How have you done this? I have special cases. You guys charge a handling fee and yet you've done this," she said in the video.

Though she did not mention details of her flight and where she landed, an Air India spokesperson said on Thursday that the airlines had initiated an investi-

gation, including a review of CCTV footage at Delhi airport.

"We are concerned to learn of a valued guest's experience with their musical instrument on a recent flight with us... However, we are currently unable to ascertain the cause of the damage and are engaging with the guest to address the issue, while investigating further to understand where the damage may have occurred as multiple stakeholders are involved in the handling of such items."

# Muslim bodies flag snags on UMEED portal, seek time as deadline nears

**LUCKNOW:** With the deadline to register waqf properties across the country on the centralised digital portal UMEED ending on Friday, Muslim organisations are on edge as they flagged technical difficulties in registering waqf properties and called for an extension.

The Centre launched the Unified Waqf Management, Empowerment, Efficiency and Development (UMEED) Act central portal on June 6 to create a digital inventory after geo-tagging all waqf properties. According to the UMEED portal mandate, details of all registered waqf properties across India are to be mandatorily uploaded within six months. With the deadline set to end on December 5, technical issues in the portal have caused

issues for those trying to register their waqf properties, the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) has said. Executive member of the AIMPLB and chairman of the Islamic Centre of India, Maulana Khalid Rasheed Farangi Mahali, said a legal team was being set up to assist Mutawallis approach waqf tribunals for the same.

"Reports have been pouring in about technical glitches in the portal, and it is almost impossi-

ble to upload details of lakhs of Waqf properties within such a short period," AIMPLB spokesperson SQR Ilyas said.

The development comes days after the Supreme Court on Monday to extend time for the mandatory registration of all waqf properties and asked the parties concerned to approach their respective Waqf tribunals. UP minister of state (independent charge) for minority welfare, Muslim Waqf and Haj, Danish Azad Ansari, said on Wednesday that those unable to complete the uploading work could seek an extension from tribunals on valid grounds.

Meanwhile, in West Bengal, CM Mamata Banerjee accused "certain groups" of spreading misinformation that land records were being listed as religious sites as mosques or graveyards.

# Manipur govt resettles 257 IDPs in Bishnupur

**IMPHAL:** The Manipur government on Thursday resettled 257 internally displaced persons (IDPs) from a relief camp in Bishnupur district, officials aware of the details said, with the development coming against the backdrop of protests by various displaced groups seeking rehabilitation.

Bishnupur deputy commissioner Pooja Elangbam flagged off the resettlement of 257 IDPs from 64 households, who were residing in the Leimaram high school relief camp, at Leimaram Waroiching under the revenue jurisdiction of Nambol sub-division at Village No. 27-Sadu Koireng, officials said.

"Today marks a significant and meaningful moment as many IDPs are able to return to

their homes. This return signifies a positive step towards building a better and peaceful society," Elangbam said. The deputy commissioner said the government has disbursed funds to the families heading back to Waroiching to support the redevelopment of their abandoned homes.

Earlier this month, the Manipur government said state and district level committees have been constituted to rehabilitate the IDPs. The committees, chaired by the chief secretary and deputy commissioners, have been tasked with monitoring and coordinating all rehabilitation and resettlement initiatives for IDPs, and addressing bottlenecks to ensure timely and efficient delivery of support, a statement said.

# PAK ESPIONAGE: RETD JAWAN, ONE MORE HELD IN GUJ

**AHMEDABAD:** The Gujarat Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) has uncovered an espionage network operated by Pakistan's intelligence agencies and arrested two people, including a retired Army jawan, in connection with the operation, officials aware of the details said on Thursday.

Officials said that Ajaykumar Surendrasingh Singh (47), retired Army Subedar residing in Nuvem, Madgaon in South Goa, and Rashmani Ravindrapal (35), from Dadra and Nagar Haveli, were arrested for their alleged involvement in the espionage network that sought sensitive information through fake identities, social media outreach and financial inducements.

They were booked under Section 61 (criminal conspiracy to commit offences punishable with two years or more) and Section 148 (offences against the State) of the BNS Act.

Evidence recovered from the mobile phones of both accused includes WhatsApp calls from international numbers, documents and financial transactions, officials said.

# Cong expels Palakkad MLA accused of rape

**THIRUVANANTHAPURAM:** The Kerala unit of the Congress on Thursday expelled rape-accused Palakkad MLA Rahul Mamkootathil on the same day a district court in Thiruvananthapuram rejected the latter's plea for anticipatory bail in the case.

Mamkootathil (36), a first-time MLA, faces serious charges of raping a woman, forcing her to get an abortion, and issuing verbal threats among others. He has also been accused by a second woman of raping her on the pretext of marriage and causing grievous physical injuries. He is currently absconding.

Kerala Pradesh Congress committee chief Sunny Joseph told reporters in Idukki, "Rahul Mamkootathil stands expelled from the Congress. We had sought the approval of the AICC on the issue, which we received. This is a collective and unequivocal decision of the Congress leadership. It is better that he (Mamkootathil) now resign as MLA."

The decision to expel the MLA came minutes after the Thiruvananthapuram district sessions

court dismissed the latter's request for anticipatory bail in the case of raping a woman and forcing her to abort by giving her pills. Principal sessions judge S Nazeera pronounced the order in open court while a formal order is awaited.

The special investigation team of the state police, probing the case, had submitted all relevant materials pertaining to the case, including statements of doctors who treated the complainant and the forensic results of audio recordings between the accused and the survivor.

The accused MLA had argued in his bail petition that he was the victim of a political conspiracy aimed at ending his career. He claimed that he had a consensual relationship with the woman and that she consumed the abortion pills of her own volition.
