Japanese tech might to the fore

Paralympic closing brings curtain to 8-year Olympic saga

Tokyo, Sept 6: The final act of the delayed Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics came on Sunday, almost eight years to the day after the Japanese capital was awarded the Games.

The Paralympics ended a 13-day run in a colorful, circus-like ceremony at the National Stadium overseen by Crown Prince Akishino, the brother of Emperor Naruhito. The Olympics closed almost a month ago. These were unprecedented Olympics and Paralympics, postponed for a year and marked by footnotes and asterisks. No fans were allowed during the Olympics, except for a few thousand at outlying venues away from Tokyo.

A few thousand school children were allowed into some Paralympic venues. "There were many times when we thought these games could not happen. There were many sleepless nights," Andrew

Parsons, president of the International Paralympic Committee, said on Sunday. The closing ceremony was entitled Harmonious Cacophony and involved both able-bodied actors and others with disabilities. The theme was described by organizers as a world inspired by the Paralympics, one where differences shine.

Like the Olympics, the Paralympics went ahead as Tokyo was under a state of emergency due to the pandemic. Like the Olympics, testing athletes frequently and isolating them in a bubble kept the virus largely at bay, though

cases surged among a Japanese population that is now almost 50 per cent fully vaccinated.

"I believe that we have reached the end of games without any major problems," said Seiko Hashimoto, the president of the Tokyo organising committee. The Paralympics may leave a more tangible legacy in Japan than the Olympics, raising public awareness about people with disabilities and the provision of accessible public space.

The Paralympics involved a record number of athletes 4,405 and a record number of countries won medals.

They also saw two athletes from Afghanistan compete, both of whom arrived several days late after fleeing Kabul.

"The Tokyo Games were a model of efficiency and friendliness. If it hadn't been for the COVID-related difficulties, these would be right at or near the top of the best-organised of the 19 Olympics Summer and Winter I have attended," Olympic historian David Wallichinsky said.

The costs also set records. A study by the University of Oxford found these to be the most expensive Games on record.

Japan officially spent \$ 15.4 billion to organise the Olympics and Paralympics, double the original estimate. Several government audits suggested the real costs are twice that. All but \$ 6.7 billion is public money.

‘Happy-go-lucky’ teen Leylah upsets Angelique in US Open

New York, Sept 6: Leylah Fernandez is a self-described happy-go-lucky girl having the time of her life at Flushing Meadows, raising her fists, pumping her arms and riling up crowds while beating two past US Open champions to reach her first Grand Slam quarterfinal.

A day before her 19th birthday, the unseeded left-hander from Canada grabbed the last five games to eliminate 2016 title winner Angelique Kerber 4-6, 7-6 (7-5), 6-2 on Sunday, demonstrating that an earlier upset of defending champion Naomi Osaka was certainly no fluke.

With grit and guile, plus a veteran's poise in the face of big deficits against much more accomplished opponents, Fernandez is displaying strokes and a demeanor that left Kerber offering

this assessment: "She can go really far in the next few years.

Also into the quarterfinals with a win Sunday was Carlos Alcaraz, an 18-year-old from Spain who became the youngest man to get that far at the U.S. Open since 1963 by outlasting his 32-year-old foe, 141st-ranked qualifier Peter Gojowczyk of Germany, 5-7, 6-1, 5-7, 6-2, 6-0.

Alcaraz now plays No. 12 seed Felix Auger-Aliassime, a 21-year-old from Canada who reached his second straight major quarterfinal by defeating Frances Tiafoe of the U.S. 4-6, 6-2, 7-6 (6), 6-4 with the help of 24 aces. Just as against Osaka in Arthur Ashe Stadium two nights earlier, Fernandez dropped the opening set against Kerber in Louis Armstrong Stadium,

Bopanna-Dodig in pre-quarters

Veteran Indian tennis player Rohan Bopanna and his Croatian partner Ivan Dodig advanced to the men's doubles pre-quarterfinals with a three-set win over the pair of Hugo Nys of Monaco and Arthur Rinderknech of France here.

The 14th seed Indo-Croatian pair won 6-3, 4-6, 6-4 over their unseeded rivals in one hour and 56 minutes on Saturday night.

Bopanna and Dodig converted all three break chances they earned and also saved three of the five breakpoints they faced.

They next face fourth seeds Rajeev Ram of the USA and Joe Salisbury of Great Britain, the Australian Open runners-up this season.
