# A GIANT WAVE FOR DEMOCRATS

WASHINGTON

Democrats swept a trio of races on Tuesday in the first major elections since Donald Trump regained the presidency, elevating a new generation of leaders and giving the beleaguered party a shot of momentum ahead of next year's congressional elections.

In New York City, Zohran Mamdani, a 34-year-old democratic socialist, won the mayoral race. And in Virginia and New Jersey, moderate Democrats Abigail Spanberger, 46, and Mikie Sherrill, 53, won their elections for governor with commanding leads, respectively.

The contests offered a barometer of how Americans are responding to Trump's tumultuous nine months in

office. The races also served as a test of differing Democratic campaign playbooks ahead of 2026, with the party locked out of power in Washington and still trying to forge a path out of the political wilderness.

That said, the midterm election is a year away and opinion polls show the Democratic brand remains broadly unpopular, even as Trump's own approval rating has declined.

Perhaps the biggest practical boost to Democrats on Tuesday came out of California, where voters approved a plan to redraw the state's congressional map in the party's favour, expanding a national battle over redistricting that will shape the race for the US House of Representatives.

Top Democrats, including former presidents Bill Clinton and Barack Obama, hailed the

electoral success of Mamdani and other winners.

"Congratulations @ZohranMamdani on your election as the next Mayor of New York City. I'm wishing you success as you work to transform the passion of your campaign into building a better, fairer, more affordable New York," Clinton wrote on social media.

"It's a reminder that when we come together around strong, forward-looking leaders who care about the issues that matter, we can win. We've still got plenty of work to do, but the future looks a little bit brighter," said Obama.

"More people voted in New York City's election this year than they have in 50 years. That's a win for democracy and a testament to @ZohranMamdani's inspiring campaign," Hillary Clinton posted on X.

## PIO vanquishes Vance's half-bro in Cincinnati

Indian-origin mayor of Cincinnati, Ohio, Aftab Pureval, won a second term defeating Republican challenger Cory Bowman, half-brother of Vice President JD Vance, local media reported.

Pureval's Tuesday victory cements Democrats' control of Cincinnati's local government and adds to Pureval's growing profile in Ohio politics, Fox News reported on Tuesday (local time).

Pureval, 43, a former special assistant US attorney, first claimed the mayor's office in 2021 after winning nearly 66 per cent of the vote, the report said.

Pureval's Tibetan mother fled Communist Chinese occupation as a child and grew up in a Southern Indian refugee camp, while his father is

## Indian-origin Muslim is new Virginia Lt Gov

NEW YORK

India-born American politician Ghazala Hashmi has been elected as Virginia's Lieutenant Governor, becoming the first Muslim and South Asian American to be elected to the top political post in the state.

Hashmi, 61, a Democrat secured 1,465,634 votes (54.2%), way ahead of her Republican rival John Reid, who secured 1,232,242 votes, with 79% of the votes in.

The Virginia State Senator, who emerged victorious on Election Day Tuesday, was among the over 30 Indian-Americans and South Asian candidates running for office for key nationwide positions in the 2025 elections.

Hashmi's election was among the most closely watched as she was in the fray for the top state post.

## Force behind Mamdani: Quiet, artist wife Rama

As Zohran Mamdani delivered an emphatic speech to mark his victory, he delivered a special shoutout. "And to my incredible wife, Rama, hayati," he said, using the Arabic word for "my life." "There is no one I would rather have by my side in this moment, and in every moment."

Rama Duwaji has quietly helped boost Mamdani's viral social media presence and even designed his logos — despite largely being a ghost on the campaign trail.

The Dallas-raised, Dubai-educated Syrian-American — who only moved to New York City four years ago — will be the youngest-ever first lady for the Big Apple.

The 28-year-old opted to stay out of the spotlight but is



said to have been a driving force behind the scenes, CNN reported.

She was among those who finalized Mamdani's brand identity when he first kicked off his campaign. Duwaji has been credited with boosting her husband's digital and large social media presence and has been a major source of support for him in private, sources said.

## New challenge for POTUS as his tariffs face apex court challenge

President Donald Trump's power to unilaterally impose far-reaching tariffs is coming before the Supreme Court on Wednesday. The Republican administration is trying to defend the tariffs after lower courts ruled the emergency law he invoked doesn't give him near-limitless power to set and change duties on imports.

The Constitution says Congress has the power to levy tariffs. But the Trump administration argues that in emergency situations, the president can regulate importation taxes like tariffs. Trump has called the case one of the most important in the country's history and said a ruling against him would be "catastrophic" for the economy.

## Trump wasn't on ballot: Prez on Republican rout

WASHINGTON

US President Donald Trump on Wednesday said that the Republican Party lost Tuesday's elections due to his absence from the ballot and the shutdown.

"Trump wasn't on the ballot, and shutdown, were the two reasons that republicans lost elections tonight, according to pollsters," the US President posted on Truth Social.

He, however, did not name the pollsters.

The government shutdown has entered its 36th day, breaking the previous record.

When NYC mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani started his victory speech, Trump posted, "...and so it begins!" In his victory speech, Mamdani

challenged Trump on immigration, heralded the toppling of "political dynasty" and said his election symbolises "hope" over tyranny and "big money".

In another post, Trump called for voter reforms. "Republicans, terminate the filibuster! Get back to passing legislation and voter reform! President DJT," he wrote.

"Pass Voter Reform, Voter ID, No Mail-In Ballots. Save our Supreme Court from "Packing." No Two State addition, etc. Terminate the filibuster!!!," Trump said in another post.

On election eve, Trump had warned voters that New York City would be a "complete and total economic and social disaster" and its "survival" is at risk if Mamdani won the mayoral race.

## 3 judges re-elected, extending Democratic majority in top court

All three of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court justices who sought reelection Tuesday will get another term, ensuring Democratic jurists keep their majority on the presidential battleground state's highest court — one at the centre of pivotal fights over voting rights, redistricting and elections.

The result shapes the

makeup of the seven-member court through the next presidential election in 2028. The three justices had been elected as Democrats, and voters were deciding whether to extend the court's Democratic majority. Rejecting all three could have plunged the court into a partisan deadlock if the state's politically divided government could not agree on temporary appointees to fill in.

The case centres on two sets of tariffs. The first came in February on imports from Canada, China and Mexico. The second involves the sweeping "reciprocal" tariffs on most countries that Trump announced in April.

### Chinese space station hit by small debris

The scheduled return of the crew manning China's space station on Wednesday has been put off due to a suspected impact from tiny space debris, the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) announced here. The decision to delay the return aims to ensure the astronauts' safety and mission success, the agency said. China rotates the crew of the station every six months.

### Isaacman again named NASA chief

US President Donald Trump on Tuesday announced that he has decided to nominate Jared Isaacman to serve as his NASA administrator, months after withdrawing the tech billionaire's nomination because of concerns about his political leanings. Trump announced in late May that he had decided to withdraw Isaacman after a "thorough review" of his "prior associations."

### Retirement home fire claims 11 lives

At least 11 people died and more than 30 were injured in a fire in a retirement facility that broke out the evening before in Bosnia. It was not clear what caused the fire on the 7th floor of the building in Tuzla on Tuesday evening. Bosnian media reported that higher floors in the complex were occupied by elderly people who could not move on their own or were ill.

## Cargo plane crashes in Kentucky, 7 killed

First responders prepared to resume looking for victims Wednesday after a UPS cargo plane crashed and exploded in a massive fireball while taking off from the company's global aviation hub at the airport in Louisville, Kentucky, killing at least seven people and injuring 11, authorities said.

The plane crashed about 5:15pm Tuesday as it was departing

for Honolulu from UPS Worldport at Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport. Over 200 responders were on the scene Tuesday night, Louisville Mayor Craig Greenberg said. "We'll continue to put every resource we have available to this, as well," he told WLKY-TV on Wednesday. Video showed flames on the plane's left wing and a trail of smoke. The plane then lifted slightly off the ground before crashing and exploding in a huge fireball.

Russia has begun developing the next generation of nuclear-powered cruise missiles, president Vladimir Putin said as reported by the official media.



and Navy with state-of-the-art weapons and vehicles are being implemented," he said, adding that the newest Avangard strategic missile system has entered combat duty.

"We have developed and put on duty, and launched mass production of the Oreshnik intermediate-range missile system," Putin was cited as saying by TASS.

"We have equipped our intercontinental ballistic missiles and submarine missiles with advanced warheads," the Russian President said.

Putin handed over state awards to developers of the country's nuclear-powered Burevestnik missile and Poseidon unmanned underwater vehicle.

## 85 dead in Philippines typhoon

MANILA: Typhoon Kalmagi has left at least 85 people dead with 75 others missing in the central Philippines, many in widespread flooding that trapped people on their roofs and swept away cars in a hard-hit province still recovering from a deadly earthquake, officials said Wednesday.

Among the dead were six people who were killed when a Philippine air force helicopter crashed in the southern province of Agusan del Sur on Tuesday. The crew was on its way to provide humanitarian help to provinces battered by Kalmagi, the military said. It did not give the cause of the crash.

Kalmagi blew away from western Palawan province

into the South China Sea before noon Wednesday with sustained winds of up to 130 kph (81 mph) and gusts of up to 180 kph (112 mph), according to forecasters.

Bernardo Rafaelito Alejan-

dro IV, deputy administrator of the Office of Civil Defence, said many of the deaths were reported in the central province of Cebu, which was pummeled by Kalmagi on Tuesday.
