Upgraded TAEI Registry 2.0 on healthcare unveiled

Chennai, Nov 9: In a major step towards enhancing its emergency healthcare ecosystem, the Tamil Nadu government on Saturday launched the upgraded Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative (TAEI) Registry 2.0 -a comprehensive digital platform designed to streamline and elevate the quality of emergency medical services across the State.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Ma. Subramanian inaugurated the new platform at Kalaivanar Arangam in Chennai, noting that it will greatly improve real-time coordination between ambulances and hospitals.

"The upgraded registry, available on both web and mobile platforms, will capture live patient data from the 108 ambulance network and hospital emergency departments. This will enable data-driven decision-making, enhance clinical

efficiency, and improve patient outcomes," the Minister said. Launched initially in 2017, the TAEI has been a pioneering model in India's public health system, transforming traditional hospital casualty wards into modern emergency departments equipped with advanced infrastructure, cutting-edge medical equipment, and specially trained staff.

Currently, 113 TAEI centres operate across Tamil Nadu -including 36 medical college hospitals, five attached institutions, 31 district headquarters hospitals, and 41 sub-district hospitals. Many of these are strategically located along key national and state highways to ensure swift access to medical care for accident victims and other critical patients.

Minister Subramanian said the initiative focuses on six major life-threatening conditions -myocardial

infarction (heart attack), burns, poison and bites, preeclampsia/eclampsia (PREM), trauma, and stroke. By addressing these high-risk emergencies through rapid intervention and triage, TAEI has helped save thousands of lives.

"The new TAEI Registry 2.0 will not only boost the speed and precision of emergency care but also create a valuable data resource for research, monitoring, and policy planning. With real-time analytics and digital integration, we can ensure every patient receives timely and appropriate care," he added.

The launch of TAEI 2.0 marks a key milestone in Tamil Nadu's mission to build a technology-driven, equitable, and efficient emergency healthcare system, serving both urban and rural populations across the State.

TN to seek Centre's clearance for greenfield airport

Chennai, Nov 9: In a decisive move to bolster aviation infrastructure, the Tamil Nadu government is set to seek site clearance from the Union Ministry of Civil Aviation for the proposed greenfield airport at Hosur within the next two weeks.

Announced by Chief Minister M.K. Stalin last year, the project is envisioned as a major gateway for southern Tamil Nadu and adjoining regions of Karnataka. Planned as a large-scale facility, the airport is designed to handle up to 30 million passengers annually, surpassing the Chennai airport's 2023 traffic of 22 million passengers.

Spread across about

2,000 acres in the Berigai-Bagalur region of Krishnagiri district, the proposed site has been strategically chosen to serve the fast-developing industrial city of Hosur and its surrounding clusters. The location was selected over Bendagondapalli near the TAAL airfield after technical studies confirmed its superior suitability with fewer topographical and operational limitations.

Officials said the Krishnagiri district administration has begun preparing a comprehensive land development plan, while the state government aims to initiate the land acquisition process within four months. Once operational, the airport is expected to decongest

Chennai's air traffic and significantly boost industrial, logistics, and passenger connectivity across the Krishnagiri-Dharmapuri-Salem belt.

However, a key regulatory hurdle remains. Under an existing agreement, no new commercial airport can be developed within a 150-km radius of Bengaluru International Airport until 2033. This restriction could delay or limit central approval, as Hosur lies close to the Karnataka border within the exclusion zone.

In parallel, Tamil Nadu has also approached the Defence Ministry seeking relaxation of airspace restrictions, since much of Krishnagiri's sky zone falls under Hindustan

Aeronautics Limited's (HAL) operational control.

Despite these challenges, officials remain optimistic that Hosur's strategic location and industrial significance will help secure early central clearance, paving the way for one of Tamil Nadu's most ambitious aviation projects.

Kerala Governor hails Roohi Mohazzab's green initiative

Calcutt, Nov 9: Kerala Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar inaugurated the 'Roohi's Tree Bank Nursery' project initiated by six-year-old world youngest environmentalist and Climate activist Roohi Mohazzab at Government Girls Higher Secondary School in Nadakkavu. The project aims to Plant 1Crore trees across 10,000 Schools in 3 years.

The Governor planted saplings along with Roohi and praised her efforts, saying it's a model for all students. He emphasized the importance of environmental conservation and said trees are the only solution to global warming.

The Tree Bank Nursery project aims to select 10,000 educational institutions from Kerala to Kashmir and plant 1,000 saplings under the guidance of each



school. The goal is to plant native tree species that blend with the local ecosystem.

Faisal Kottikollon, Chairman of Faisal and Shabana Foundation, and lyricist Padmashri Kaithapram Damodaran Namboothiri also spoke at the event.

Roohi has been

making waves with her environmental efforts, including sending letters to world leaders, including the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, advocating for recycling passport papers to conserve trees. She has also planted trees in Wayanad to prevent landslides.

Roohi's parents, Abdul

Gani and Dr. Anisa Muhammed, have been supporting her initiatives. They have been using recycled paper books for her education since kindergarten.

Roohi is a first-standard student at Common Ground International Academy in Kozhikode.

Tax advantage: Smart ways to benefit from insurance policies

Traditionally, the main reason to buy an insurance policy was to avail tax benefits. For many, "insurance" was synonymous with "tax saving." Over time, the perspective has evolved. Today, insurance is not just a tax-saving tool but also a means of wealth creation, risk protection, and financial security.

From life and health insurance to ULIPs, term plans, and pension schemes, a wide range of policies continue to offer both protection and tax advantages. Let's explore the key categories:

Life Insurance
Life insurance offers a financial safety net for your family in case of an untoward event. Premiums paid qualify

for deductions of up to ₹1.5 lakh under Section 80C of the Income Tax Act. Additionally, benefits received on maturity, death, or permanent disability are tax-free under Section 10(10D). Alongside tax savings, life insurance ensures long-term financial stability.

Unit-Linked Insurance Plans (ULIPs)

ULIPs combine insurance with investment by channeling part of the premium into market-linked funds. Premiums qualify for deduction up to ₹1.5 lakh under Section 80C. However, Long-Term Capital Gains (LTCG) tax applies on maturity proceeds. For policies issued after February 2021, maturity benefits remain tax-free only if annual premiums are below ₹2.5 lakh and not more than 10% of the sum assured. Importantly, death benefits under ULIPs are fully exempt from tax.

Health Insurance

Medical insurance premiums qualify for deduction under Section 80D. The limit is ₹25,000 annually, while for senior citizens it increases to ₹50,000. If you insure your family and senior citizen parents, deductions can go up to ₹75,000. Higher exemptions are also available in cases of disability or serious illness.

Term Insurance

Pure protection term insurance policies are also eligible for tax benefits. Premiums qualify for deduction up to ₹1.5 lakh under Section 80C. Section 10(10D) ensures tax-free payout in case of death.

In addition, premiums for health-related riders such as critical illness or hospitalization cover are deductible up to ₹25,000 under Section 80D.

Pension Plans

Pension or retirement schemes provide steady post-retirement income. Premiums are deductible under Section 80CCC, with an overall cap of ₹1.5 lakh combining Sections 80C, 80CCC, and 80CCD(1). The National Pension Scheme (NPS) offers an additional deduction of ₹50,000 under Section 80CCD(1B), making it one of the most tax-efficient retirement options.
