Bridge slab collapses at Kerwa Dam, villagers escape

A concrete slab on the bridge at Bhopal's Kerwa Dam collapsed Tuesday afternoon, moments after several villagers had crossed it. The section, located above gate number 8, gave way suddenly, though no one was injured. Authorities immediately stopped movement across the bridge as a precaution. The Kerwa Dam supplies water to a substantial portion of residents in the Kolar suburbs and remains a crucial part of Bhopal's urban water system. Eyewitness Asif Khan said he crossed the bridge just seconds before the collapse. "Villagers from nearby areas had also crossed moments earlier. A delay of even a few seconds could have cost lives," he said, adding that the bridge is frequently used by locals and vis-



ited by thousands during the monsoon. In a statement issued to the media, the district administration said partial damage had occurred to one of the four spans-around 17.5 metres long-of the 70-metre foot-bridge on the dam's right flank. Built in 1980 during the dam's construction, the bridge had already been closed to

public use and was reserved only for inspection work. Officials confirmed there was no loss of life or other damage. Environmental activist Rashid Noor Khan said the collapse reflected years of official neglect. "The government has ignored the NGT's orders on sewage management and encroachment," he said. "About one and a half years

ago, some people were engaged in illegal mining there, against whom I had filed a complaint, but no action was taken." Khan said unregulated tourism and construction activity have also contributed to the damage. "The government focused only on promoting tourism, not maintaining the site. Dumping and building near the reservoir have altered water flow and weakened the structure. It seems the administration is waiting for a tragedy," he said. This year, the dam has not reached full capacity. While the gates of Kolar, Bhadbhada, and Kaliyasot dams were opened several times, Kerwa's gates remained closed throughout the season. Water Resources Department officials inspected the site, but no official word was available on their findings.

CM reviews security, orders strict vigilance

Following the explosion in Delhi, Chief Minister Dr Mohan Yadav on Tuesday held a video conference with district collectors to review security preparedness in the state. From the Secretariat's Situation Room, Dr Yadav directed officials to maintain round-the-clock vigilance and strengthen surveillance at crowded areas, religious sites, and other sensitive locations. He stressed that public convenience must not be affected while ensuring strict monitoring. Director General of Police Kailash Makwana briefed the meeting on precautionary measures taken after the blast. Chief Secretary Anurag Jain, Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Shiv Shekhar Shukla, and senior officials were present during the review.

Upset over missing wife, man ends life

A 30-year-old man who had been distressed over his wife's disappearance for six months was found hanging from a tree in Swarna Jayanti Park under the Shahpura police station area on Tuesday morning. The body was discovered around 6:30 AM by the park's watchman after morning walkers spotted it and informed police. Officers identified the deceased as Deshraj Ahiwar, a daily wage labourer who lived in a roadside settlement opposite the park. He was originally from Rahatgarh tehsil in Sagar district and had moved to Bhopal about three years ago in search of work and stability. Assistant Sub-Inspector Rajendra Ken said no suicide

note was found at the scene. By the time police arrived, a crowd had gathered, including Ahiwar's relatives, who were visibly shaken and unable to believe what had happened in broad daylight. According to investigators, Ahiwar had been under severe emotional stress since his wife went missing around six months ago. Relatives told police she had allegedly left home with another man, and that Ahiwar had since turned to heavy drinking and often quarrelled with family members, growing increasingly withdrawn. The body has been sent for post-mortem to determine the cause of death. Police have registered a case and are questioning relatives for additional details while continuing efforts to trace the missing woman.

Woman killed in Lalgathi hit and run

Bhopal: A 50-year-old woman was killed after being hit by a speeding loading rickshaw at Lalgathi intersection around 9 am on Tuesday, police said. The victim, identified as Munni Bai Verma of Nayapura, Lalgathi, was walking to her workplace in Vijay Nagar when the vehicle struck her head-on. The driver fled the scene, abandoning the vehicle. Passersby rushed Verma to Hamidia Hospital, where doctors declared her dead on arrival. Her son, Sumit Verma, said the family learnt of the accident only after being informed by the police. Koh-e-Fiza police have seized the abandoned vehicle and are scanning CCTV footage from cameras near the intersection to identify the absconding driver.

Bank employee booked for raping live-in partner on marriage pretext

Acting on information received from Jabalpur, Bag Sewania police on Tuesday registered a case of sexual assault against a private bank employee accused of raping his live-in partner multiple times under the pretext of marriage. The accused, identified as Mukesh Mishra, a resident of Bag Sewania, allegedly assaulted a 28-year-old woman who works with a private firm and is originally from Jabalpur. The two reportedly met through phone calls a year ago, and their friendship soon blossomed into a romantic relationship. They later began living together in Danish Nagar, Bhopal. According to Sub-Inspector Shiromani Singh, the woman alleged that Mishra repeatedly

forced her into sexual relations by assuring her of marriage. However, a few weeks ago, he abruptly stopped communicating with her and refused to marry her. Distressed by his refusal, the woman approached Jabalpur police and lodged a complaint. A zero FIR was registered in Jabalpur, and the case diary was forwarded to Bhopal for investigation. Based on the details received, Bag Sewania police filed a case against Mishra for sexual assault. Police said Mishra is absconding and efforts are underway to trace his whereabouts. The investigation is being conducted under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code pertaining to rape and cheating, officials confirmed. The woman is currently undergoing counselling and police have assured her of full support during the probe.

Kerala Fest 2025 to celebrate unity through art, heritage and cuisine

The United Malayali Association (UMA), Bhopal, will host the second edition of Kerala Fest - 2025, a four-day celebration of Kerala's rich art, culture, cuisine, and traditions, from November 13 at the Bittan Market Ground. The festival, a symbol of cultural harmony between Kerala and Madhya Pradesh, aims to promote unity through art and shared heritage. Addressing a press conference, UMA President OD Joseph said the festival will be inaugurated on Thursday at 7:30 pm by Governor Mangubhai Patel, in the presence of several eminent dignitaries and community leaders.

Among those expected to attend are Speaker of the Madhya Pradesh Legislative Assembly Narendra Singh Tomar, Bhopal MP Alok Sharma, Minister for Cooperatives, Sports and Youth Affairs Vishwas Sarang, Chief Secretary Anurag Jain, and Chief General Manager of State Bank of India Pravash Kumar Subudhi. Each evening, cultural performances will begin at 6:30 pm, showcasing an exquisite blend of traditional and contemporary art forms from Kerala and Madhya Pradesh. The festival promises an immersive experience featuring folk dances, music, classical performances, handicrafts, and Kerala's famed culinary delights.

Man nabbed for stabbing father-in-law at Bajaria

Bhopal: Bajaria police arrested Syed Parvez in the early hours of Tuesday for allegedly stabbing his 70-year-old father-in-law, retired SAF personnel Naseer Hussain, during a domestic dispute on Monday evening. Hussain remains critical in the Hamidia Hospital ICU. Police said Parvez, 45, a generator repairman, went to Hussain's Bajaria home around 7:30 PM demanding that his wife Shahjahan return with him. When she refused, a quarrel broke out and Parvez allegedly stabbed Hussain in the stomach before fleeing. A team led by Sub-Inspector Umesh Mishra traced Parvez near railway tracks in Shankaracharya Nagar and arrested him. The knife used in the attack was recovered. He was produced before court and sent to judicial custody.

Panchayat CEO reviews rural projects, emphasises quality and deadlines

District Panchayat CEO Ila Tiwari on Tuesday toured several gram panchayats near Bhopal, reviewing civic and infrastructure projects and directing officials to ensure timely, high-quality execution. Tiwari was accompanied by Executive Engineer Jitendra from the Rural Engineering Service, Janpad CEO Shivani Mishra, Assistant Engineer Madhuri Patel, APO Deepti Rai and Sub-Engineer Vivek Khare. The team visited Achapura, Itkhed, Golkhed and Kanera panchayats, where sarpanchs and secretaries joined the inspections. The visit began in Achapura, where Tiwari examined the approach road to the Ijtima site and assessed preparations at the venue. In Golkhed, she inspected the 'Ek Bagiya Maa ke Naam' plantation initiative, interacting with women beneficiaries and offering practical suggestions. At Kanera, Tiwari and District Vice-President Mohan Jat inspected water supply installations, pond restoration and other local works. She urged officials to maintain consistency in standards and meet project deadlines without compromise.

CM's son to wed in mass ceremony

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has decided that his son, Dr Abhimanyu Yadav, will be married as part of a state-organised mass wedding ceremony in Ujjain. The event is scheduled for November 30, 2025, and will coincide with a community wedding celebration aimed at promoting social equality and simplicity in marital rituals. The bride-to-be is Dr Ishita, daughter of Satish Yadav from Khargone district, who is also a medical graduate. The engagement between the couple was held five months ago in a low-key ceremony at the Chief Minister's residence in Bhopal. The mass wedding event, organised under the state's public welfare framework, will include approximately 20 other couples from diverse backgrounds. In a

gesture of solidarity, the Chief Minister will personally present gifts to all participating couples. After witnessing the ceremony, guests will take part in community-oriented activities tied to matrimonial support schemes. Officials in Ujjain have been directed to ensure the wedding ground at the chosen venue is ready for the large-scale ceremony. Security, logistics, and guest coordination are already underway. Senior ministers, MPs, and state dignitaries are expected to attend, though the guest list remains deliberately limited to maintain a modest atmosphere. Political observers feel that the wedding may also strengthen the Chief Minister's grassroots appeal ahead of the 2028 Assembly elections. By celebrating a personal milestone in a socially relevant format, Mr Yadav has merged family tradition with public messaging.

Ten-day Congress camp in Pachmarhi ends with call for unity and discipline

State in-charge Harish Chaudhary distributed certificates to all district presidents and urged them to return to their districts with renewed courage and conviction. "The true strength of the Congress lies in its grassroots workers. We must strengthen the organisation from the village level to the booth level with determination and faith," Chaudhary said. Railway gears up for Ijtima rush with inspection at Bhopal station

Anticipating a surge of passengers for the annual Ijtima congregation from November 14 to 17, senior officials of the West Central Railway's Bhopal Division inspected Bhopal Station on Tuesday to assess preparedness. Additional Divisional Railway Manager Yogendra Baghel and Senior Divisional Commercial Manager Saurabh Kataria reviewed cleanliness, crowd management, ticketing facilities, passenger amenities, and security measures during their visit.

They instructed officials and supervisors to complete all arrangements in advance to ensure smooth passenger movement and safety. Kataria said the division's priority was to maintain order and convenience during the four-day event. To manage the expected crowd, the railway will deploy additional ticket counters, ticket-checking staff, and Railway Protection Force personnel. Divisional Engineer Neeraj Srivastava, Assistant Commercial Manager Naval Agrawal, Station Director BL Meena, and other officials accompanied the inspection team.

Three BLOs suspended for negligence in SIR

Collector and District Election Officer Roshan Kumar Singh on Tuesday suspended three Booth Level Officers (BLOs) in Ujjain for alleged negligence and disobedience in duties related to the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll. The suspension follows a review of ongoing voter roll verification work being conducted under the direction of the Election Commission of India and the Chief Electoral Officer, Madhya Pradesh. Singh said strict adherence to election-related instructions was non-negotiable and that

any lapse would attract immediate disciplinary action. Those suspended include Tarannum Talat, Assistant Teacher at Government Urdu Higher Secondary School, Madargate; Shafata Bee, Primary Teacher at Government Urdu Middle School, Topkhana; and Jitendra Gothwal, Assistant Grade-III at the Office of the Commercial Tax Officer,

Bharatpuri. Each officer was assigned as BLO at a separate polling station within the Topkhana and Rajendra Nagar areas. Officials said the action was taken after reports confirmed that the three officers failed to carry out assigned field verification duties on time and did not comply with supervisory instructions. They have been placed under suspension with immediate effect pending further inquiry. The collectorate has directed all remaining BLOs to complete the SIR work within stipulated deadlines and maintain regular reporting to ensure transparency in the voter list revision process.

Bhopal Ijtima: An ode to the imperfect and nameless

Long before the first tents rise for the annual Ijtima in Bhopal, small jamaats - travelling groups of men on faith missions - drift across cities and villages, calling believers to one of Islam's largest congregations. These unseen journeys are not driven by duty alone but by camaraderie - a quiet brotherhood that binds men across borders and languages. They leave behind the ease of home to awaken faith in others, believing that the fruits of godliness are sweetest when shared. Along dusty roads and in humble mosques, they speak gently, eat simply, sleep wherever they are received, and move on - nameless travellers sowing devotion, one encounter at a time. These jamaats form the spine of the Tablighi movement, founded by Maulana



Muhammad Ilyas Kandhlawi in 1927 to bring faltering Muslims back to the path of religious observance. What began as a quiet initiative with only a handful of followers has grown exponentially over the years, and the Bhopal Ijtima stands as its greatest testament. Spread across 350 acres, the congregation is expected to host around 1.5 lakh devotees in a vast tented city at

Ghasipura. Lakhs more will visit the venue each day to draw from the central message that forms the core of Jamaat elder Maulana Saad Kandhalvi's sermons. The massive task of logistics and management at the venue is being shared by 5,000 administrative and police officials and workers, along with 25,000 volunteers, many of whom are

already camping at the site, overseeing preparations and giving final touches before the arrival of guests. Slated for a November 14 start, the four-day event will see these volunteers welcome guests at bus stands, railway stations, and the airport, organise transport, and look after every need of the visitors - all in the quiet, self-effacing spirit of the Tablighi movement, remarkable in its discipline. While they refuse to speak on record, many admit in private conversations that taking time out from the pressures of professional and family life is not easy without help from the Almighty, who, they say, always blesses them with a way out in accordance with their niyat - their declared intent. They make no claims of perfection. These are ordinary men - traders, drivers, teachers, labourers - carrying the

weight of everyday flaws and failings. Yet they see in this mission something far greater than themselves, a chance to serve with sincerity rather than pride. An early winter has been among the challenges this year, but it has failed to dampen the spirit of these men, who have braved cold nights and early mornings to complete preparations ahead of time. Media coordinator for the Ijtima, Omar Hafeez, said preparations are nearly complete for the main venue as well as for parking bays, medical facilities, and other amenities. As night deepens at Ghasipura, a band of young men sits huddled under blankets, sharing chai and conversation - the quiet heart of the Bhopal Ijtima, sustained by the herculean efforts of these nameless, modest men.
