# ED goes to SC, seeks CBI probe against Didi for 17 offences

New Delhi: Enforcement Directorate Monday filed a writ petition in SC seeking a CBI probe into 17 offences under BNS allegedly committed by Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee, state DGP and Kolkata police commissioner on Jan 8 by obstructing ED raid on I-PAC's Pratik Jain, tampering and stealing evidence and intimidating its officials.

It requested SC to "direct immediate seizure, sealing, forensic preservation, and restoration to lawful custody of the ED all digital devices, electronic records, storage media, and documents illegally and forcibly taken away from the search premises."

ED has accused the CM and top police brass of committing 17 offences under BNS, including robbery, dacoity, theft, assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharging his duty, causing disappearance and destruction of evidence and criminal intimidation.

Terming the incident shocking, unprecedented and extraordinary, ED said, "Protectors of law—the CM, DGP and Kolkata police commissioner are party to serious cognisable offences requiring registration of an FIR."

## TMC claims 58L voters removed from rolls, SC seeks EC response

New Delhi: Supreme Court Monday asked Election Commission to respond within a week to TMC MP Dola Sen's plea accusing the poll panel of arbitrarily deleting more than 58 lakh names from West Bengal's draft voters' list by refusing to accept valid and permissible documents from people during the SIR exercise.



Sen has sought extension of Jan 15 deadline for submission of claims and objections to draft voters' list. Calling EC "WhatsApp commission" for issuing instructions to election officers through the messaging platform and not through written orders, the MP said EC must be directed to accept permanent residence certificates, panchayat

residence certificates and family registers as valid documents for inclusion in voters' list.

The draft electoral roll for Bengal was published on Dec 16, and 58,20,898 names were deleted, which the Rajya Sabha MP alleged was without any notice or personal hearing.

She said there has been a precipitous decline from 7,66,37,529 voters after the Special Summary Revision of 2025 to 7,08,16,616 voters on the draft electoral roll.

She said contrary to the SOP for SIR, in several assembly constituencies, deletion decisions with respect to voters categorised as absent-

tee, shifted, dead and duplicate (ASDD) are being processed centrally and marked en masse as 'Disposed'—Form 7 on the Electoral Registration Officer Net Portal.

"Alarmingly, this appears to be occurring without physical verification, individual hearing or meaningful involvement of the EROs concerned," she alleged.

Sen said, "A majority of affected electors are women voters, whose surnames have changed post-marriage, leading to misclassification by algorithm used by EC; over 90% of the cases are mismatch in names attributable largely to failure of algorithm; minorities are largely affected by misclassification of algorithm."

## Mann seeks Bhagat Singh trial tapes from UK museum

Bathinda: Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann has written to British deputy high commissioner Alba Smeriglio seeking "audio/video recordings" pertaining to the trial of freedom fighters Bhagat Singh, Shivaram Rajguru and Sukhdev Thapar, who were hanged in Lahore Jail on March 23, 1931.

"Original audio/video recordings and archival documentation pertaining to the trial proceedings of Bhagat Singh, Rajguru and Sukhdev are held by authorities in Scotland, reportedly preserved within a museum/institution maintaining historical legal archives of that era," Mann wrote to Smeriglio.

"These records hold profound historical and emotional significance for people of Punjab. Govt of Punjab seeks access to these materials for academic study, digital preservation, and exhibition at Shaheed Bhagat Singh Heritage Complex," stated the letter, urging that the request be taken up with authorities in Scotland.

"The gesture will be remembered as a significant step in honouring shared history and the universal ideals of justice, sacrifice, and humankind," the Punjab CM's letter said.

The absence of these identification details led to Prakash and his wife being declared unmapped voters, as EC could not automatically link his enumeration form with the 2022 electoral roll. "As per the standard, system-driven procedure, a hearing notice was automatically generated and issued to enable verification of the elector's details and ensure due opportunity for confirmation of eligibility," D'Costa said.

Prakash said that if the enumeration form cannot elicit the required information, it should ask more questions about previous place of residence. "EC should also train BLOs and empower them to verify the documents and scrutinise enumeration forms," the 81-year-old Vir Chakra awardee and hero of the 1971 India-Pakistan War told TOL.

## Tech error, claims EC after asking Admiral to prove his identity

New Delhi/Panaji: EC on Monday said that the notice to Admiral Arun Prakash (retd) to prove his identity in person as part of Goa's ongoing SIR of electoral rolls was triggered by a "system-driven procedure" and that he has submitted all necessary documents paving the way for an early resolution of the matter.

"The matter will be settled, perhaps by Tuesday, making the retired Admiral and his wife eligible for inclusion in the final electoral roll of Cortalm constituency in Goa," an officer aware of the proceedings said.
