NEWS IN BRIEF

Power supply disconnected due to non-payment of bills

Noida

The Noida Power Company Limited (NPCL) disconnected the electricity supply of the common area of Newtech La Galaxy Society located in Surajpur Site-C on Thursday for not paying the outstanding bill of about Rs 8 lakh.

The society has a bill due for more than four months. Electricity is being supplied to the flats. The electricity of the sub-registrar office located in sector Gamma-2 was disconnected on Tuesday. NPCL spokesperson Manoj Jha said that the electricity of the common area of Newtech La Galaxy Society Block-H located in sector Surajpur Site-C has been disconnected for not paying the outstanding bill.

The society has an outstanding electricity bill of approximately Rs 8 lakh. The department sent several notices to the society management to pay the outstanding amount, but the bills were not paid. The flats of the residents of this society have multi-point connections.

Manoj Jha stated that electricity in the common areas has been disconnected due to non-payment of the outstanding bill amounting to lakhs of rupees. Electricity supply to all the flats in the society will continue uninterrupted as before. Electricity supply to the common areas will be restored only after the outstanding bills are paid.

It is worth noting that this society's electricity has already been disconnected twice for non-payment of outstanding bills. The NPCL also disconnected the power supply to the sub-registrar office in sector Gamma-2, Greater Noida, on Tuesday due to non-payment of an outstanding electricity bill of approximately Rs 40 lakh. According to an NPCL official, the sub-registrar office has not paid the electricity bill since November 4, 2023.

Air quality monitoring station set up near airport

Noida

An air quality monitoring station has been set up at Dayanagar village, near the Noida International Airport. This station will provide real-time monitoring of the air quality of the surrounding areas. This initiative is being considered a significant step towards environmental protection and pollution control.

Advanced sensors installed at the air quality monitoring station will continuously measure levels of PM 2.5, PM 10, temperature, humidity, and various harmful gases. The data will reflect the actual pollution level, allowing timely corrective action. This will ensure environmental standards during construction activities and operations. The Noida International Airport aims to be developed as the country's first net-zero carbon emission airport. The air quality monitoring station is considered a concrete initiative in that direction. Air quality monitoring stations are equipped with state-of-the-art technology that accurately assesses the amount of dust particles and toxic gases in the air. This will also identify when pollution levels are most elevated during certain times or activities.

The air quality monitoring station will not only monitor construction work but will also help in monitoring pollution caused by traffic, air flights and industrial activities after the airport starts functioning.

Sood reviews Bhalswa landfill site, takes steps to curb Delhi pollution

Minister for Urban Development Ashish Sood today conducted an inspection of the Bhalswa Landfill Site to assess the ongoing biomining, waste processing, and dust pollution control efforts. Joined by senior officials from the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) and other relevant departments, Sood reviewed the functioning of trommel machines and evaluated the management of pre-processed waste at the site.

During the visit, Sood noted that approximately 4,000 metric tonnes (MT) of fresh waste are dumped at Bhalswa every day, a significant contributor to pollution in surrounding areas like Badli, Jahangirpuri, and Model Town. He directed MCD officials to dispose of both new and legacy waste using scientific methods and emphasized that new waste should be processed immediately to avoid the formation of another "garbage mountain".

CM Gupta Flags Off Another Delhi-Sonapat Inter-State Bus Route

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Thursday launched a new inter-state electric bus route from the Kashmere Gate Bus Terminal to the Sonapat Bus Stand.

The buses, operated by the Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC), are equipped with modern features like air-conditioning, CCTV cameras, panic buttons, and GPS systems. During the ceremony, the Chief Minister announced plans to resume DTC bus services connecting Delhi with nearby NCR cities.

Gupta stated that the revival of these inter-state bus services, which had been discontinued for several years, aims to provide better public transport options, reduce traffic congestion, and decrease pollution.

She highlighted the importance of enhancing connectivity between Delhi and surrounding areas, reinforcing the government's commitment to improving public transport and making it safer for citizens.

Jobs to be extended to next generation of 1984 Sikh riot victims: CM Gupta

The Delhi Government, led by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, has taken a significant step to help the families of victims of the 1984 anti-Sikh riots by approving a policy that offers compassionate employment to their dependants. This decision was made during a Cabinet meeting, highlighting the government's commitment to justice and economic rehabilitation for those affected by the riots.

The new policy aims to address employment assistance that has been pending since a Cabinet decision in 2007, which was not acted upon for 18 years due to various administrative issues. To resolve this delay, the government has designed a clear and timely policy to ensure eligible families receive the assistance they deserve.

A notable aspect of the policy allows dependants of victims who are over 50 years old and unable to work to nominate a younger family member, such as a son or daughter, for the job. This ensures that the benefits reach the families effectively, acknowledging that many dependants have aged and may not be in a position to work themselves.

Furthermore, the policy includes adjustments to age and educational requirements and aligns with the Delhi High Court's directives. It also establishes a transparent process for verification and addressing grievances, making appointments fair and efficient.

G B Nagar schools will run classes up to class 5 in hybrid mode

Noida

In view of the rising pollution levels in Noida and Greater Noida, schools of all boards in Gautam Buddha Nagar will now operate in hybrid mode (both online and offline) up to class 5. Gautam Buddha Nagar district magistrate Medha Rupam issued an order in this regard on Thursday. This decision was made following the implementation of the third phase of the Graded Response Action

Plan (Grap). Students from class 1 to 5 will no longer be compelled to attend school classes. The school management has been instructed to provide both online and offline options so that children could attend classes at their convenience and health. Given the ever-increasing levels of pollution, parents have been demanding that the administration temporarily move classes for younger children online.

Sood also provided updates on the progress of biomining at the site. Since 1994, Bhalswa Landfill has accumulated over 10 million MT of waste, with 6.88 million MT biominer so far. He assured that the pace of biomining has been accelerated, with the aim of clearing the remaining 4.04 million MT in the coming years.

In addition, the Minister highlighted efforts to expand waste processing capacity, including the availability of 10 additional acres for wet waste processing by December 2025. He stressed the Delhi Government's commitment to transforming the city into a "landfill-free" capital through effective waste management and pollution control strategies.
