HACKSPIRE 2025: FIEM IGNITES GLOBAL INNOVATION THROUGH TECHNOLOGY AND TALENT

The Future Institute of Engineering and Management (FIEM), Kolkata, successfully hosted HackSpire 2025, an international inter-college hackathon held from October 31 to November 1, 2025. Organized by the FIEM Student Chapter and supported by ACM India, the event united global participants, mentors, and industry partners for a 25-hour technology-driven innovation marathon.

This year, HackSpire 2025 gained remarkable international traction. The event witnessed foreign registrations via Devfolio, participation from international teams, and mentorship from global experts and judges. Leading tech companies including AWS, GitHub, Airbus, Reelsn, FlutterFlow, Kapsy, and Mediascote extended strong sponsorship support. With over 4,100 global registrations and 254 on-site finalists, the event reinforced FIEM's growing global footprint in the student developer community.

A total of 65 finalist teams competed across diverse technology tracks, including Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning, Blockchain (Aptos Track), Cloud & AI (AWS Track), IoT & Embedded Systems, and Sustainability. Each track encouraged participants to tackle complex real-world challenges through innovative, interdisciplinary solutions.

The hackathon was the culmination of three months of meticulous preparation by the FIEM ACM Student Chapter. Student organizers efficiently managed sponsorship, logistics, communication, and technical operations. Platforms such as Devfolio, GitHub, Google Workspace, Notion, and Discord facilitated seamless coordination and collaboration. Round-the-clock power backup, high-speed internet, and a well-structured support system ensured smooth progress throughout the 25-hour coding sprint.

The atmosphere at HackSpire was vibrant and high-energy, marked by continuous coding sessions, mentor guidance, brainstorming, and late-night debugging. A Halloween-themed midnight activity added a fun cultural twist to the intense technical ambience. International mentors made significant contributions by fostering cross-border collaboration and knowledge exchange.

Several innovative projects emerged as highlights, featuring both hardware prototypes and AI-driven applications. The winning team, Team Titanium Roblox from Adamar University, impressed judges with their project "A Surveillance Bot – Vision for Every Mission": an AI-terrain rove designed for secure, long-duration monitoring in environments unsuitable for drones.

Prizes worth \$1,400, awarded with sponsor merchandise, GitHub Developer Packs, and HackSpire swag, were awarded to top-performing teams. Select winners also received continued mentorship from partners to refine and scale their projects for future opportunities.

HackSpire 2025 not only strengthened FIEM's position as an innovation hub in Eastern India but also promoted global collaboration and inspired students to engage actively with the international tech ecosystem. Looking ahead, the organizing team plans to expand its global mentor and judge network and introduce hybrid participation formats, paving the way for HackSpire to emerge as one of South Asia's premier student innovation marathons.
