Union Minister Patel urges scientists to push frontiers in AI-driven healthcare, genomics

New Delhi, Nov 13 (UNI) Union Minister Anupriya Singh Patel on Thursday called on the scientific community to harness AI and genomics for next-gen healthcare and ensure India leads the world in these futuristic technologies.

Speaking at the Health Research Excellence Summit 2025 here, Patel said, "India should not only contribute to global science but lead it."

Drawing attention to India's emerging role as a major player in health research over the past decade, she highlighted initiatives such as MedTech Mitra and

innovations like Rotavac and the COVID-19 vaccines, as a testament to India's growing prominence in the global health research landscape. The union Minister emphasised the Government's commitment to ensuring that the benefits of science and research reach people at all levels. "India is becoming increasingly self-reliant in the MedTech and biomedical innovation sectors. The country is not only innovating but also demonstrating the capacity to deliver solutions at scale," she added.

At a day-long summit organised by the Department of Health

Research (DHR) in collaboration with the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Dr Vinod Kumar Paul, Member (Health), NITI Aayog, urged the DHR to focus on priority areas such as non-communicable diseases (NCDs), hypertension, and trauma care.

He chalked out a ten-step roadmap to achieve this vision, including measures such as strengthening primary healthcare through 1.5 lakh fully functional Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (AAMs), offering comprehensive packages for cancer, hypertension, oral health, and more, promoting

awareness of India's traditional systems of medicine, and leveraging frontier technologies such as AI and robotics for innovative health solutions, among others. The summit also witnessed the unveiling of several DHR-ICMR initiatives, including MedTech Mitra's

innovator's guidebook for in-vitro diagnostic (IVD) medical devices, and an assessment kit for evaluating Upper Limb functions that was developed indigenously by the Centre of Advanced Research & Excellence - Disability & Assistive Technology (CARE-DAT) at IIT Delhi and AIIMS Delhi.

Congress slams govt over Red Fort blast, asks Shah to own responsibility

New Delhi, Nov 13 (UNI) The Congress party on Thursday launched a scathing attack on the union Government's handling of the deadly car bomb blast near the Red Fort, which claimed 13 lives, terming it as a major intelligence failure and a worrying delay in official response. The party has demanded that Home Minister Amit Shah take responsibility for the security lapse.

"Forty-eight hours after the blast shook the national capital, the union Cabinet finally acknowledged what the entire nation already knew: this was a terror attack," said Pawan Khara, Chairman of the AICC's Media & Publicity Department in a statement issued at a press conference.

"The people of India deserve to know why it took so long for the Government to call this what it was, and why it failed to prevent yet another terror strike in the heart of the capital," he said.

Khara questioned how 2,900 kilograms of explosives were recovered in connection with the module behind the Red Fort bombing, highlighting serious and repeated intelligence failures.

He pointed out that this incident comes just seven months after the Pahalgam terror attack, which the Congress also termed a major intelligence failure.

The Congress leader directly challenged Amit Shah's continued tenure as Home Minister, citing several major terror attacks that have occurred under his watch, including the 2015 Gurdaspur attack and the 2019 Pulwama attack.

To ensure a unified national response, the Congress has put forth three demands:

"The government must act on the 'new normal' doctrine to deliver justice,"

"The Prime Minister should convene an all-party meeting to build a unified national response."

"The government should pre-empt the Parliament session to discuss the Delhi Red Fort blast and address growing internal security concerns."

"Unity in action, in the wake of adversity, is the need of the hour," Khara said, emphasizing that the terror attack necessitates a cohesive approach with all political parties and state governments.

Ayush Institute at Bengaluru to conduct Madhumeha Vimarsha

New Delhi, 13 Nov (UNI) The Ministry of AYUSH on Thursday said that the Central Ayurveda Research Institute (CARI), Bengaluru, will observe World Diabetes Day 2025 with a special programme titled "Madhumeha Vimarsha" on 14th November 2025.

According to officials for the Ministry, the one-day event will feature the ongoing research, clinical work, and outreach initiatives taken up by the institute in the area of Diabetes mellitus.

Outlining the current measures taken by the government to develop and implement, the ministry noted that the centre has taken an integrative approach for the prevention and management of diabetes through Ayurveda, Yoga, and lifestyle interventions. "So far, around 6,000

patients have availed services at the Institute, with more than 25% from the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)," read the press statement.

Drawing attention to institutions' outreach efforts beyond clinical care, ministry officials said that the facility has strengthened outreach through digital health initiatives, benefiting over 5 lakh people via e-medical records, teleconsultations, SMS alerts, and information accessible on its website and social media platforms. Speaking ahead of the event, Dr Sulochana Bhat, In-charge, CARI Bengaluru, said, "Our focus has been on combining traditional wisdom with scientific research to address diabetes in a holistic yet evidence-based manner. The Centre's initiatives reflect how integrative healthcare can

improve quality of life for those at risk."

She further highlighted the collaborative studies that are underway with CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru, and IISc Bengaluru on selected food products and Ayurvedic formulations. "An integrated framework for the prevention and management of Madhumeha has been developed and is in press, while a study on Prakriti and diabetic peripheral neuropathy is also under publication," the statement noted. Underlining the institution's achievements in assessing diabetes risk, CARI has developed a machine learning-based predictive system. Once the validation is complete, a mobile app will be developed to enable individuals to monitor their health more effectively, the ministry noted.

Game-Changer' Mudh-Nyoma Airbase boosts India's air power along China border

New Delhi, Nov 13 (UNI) After Chief of Air Staff Air Chief Marshal A.P. Singh successfully landed a C-130J Super Hercules aircraft on the newly built Mudh-Nyoma runway, the Indian Air Force (IAF) formally opened the strategically important Mudh-Nyoma airbase in eastern Ladakh.

Air Marshal Jeetendra Mishra, Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Western Air Command, accompanied him on the historic flight on Wednesday.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has called the airbase, which is 13,700 feet above sea level and only 25 kilometres from China's Line of Actual Control (LAC), a "game-changer."

The facility, which was built at a cost of Rs 218 crore by the Border Roads

Organisation (BRO), has a 2.7-kilometer runway that can handle fighter jets, transport planes, and helicopters.

Now that Mudh-Nyoma is operational, India's aerial capabilities in the high-altitude region are greatly enhanced as Ladakh is home to four important Air Force bases: Leh, Kargil, Thoise, and Nyoma.

The airbase's activation follows a year after China and India resumed joint patrols in the Demchok sector, signalling a slow thaw in the following the final clashes in 2020 that killed 20 Indian soldiers in the Galwan Valley and Pangong Tso region. Military deployment on both sides of the LAC has increased as a result of those clashes, which were brought on by disagreements over infrastructure development close to the Galwan River Valley.

ANTF conference in Nagaland to lay roadmap to fight drug menace in NE

Dimapur, Nov 13 (UNI) In a renewed effort to fight the scourge of drugs in the Northeast region, a two-day regional conference of the heads of Anti-Narcotics Task Forces (ANTF) of the Northeast and West Bengal commenced at Chumoukedima police complex on Thursday.

The conference aims to strengthen coordination and develop effective strategies and lay a roadmap to curb drug trafficking and substance abuse across the region.

Jointly organised by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and the Nagaland government, participants from various central and state law enforcement, intelligence, and security agencies are in attendance.

Delivering the keynote address, Nagaland DGP Rupin Sharma observed that drug trafficking and use are no longer merely law and order issues but a direct threat to our internal security and the future of our youth.

He pointed out that the Northeast's long and porous 1,643 km border with Myanmar, combined with challenging terrain and the governance turmoil in Myanmar, and its close proximity to the Golden Triangle (Myanmar-Laos-Thailand), make the states of the region, including Nagaland, extremely vulnerable.

He said the drugs and drug money flowing through these routes feed the nexus of organised crime, insurgency, and narco-terrorism. "Dismantling the

drug cartels is synonymous with enhancing national security," he added.

Sharma said Nagaland alone has an estimated 1.2 lakh drug users, who consume heroin, locally known as 'shaanflower' or '5F', because of its traditional origins in the Shan province of Myanmar.

The DGP proposed three key pillars for the conference - coordination, enforcement, and accountability. He stressed that coordination among agencies, coordination among the various pillars of the criminal justice system, coordination between law enforcement and civilian wings of government with the public are key to fighting the drug menace. NCB director

general Anurag Garg, in his address, highlighted the significance of coordinated efforts among the northeastern states to strengthen enforcement mechanisms and intelligence sharing in the fight against narcotics.

He stated that a 2019 survey conducted by the ministry of social justice and empowerment showed higher rates of drug abuse in the NE states as compared to the other states of the country.

R Sudhakar, DDG (NER), NCB, emphasised the need for constructive discussions in formulating effective strategies and a comprehensive roadmap to tackle the drug problem in the Northeast, viewing the conference as an opportunity for the states to unite in this common cause.

Mukul Roy's disqualification historic, says Suwendu Adhikari

Kolkata, Nov 13 (UNI) Describing the disqualification of TMC MLA Mukul Roy from the West Bengal Assembly over defection, leader of Opposition Suwendu Adhikari today said the Calcutta High Court ruling is historic.

In a statement, Adhikari said the ruling of the division bench comprising Justice Debangsu Basak and Justice Md. Shabbir Rashid's disqualification of Mukul Roy as an MLA owing to his defection was historic in a hotly contested writ petition filed by him.

The court ruling also quashed an order passed by the Speaker of the assembly, who had refused to do the same and had delayed his decision in the defection petition filed by him.

"Ultimately, truth triumphs, though it may be a little delayed. The court, while preserving sanctity of the Constitution, especially the Tenth Schedule, has also left
