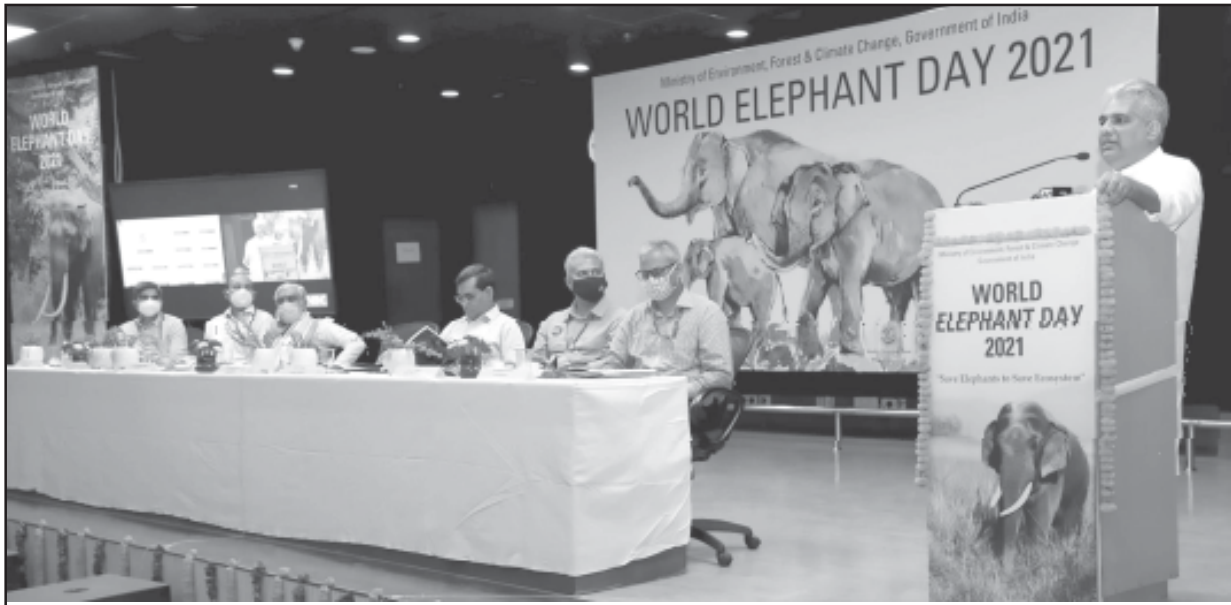
Low-cost Flexible Tactile Sensors having Robotics and Bio-medical Applications Developed

An Indian researcher has developed low-cost soft, flexible, and wearable sensors that can be used for diagnosis of pulse rate variability in humans. Being a high sensitivity flexible pressure/strain sensor, it can also be used for small and large scale motion monitoring, with potential applications in robotics, prosthetics, as well as minimal invasive surgery and identification of tumor/cancerous cells. Dr. Dipti Gupta from IIT Bombay has fabricated these tactile (pressure and strain) sensors using low-cost polyurethane foam and nanomaterial-based inks that can coat several substrates with support from the Advanced Manufacturing Technologies programme of the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India. Reduced graphene oxide (rGO) was used as the sensing material. The fabrication of sensors based on reduced graphene oxide (rGO) as the sensing material was challenging due to the intrinsic hydrophobic behavior of graphene oxide inks as well as the agglomeration of graphene oxide flakes after reduction. A reducing agent called hydrazine and a dual-component additive comprising of compounds benzoisothiazolinone and methylisothiazolinone in appropriate proportion were used to synthesize rGO ink with a hydrophilic nature. Utilizing this hydrophilic rGO ink mixed with multiwalled carbon nanotubes (MWNTs), a very simple, low-cost approach was found for the fabrication of a pressure sensor based on polyurethane (PU) foam coated with the MWNT-rGO ink (MWNT-rGO@PU foam). The MWNT-rGO@PU foam-based devices were shown to be versatile pressure sensors with the potential to detect both small-scale and large-scale movements.

23 MPs meet health minister over treatment to patients with rare genetic conditions

New Delhi, Aug 13 (IPA) : A group of 23 Rajya Sabha MPs met Union Health and Family Welfare Minister Mansukh Mandaviya and sought his ministry's immediate intervention to provide treatment to the eligible patients diagnosed with rare genetic conditions, a statement said on Wednesday. They submitted a memorandum to the Minister, drawing his attention to the urgent need for prioritisation of treatment for the patients diagnosed with Group 3(a) rare genetic conditions. "Despite the notification of the much-awaited National Policy for Rare Diseases 2021 in March this year, these patients continue to be at grave risk due to the lack of any sustainable funding mechanism for treatment," the MPs said. They requested Mr. Mandaviya to extend the Umbrella Scheme of Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi (RAN) to all Group 3(a) patients with treatable conditions and transfer the unspent funds from the previous years' budgetary allocation to provide treatment for the eligible patients diagnosed with treatable conditions.

Two people apprehended from Tamil Nadu in Kerala Bank ATM fraud case

Thiruvananthapuram, Aug 13 (IPA) : The Kerala Police have taken two people into custody in connection with an ATM fraud that allegedly preyed into the "compromised cybersecurity system" of the Kerala Bank. Three days after the recently-formed scheduled State Cooperative Bank alerted the police of an ATM loot of at least ₹2.4 lakh, the Cyber Crime police nabbed two Kasaragod natives from Tamil Nadu on Thursday. While another accused is on the run, the police remained on the lookout for the involvement of more hands in the case. The extent of the theft could also increase, sources said. Sleuths involved in the probe said the bank raised alert after finding large sums of cash missing from its ATMs in various districts including Thiruvananthapuram, Kottayam and Kasaragod on Monday. In Thiruvananthapuram, the fraud is suspected to have taken place from two ATMs in the East Fort and in Nedumangad.

The gang is suspected to have exploited the failure of the Kerala Bank to evolve a common software for its banking network. Despite amalgamating the district cooperative banks in the State around two years ago, the bank continued to run on separate software in each district. This anomaly could have been factored

in by the gang while hatching the conspiracy.

A senior police officer said ATMs usually relied on a switch application server to communicate with the core banking system in order to validate the user's bank account details for a requested transaction.

In India, the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) facilitated the core banking operations of financial institutions while its National Financial Switch (NFS) linked ATM networks across the country. Normally, the ATM software accepted or declined transactions after receiving information from the NPCI via the switch application server. The NPCI, which served to ensure the user possessed the required amount in his bank account, also oversaw the transfer of the withdrawn money from the user's account to the bank that managed the ATM. However, in the Kerala Bank case, the fraudsters are believed to have used an ATM card issued by a bank account based in Uttar Pradesh to fool the Kerala Bank ATMs to spit out large amounts without notifying their home bank. Investigators suspected them to have been managed this by hacking the Kerala Bank's software and intercepting the transaction request before it reached the NPCI system.

At least 15 crore children, youths out of formal education system: Dharmendra Pradhan

New Delhi, Aug 13 (IPA) : At least 15 crore children and youths are out of the country's formal education system, and roughly about 25 crore population is below the primary definition of literacy, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said Thursday, August 12, 2021.

He was addressing a session on "Job creation and entrepreneurship" organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) during its annual meeting.

"If we take into account the numbers of children and youths between the

age of 3-22 years who are enrolled in government, private and charitable schools, anganwadis, Higher Education Institutions and in the entire skilling ecosystem, the cumulative figure from all the verticals is around 35 crore while (the country's) population in the particular age group is around 50 crore," Mr. Pradhan said.

"This means that at least 15 crore children and youth are out of the formal education system. We want to bring them into the education system," he added.

'Lessons from first two COVID-19 waves reason for heightened vigil at borders'



Mangaluru, Aug 13 (IPA) : Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai justified curbs on travellers from neighbouring Kerala and Maharashtra entering Karnataka saying the government has learnt lessons from the first and second waves of COVID-19.

"Both the waves entered Karnataka from Kerala and Maharashtra, and spread across the state. Therefore, I held meetings with experts and the Health Minister to assess the situation immediately

after taking the oath of office. It was decided to exercise absolute precaution in border areas," he told mediapersons after inaugurating a new Intensive Care Unit at the District Government Wenlock Hospital in Mangaluru on August 12.

The government has made it mandatory for people from those two States to produce COVID-19 negative certificates not older than 72 hours before entering Karnataka. "This has been done to ensure the

safety of our people," he said.

Speaking about the ICU, Mr. Bommai congratulated the Health Department, the district administration and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) for joining hands to augment health infrastructure in Karnataka. "Every district and taluk hospital in the State would be equipped with adequate infrastructure so as to face any kind of situation," the Chief Minister said.

CII members donated

about 42 lakh towards equipment required for the state-of-the-art 32-bed ICU at Wenlock hospital. United Breweries, Diya Systems, CII Foundation, Delhi, Symnox Solutions, Gwasaf, Konkan Speciality Polyproducts, Novigo Solutions, Areva, Kalbhavi Cashews, Spectrum Industries, MMPS, Aruna Masala, Amit Cashews, Kanara Small Industries' Association and District Small Industries' Association contributed. The ICU was built at a cost of 1.24 crore from the State Disaster Relief Fund. The hospital already has a 35-bed ICU provided by Mangalore Smart City Ltd.

Later, Mr. Bommai inaugurated the district Ambedkar Bhavan at Derebail in Konchady.

He was accompanied by Ministers Kota Srinivas Poojary, S. Angara, K. Sudhakar, V. Sunil Kumar, Dakshina Kannada MP Nalin Kumar Kateel, MLAs and others.

152 police officers awarded HM's medal for excellence in investigation

New Delhi, Aug 13 (IPA) : As many as 152 police officers in the country have been conferred with the 'Union Home Minister's Medal for Excellence in Investigation' for 2021 for their high professional standards of investigation of crime. The Union Home Ministry, in a statement, said the

awardees include 28 women police officials from across the country. This medal was constituted in 2018 with the objective to promote high professional standards of investigation of crime and to recognise such excellence in investigation by investigating officers.

The 'Union Home Minister's Medal for Excellence in Investigation' for 2021 has been awarded to 152 police personnel, the statement said.

IAF sacks staffer for refusing to get vaccinated against COVID-19

Ahmedabad, Aug 13 (IPA) : The Indian Air Force has sacked one of its personnel from service for refusing to get vaccinated against COVID-19, which has been made a service condition, the central government has told the Gujarat High Court. Additional Solicitor General Devang Vyas, in his submission on Wednesday in the HC on a plea moved by IAF corporal Yogendra Kumar at Jamnagar in Gujarat, told a division bench of Justices A.J. Desai and A.P. Thaker that across India, nine personnel had re-

fused to get vaccinated and they were given show-cause notices. One of them, who did not respond to the notice, was terminated from service, Mr. Vyas told the high court. He, however, did not give the name or any other details of the staffer against whom the action was taken. "Across India, only nine personnel have refused to take the vaccine. All of them were given show cause notice...one did not respond, so in view of the lack of response, his service is already terminated," Mr. Vyas told the court.
