

Investigation into Cambodia job scam points to a Pak link

A HIGH-LEVEL probe by central agencies is learnt to have uncovered a Pakistani link in the Cambodia job scam that duped hundreds of Indians with fake employment offers, leading to their trafficking and exploitation abroad.

The scam came to light in 2024, when over 5,000 Indians were suspected to be trapped in Cambodia after being allegedly deceived with fake job offers and forced into cyber crime activities. Some of them have since been rescued and brought back to India.

"After returning from these scam compounds, a number of victims informed officials of central agencies that they were recruited by Pakistani agents," said a source. During forensic examination, digital footprints, including IP logs from recruitment chats and calls, pointed to operatives in Pakistan, said the source.

"On the basis of their information, forensic analysis of such IP addresses were examined, and they have been traced to servers and handlers based in Pakistan, revealing a coordinated network that preyed on vulnerable job-seekers from places like Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Mumbai, Telangana and Kerala," the source said.

According to the source, the issue was also discussed at the two-day "Anti-Terrorism Conference-2025" here in December.

"This is not just a cyber-fraud racket -- it's a targeted

operation exploiting our youth," said the source, adding that the central agencies, including the CBI and NIA, have widened the net.

After tracking the IP addresses to Pakistan, the central agencies have registered all these IP addresses in the 'suspect registry'. The registry, which was created based on the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal and developed by Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), contains data of 1.4 million cyber criminals linked to financial fraud and various cyber crimes, which has been shared with all banks.

Data shows that with the help of the suspect registry, 5,54,865 accounts in which fraudulent money was received have been frozen, 15,10,800 unique accounts have been identified, and Rs 7980 crore has been saved after around 20 lakh fraudulent transactions were rejected.

An official said cyber scams targeting Indians are mainly run by Chinese operators from high-security compounds in Southeast Asia, where victims of human trafficking, including Indians, are put to work.

According to fresh data compiled by the I4C, Indians have lost over Rs 52,976 crore to various fraud and cheating cases over the past six years. "The Indian economy faces a loss of over Rs 1,000 crore every month to such crimes. Over 20,000 Indians are estimated to be working in these scam compounds situated in South-East Asia," the official said.

Decision, a dossier: How Cong shut door on talk of exiting DMK alliance

THE CONGRESS high command on Saturday moved decisively to shut down speculation about exiting the DMK-led alliance in Tamil Nadu, concluding after a marathon closed-door meeting that the party cannot afford a rupture, politically or electorally, as it looks ahead to the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

The meeting, attended by 42 leaders from the state, not only reaffirmed the centrality of the DMK alliance to Congress's national strategy but also saw the Tamil Nadu leadership formally place before the high command a detailed report cataloguing what it described as a pattern of public dissent and contrarian positioning by party's research cell head Praveen Chakravarty.

The discussion, led by Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge and attended by LoP Rahul Gandhi, made two things clear: the alliance with the DMK will not be disturbed, and internal dissent about the alliance should no longer be aired in public. Sources said Kharge pointedly asked why leaders were speaking out of turn. "What is the need for a high command then?" he is learnt to have asked.

What drove Cong decision
At the outset, Kharge is said to have taken a firm tone, ques-

tionsing why internal differences had spilled into the public domain and warning that such conduct was detrimental to Congress-DMK alliance. Leaders were told decisions with regard to alliances rest with the high command and that contradictory statements — particularly on social media — would no longer be tolerated.

While rejecting the idea of a break-up, leaders from TN laid out a detailed case for why Congress must assert itself more strongly within the alliance. Several leaders said while there is power-sharing in the form of two or three

Cabinet berths was desirable, what mattered more for rebuilding the party at the grassroots was decentralised representation: better accommodation in local body polls, cooperative institutions, welfare boards and even in government advocate appointments. The meeting also took stock of the Congress's shrinking footprint in the Assembly over the past decade: from contesting 63 seats in 2011, down to 41 in 2016, and further down to 25 in 2021, of which it won 18.

The consensus that emerged was that "more seat share means more opportunity" and that the party should seek not less than 39 to 40 seats for Assembly polls. Several leaders pointed out Congress's representation in local

bodies and allied institutions had diminished even as the alliance delivered electoral victories. Cadres, they warned, were increasingly unhappy with the perception of decline.

The most sustained criticism of the DMK alliance came from Tagore and Chakravarty, who argued DMK was not giving the Congress its due and that the party was being treated unfairly within the alliance. Those arguments, however, were sharply countered inside the room.

Former Union minister P Chidambaram, MPs Jothimani and Sasikanth Senthil, and several MLAs spoke strongly in favour of the alliance, underscoring its electoral significance. Chidambaram reminded the meeting that the DMK alliance had delivered "80 to 100% success" for Congress in recent elections and that the last L.S election saw the alliance secure around 46% of votes.

He along with some other leaders also noted the absence of major anti-incumbency factors against the DMK government: no severe law and order issues, no drought or flood crisis, and no visible erosion of public support.

Karti Chidambaram added a political caution of his own. The TVK, Karti is learnt to have said, remains untested, unproven, and inexperienced, adding that the fledgling outfit had not yet demonstrated independent strength.

'Affectionate to even rival parties', senior BJP leader Raj Purohit dies

Former BJP minister and senior party leader Raj K Purohit passed away in a private hospital in Mumbai on Sunday. He was 71 years old.

pursue issues related to Mumbai was amazing. He studied subjects thoroughly."

Terming Purohit's demise as shocking, BJP national general secretary Vinod Tawde posted on X, "We worked together for several decades in Maharashtra. From a Mumbai municipal corporator to an MLA and a minister in the Maharashtra Assembly, my friend Raj Purohit was a popular public representative deeply connected with the people."

A North Indian face of the BJP, Purohit was among prominent leaders representing South Mumbai. The redevelopment of Mumbai complete with infrastructure, basic amenities on the lines of Kashi Vishwanath Corridor or Ujjain's Mahakal was a project he relentlessly pursued with the state government since 2014-15.

In 2019, when the BJP denied him a ticket from Colaba, he was disappointed but it never stopped him from working for the party.

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, in his condolence message from Davos, said, "He was a part of our parivar, friendly, affectionate, always in the forefront for the organisation. A firm and committed leader, Raj Purohit had served as chief whip of the party with absolute dedication."

Leaders across political parties described Purohit as a leader who understood organisational processes and had an excellent grassroots network. Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar said, "His penchant to

serve with absolute dedication."

Senior BJP leader Atul Shah, a long-time friend of Purohit, said, "He proactively worked for the civic elections till the end. I have lost a dear friend. The socio-political void left with his demise will be difficult to fill."

The making of ISLAM: In Malegaon, a new party built on old networks rises to top to run corporation with SP

MALEGAON, ONE of Maharashtra's most politically distinct cities, has once again charted its own course. In the recently concluded municipal Corporation elections, the city delivered a clear verdict in favour of a new political formation, ISLAM, floated by former Congress MLA Shaikh Asif, which emerged as the single-largest party in the 84-member civic body.

ISLAM, short for Indian Secular Largest Assembly of Maharashtra, won 35 seats and, along with its ally Samajwadi Party, which secured five, crossed the halfway mark. The alliance is now set to install its mayor, making Malegaon one of the few cities in the state where power rests outside both the ruling Mahadev and the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi.

A city shaped by minority politics

Muslims make up 11.56% of Maharashtra's population, but in Malegaon, the figure rises to nearly 78%, giving the community a decisive role in the city's politics. Malegaon Central is among the rare Assembly constituencies in the state to have consistently elected a Muslim MLA since Independence.

For decades, politics here revolved around two influential families, that of socialist leader Nihal Ahmed, who represented Malegaon five times as a Janata Dal MLA, and Shaikh Rasheed, the late Congress leader who won the seat twice. Control of civic and Assembly politics alternated between these families, even as party loyalties shifted.

That balance began to change after the 2006 Malegaon blasts, when a cleric, Mufti Ismail, entered electoral

politics. Winning first without the backing of an established party in 2009, Mufti Ismail gradually built a base through his people's platform, Kaumi Mahaz, and went on to win the Malegaon Central seat for the All India Majlis e Ittehadul Muslimeen in 2019.

Why Shaikh Asif floated ISLAM

Shaikh Asif, son of the late Shaikh Rasheed, entered the Assembly in 2014 on a Congress ticket after serving as Malegaon's mayor. In 2022, he quit the Congress, citing differences with the state leadership, and briefly aligned with the undivided Nationalist Congress Party before moving away following the split.

Ahead of the Assembly elections in 2024, Asif launched ISLAM, positioning it as a response to what he described as repeated remarks targeting Islam in public discourse. "Since the BJP came to power, there has been a constant attack on Islam through statements. This party has been formed to respond to that," he said while announcing the outfit.

Despite the attention the new party drew, Asif failed to unseat Mufti Ismail in the Assembly elections. Another con-

tender, Shan e Hind, daughter of Nihal Ahmed and now with the Samajwadi Party (SP), polled around 9,000 votes.

Civic polls and a pragmatic alliance

Malegaon's politics has long been marked by pragmatic alliances, often cutting across ideological lines. In 2017, the local Congress unit even backed the Shiv Sena for the mayor's post. Drawing on this tradition, Asif allied with the SP, once a rival linked to the Nihal Ahmed family, for the civic polls. The strategy paid off handsomely. ISLAM's 35 seats and the SP's five gave the alliance 40 seats, short of an absolute majority but enough to lead the corporation with outside support.

The AIMIM finished with 21 seats, the Shiv Sena 18, and the BJP just two. With indications that the Congress's three corporators may back Asif,

ISLAM is poised to control the majority.

"We are a secular front which has won 40 seats. We are a secular party and three of our corporators are Hindus. We are committed to working for all communities and all sections of society," Asif said.

New party and familiar faces

While ISLAM's rise has drawn attention across the state, local observers say it represents continuity as much as change. Even the previous Malegaon Municipal Corporation was dominated by Asif's family, with his father and mother serving as the last two mayors in the outgoing body.

"This is not really a new political force. These are established political families who know the city well. It is more a case of old players in a new political outfit," a local activist said.
