TDP netas booked for attacking woman, kin

VIJAYAWADA. Opposition Telugu Desam Party (TDP) leaders from Vijayawada, Vaddadi Ramana and his brother Vaddadi Naresh, landed in soup for allegedly attacking a woman and her family members on Sunday. The Kothapet police registered a case of attempt to murder among other charges against the duo.

According to Kothapet Circle Inspector A Subramanyam, the main accused Naresh had been allegedly harassing the woman (name withheld) to accept his sexual advances and misbehaving with her in public. Unable to bear his torment, the woman spoke to her family members, who complained about Naresh's behaviour to his brother Vaddadi Ramana. "Ramana warned Naresh for his behaviour and asked him not to trouble others. Feeling insulted, Naresh along with six others attacked the family next day and injured them severely. Based on a complaint, a case was registered. Later, the accused was produced in the court," said Subramanyam.

On learning about the incident, State Mahila commission chairperson Vasireddy Padma met the victim of sexual harassment and her family members and assured them justice on Monday.

Court sentences MLA Olekar, sons, officials in corruption case

BENGALURU. A Special Court sentenced former minister and Haveri BJP MLA Nehru C Olekar, his two sons and five serving and retired officials to simple imprisonment for two years, and imposed a fine of Rs 2,000 each, on Monday. It was alleged that Nehru Olekar, accused No.1, in collusion with his sons, accused No.2 and 3, and the officials bagged all government contracts without allowing any other individual to secure them, either by threat or other means.

Convicting and sentencing Olekar for criminal misconduct under Section 13(1) (d) read with Section 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, the court sentenced his sons -- Manjunath N Olekar and Devaraj N Olekar -- under Section 198, 409, 420 of IPC, and the other accused to two years' simple imprisonment and a fine of Rs 2,000 each for

offences punishable under Section 197 (issue of false certificate), 409 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating and dishonesty) and 13(a)(d) read with Section 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

The five officials are HK Rudrappa, deputy director (retired), Commerce and Industries department, HK Kallappa, assistant

executive engineer (retired), Public Works Department, Shivakumar Puttaiah Kamadod, second division clerk, Shiggaon Town Municipality, PS Chandramohan, assistant executive engineer (retired), PWD, and K Krishna Naik, assistant engineer.

"The prosecution has proved the allegation that Manjunath Olekar procured false work done certificate for work worth Rs 1.50 crore and Rs 2.15 crore, through the influence of his father Nehru Olekar, who was MLA at the time of issue of certificates," said Judge B Jayantha Kumar.

"Perusal of documents shows that the accused Devaraj Olekar has furnished a work done certificate for State Financial Corporations (SFC) package amounting to Rs 20 lakh and a

document shows the SFC package work was allotted to HM Bhovi for Rs 19 lakh. So Devaraj has not carried out work under the SFC package. As per the false certificate, work was allotted through an order dated July 28, 2009, amounting to Rs 1.50 crore, for metalling and asphaltting the road which connects Nehrunagar in Nagendranamatti and Karadigudda Road, and bears the signatures of other accused who knowing it to be false, has certified the same as genuine," the court noted, releasing the accused persons on bail. Noting that all substantive sentences of imprisonment shall run concurrently, Judge Jayantha Kumar ordered Nehru Olekar to pay a total fine of Rs 2,000 and his two sons Rs 6,000 each, and the other four accused to pay Rs 8,000 each.

A total of Rs 10,000 of the total fine amount shall be paid to complainant Shashidhar Mahadevappa Hallikeri towards compensation, as he filed a private complaint and spent the amount for collecting some documents.

Tiger attack deaths: 'Suspend forest officials'

BENGALURU. After the deaths of two relatives in a tiger attack in south Kodagu, MLAs cutting across party lines demanded action against forest department officials for failing to capture the tiger. The legislators demanded that government officials concerned be suspended.

Virajpet MLA KG Bopaiah raised the issue during Zero Hour on Monday, and said, "Once these tigers get used to eating human flesh, they start entering human habitats often." Bopaiah said the incident shows how irresponsible the forest department officials are, and demanded they be suspended. Congress MLA HP Manjunath from Hunsur Assembly constituency said, "This tiger issue has been prowling in our constituency. After such incidents, we give compensation, but don't think what happens to the families." He also said there has been another death in the family from shock after hearing the news of these two deaths.

Kodagu tiger strikes again, kills two kin in 15 hours

MADIKERI. Barely 15 hours after a youth, Chetan (18) was killed by a tiger, his relative Raju (65) was fatally attacked by the same tiger in south Kodagu, sending shockwaves across the region. Raju had come to attend Chetan's funeral when the incident took place. Raju, a native of Panchavalli in Hunsur, arrived in K Badaga village on Sunday evening after Chetan was killed by the tiger at Churikadu estate limits in the village. Raju attended the final rites of Chetan at the estate premises and was staying with his son Rajesh, who is an estate labourer working at the private estate. Raju was attacked by the big cat when he came out of the house in the estate to answer nature's call around 7.30 am on Monday. As soon as he stepped on the verandah of the house, he was ambushed by the tiger. The tiger grabbed Raju and took him away in front of a helpless Rajesh. Rajesh and a few other relatives took knives and swords and ran behind the tiger, which fled from the spot due to the commotion, leaving behind Raju's body.

On Sunday evening, Chetan was also killed in a similar attack by the same tiger at the same spot. Both deceased belong to the Jenukuruba community.

Orissa High Court orders restoration of cremation ground at Gop

CUTTACK. THE Orissa High Court has ordered restoration of 'smanan' (cremation ground) land to its original area of 1.32 acre at Gop in Puri district instead of going ahead with alienation of part of it in favour of state Commerce and Transport department to construct a bus stand-cum-market complex. The division bench of Justice Arindam Sinha and Justice Sanjay Kumar Mishra further directed maintaining of status quo on the entire 1.32 acre 'smanan' land till the restoration process is completed.

The court issued the direction on a petition filed by Prabodha Kumar Senapati and nine other residents of the area. Advocate Suryakanta Dash submitted arguments on behalf of the petitioners. "It transpires that in the name of development the government is seeking to alienate vacant land earmarked for communal purpose citing judgment of the Supreme Court and

reporting compliance of exchange but, the land offered in exchange was encumbered and occupied. As a result, land for communal purpose is therefore disappearing," the bench observed in its February 10 order. The grievance of the petitioners was that the government had taken away part of land earmarked for the 'smanan' and initiated process of alienation of the land in favour of State Commerce and Transport department, to construct a bus stand-cum-market complex. In the

process the cremation ground stood reduced to area below one acre from original 1.32 acre.

The tehsildar of Gop on his part claimed that the gram panchayat by a resolution had stated that the land has completely lost its characteristics. It is not being used as 'smanan' place since last 100 years and there is no sign of any cremation structure existing over it. The tehsildar had also claimed that for local development, the panchayat had not raised objection against de-reserving the land for eventual alienation in favour of Road Transport and Commerce department. However, the bench observed, "We have not been shown any contemporaneous or immediately preceding evidence, for the tehsildar to have found that the 'smanan' land has lost its character since long and not been used for the purpose."

Give shoot at sight order, say villagers

Enraged villagers gathered in large numbers and protested against the forest department. They demanded that shoot-at-sight order. Meanwhile, Virajpet MLA KG Bopaiah alleged in the Assembly that foresters were absent at night and arrived only after the incidents. Kodagu CCF, BN Murthy visited the spot and is camping in the region. A team of 150 foresters have been deployed to capture the tiger and were given 20 weapons and 12 vehicles.

"Two patrol teams have been formed. The tiger was spotted twice near the estate," he said. Meanwhile, Rs 5 lakh compensation has been handed over to the victim's kin. The foresters assured to release Rs 15 lakh each as total compensation.

VIJAYAWADA. Accusing Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy of deploying thousands of police personnel to create obstacles to his padayatra 'Yuva Galam', TDP general secretary Nara Lokesh said the government can only snatch away the microphone from him, not his voice. Addressing a public meeting at Chinna Rajakuppam in Nagari constituency on Monday, Lokesh said besides deploying 1,000 police personnel, Jagan has appointed 20 SIs, 10 CIs and six DSP to stop his padayatra. Stating that the government filed 20 police cases against him for raising voice on people's issues, the TDP leader asserted that he will not be discouraged and will continue to take up his fight, even if the Chief Minister files 400 cases against him.

Earlier, Communist Party of India (CPI) Nagari Assembly segment in-charge Kodandaiah met Lokesh at Chinna Rajakuppam and elaborated on the issues the locals were facing due to sand and gravel mafia. Also, the lands of the SCs and STs were being forcibly acquired by the Andhra Pradesh Industrial and Infrastructure Corporation (APIIC) in the name of development, the CPI leader told Lokesh. Responding to the CPI leader's request, Lokesh said he will try to put an end to the sand and gravel mafia, once the TDP comes to power. "Except chasing the industries out of the State, the Chief Minister does not have even basic knowledge about industrialisation," the TDP leader claimed.
