Face-ID tech at CSMT to help curb sex crimes

The home ministry plans to set up artificial intelligence-based facial recognition systems at 7 major railway stations, including CSMT, in a bid to curb crimes against women, it has told Supreme Court. 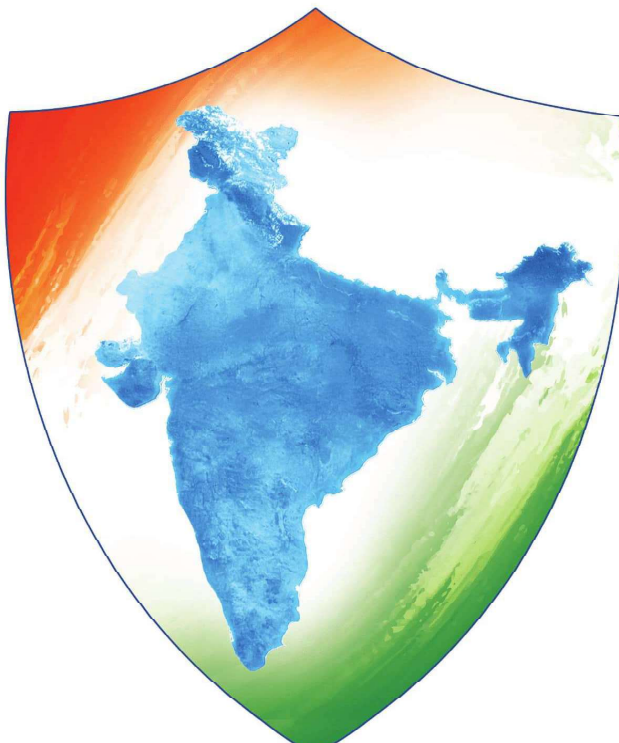
notice, thus crossing the threshold to start the process in LS, reports Akhilesh Singh.

mittee (BAC), a group of parliamentarians that finalises agenda in both Houses, to decide when the motion will be moved. "I can't comment on a business in terms of priority because till the matter is passed by BAC with the chair's approval, it's difficult for me to make an announcement," he said when asked if the motion may be brought in the first week of the session.

Sources said Congress was asked to send signatures of 40 MPs, and it has done so.
