LU planetarium to be revamped soon, says VC

LUCKNOW : A major revamp of the city's oldest planetarium - situated on the Lucknow University (LU) campus - is expected by the end of this year, said JP Saini, vice-chancellor, LU. This followed Saini's visit to the planetarium housed in the department of mathematics and astronomy on Thursday. In a report dated December 13, 2025, HT had highlighted the crumbling state of the planetarium and central mess.

"The Planetarium of Lucknow was established in 1946. I have asked the department to prepare a detailed report keeping in view the requirements of modern equipment. A major revamp of the planetarium will be carried out," said Saini.

He also said that the university is planning to have a total of 5000+ research scholars by the end of the year. "We are planning to conduct PhD admission twice a year and decentralise PhD admissions to the department. The number of PhD seats under faculty members may be increased under special circumstances," he added. He stressed the need to constitute a committee to monitor research facilities in colleges and to set up research centres in neighbouring districts and share equipment and facilities. He said that LU will adopt the Delhi University model of research supervision for college teachers. He also visited the departmental library of the department of mathematics and astronomy and discussed ways to increase access to e-journals, mathematical databases.

He later motivated research scholars to submit their dissertations soon. He also shared the possibility of granting fellowship to non-JRF PhD students, while assuring all faculty members that their promotion process will be done soon under Career Advancement Scheme and direct recruitment will be done against the vacant posts. Besides, he highlighted that this year the annual convocation will be a two-day affair, followed by the Golden Pride Dinner.

Bank Mitra fraud leaves depositors in distress

LUCKNOW : "Everything is gone," said Ram Nareish, a cycle mechanic from Nareish, who had saved ₹7.8 lakh over the years for the marriages of his three daughters.

He said he managed to arrange his eldest daughter's wedding last November, but when he visited the bank to encash a fixed deposit for his second daughter's marriage scheduled for February 18, he was told the account had no balance. "I felt dizzy. We had to postpone the wedding. We trusted the bank," he said.

The alleged fraud at the Bank of Baroda branch located at the Shakuntala Misra University campus has affected residents of Para, Budheshwar, Kakori and nearby areas, triggering panic among account holders.

"My father sold land for my future," said Janaki, a resident of Salempur Patana. She said ₹33.35 lakh was transferred to her account through RTGS around two-and-a-half years ago, and ₹20 lakh was placed in a fixed deposit. "When I went to withdraw ₹6,000 last week, they told me only ₹46,000 was left," she said.

Another woman said her account balance showed just ₹1,200 despite regular cash deposits and receipts. "There was no message, no OTP I kept depositing money, believing it was safe," she said.

The case has also spread fear among students. "If my scholarship money disappears, my studies will stop," said Yamadav, a pharmacy student at Shakuntala Misra University.

Victims have alleged staff collusion, claiming money from at least 17 accounts was transferred to a single account in the name of Mohan, amounting to nearly ₹1 crore. They alleged that bank staff did not share details despite repeated requests. Protests were held at the branch on January 14 and again on Wednesday, during which the accused "Bank Mitra" was allegedly present.

Para police have arrested Shiva Rao, a Bank Mitra, and his alleged accomplice Dilip Kumar, a former security guard at the bank's ATM booth. Police said ₹2.38 lakh in cash, mobile phones and key banking documents were recovered. Investigators said Shiva allegedly issued fake FD receipts to customers from 2020, while Dilip allegedly assisted in preparing forged documents and facilitating transactions.

Police said crucial evidence stored in Shiva's mobile phone was allegedly destroyed. Investigators have noted that four branch managers were posted at the bank since 2020 and all will be questioned to fix accountability. DCP West Vishvajet Srivastava said a detailed investigation is underway.

"Any bank employee is found involved, strict action will follow," he said.

21 EMT TRAINEES FALL ILL AFTER DINNER AT LUCKNOW HOSTEL

LUCKNOW : At least 21 trainee emergency medical technicians (EMTs) of the 108 ambulance service fell ill after consuming dinner that included lentils, rice, potato curry and roti at a private college hostel in the Barawan Kala area of Lucknow on Wednesday night.

Around 150 people had taken the meal. Health department officials said as the condition of the trainees deteriorated, 18 were rushed to Balrampur Hospital, while three others were admitted to Thakurganj TB and Joint Hospital.

Dr Sarvesh Singh, emergency medical officer on duty at Balrampur Hospital, said the 18 trainees were admitted to the emergency ward. Dr Himanshu Chaturvedi, CMS, Balrampur Hospital, said the condition of all the admitted students was stable and they were under continuous medical observation. At Thakurganj TB and Joint Hospital, CMS Dr SP Singh said three trainees were admitted on Thursday morning. Of them, two were discharged after treatment, while one remained admitted and was stable. However, no official statement had been issued by the 108 ambulance service authorities till late Thursday.

₹1.41-CR PMLA CASE: COURT TAKES NOTE OF OF ED CHARGE SHEET

LUCKNOW : The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has achieved a major procedural breakthrough in its money laundering probe against Yogesh Kumar Tiwari, with a special court in Lucknow taking cognisance of the prosecution complaint filed under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002.

Tiwari posed as a prominent businessman and property dealer in Prayagraj to lure victims, promising high returns before fraudulently acquiring their properties and selling them to third parties.

According to an official press release issued on Thursday, the ED's Allahabad sub-zonal office had filed the prosecution complaint on September 29, 2025, before the Special Court (CBI), West, Lucknow. The court took cognisance of the case on Wednesday, formally making Tiwari as an accused.

The ED initiated its investigation on the basis of an FIR registered by the UP Police at Jhansi police station in Prayagraj under various sections of the IPC, 1860, including cheating, forgery, criminal breach of trust and criminal intimidation.

The probe revealed that the accused allegedly orchestrated a deliberate scheme to defraud the complainant by inducing him to transfer multiple immovable properties on false assurances of setting up development projects and offering future financial benefits.

The ED has identified proceeds of crime worth approximately ₹1.41 cr in the case.
