Rewari Journalist Rahul Dev Sharma Joins Hindi Advisory Committee

Senior journalist Rahul Dev Sharma has been nominated as a member of the Hindi Advisory Committee of the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Government of India.

Criminals have no place in Haryana; rule of law will prevail: CM Saini

Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Tuesday reiterated that his government is committed to a zero-tolerance policy towards crime, declaring that in the state it is the rule of law that will prevail, not the influence or status of criminals.

Responding to an adjournment motion on law and order moved by the opposition in the Assembly, Saini said no offender, regardless of social standing or political connections, will be spared.

The Chief Minister said the decline in both the number and rate of major crimes in Haryana is a direct outcome of his firm stance on law enforcement. He pointed out that unlike the situation prior to 2014, citizens now face no difficulty in registering FIRs and the police act promptly against offenders.

Countering the opposition, which displayed placards of Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao, Saini accused the Congress of failing women's safety during its tenure between 2004 and 2014. He said that incidents of rape had tripled in that period, rising from 886 cases in 2004 to 1,174 in 2014. He termed the Congress government 'insensitive', noting that it opened only one woman's police station in

Khanpur Kalan during its ten years in power.

Saini highlighted the measures taken by the present government to improve women's security, including the establishment of 33 all-women police stations, integration of the women's helpline number 1091 with Dial-112, the launch of the Durga Shakti mobile app, and deployment of the Durga Shakti Rapid Action Force with 46 vehicles connected to the emergency network. He also underlined the formation of the Durga Battalion in Rohtak, which has 540 women personnel.

Drawing a comparison between past and present responses to crime, the Chief Minister cited a 2008 case in Rohtak in which a woman, allegedly raped by five police-

men, struggled in vain for justice and eventually died by suicide after consulting poison. The FIR in that case, he said, was registered only after persistent media coverage. In contrast, he pointed to the Yamunanagar case of September 2024, where a minor was raped and murdered. The accused was arrested within 24 hours, and in just eight months, the court sentenced him to death. This, he said, was possible under new criminal laws brought in by the Union government.

Saini said several recent cases have resulted in sentences ranging from 20 years to life imprisonment, or even the death penalty, within seven to eight months. This, he said, is proof that the "double-engine government" is cracking down on criminals effectively.

In a separate newspaper report, Saini cited the 2011 Kalanur grain market murder case involving a former INLD MLA, who fortified his village with armed supporters to evade arrest. He also referred to the 2012 Rohtak Anna Ghor orphanage scandal, in which over 120 girls were rescued and nine accused were later convicted by a CBI court in 2018. He further mentioned a 2008 newspaper report that had documented misconduct, bribery, and crimes by police officials between 1996 and 2008.

Presenting figures, the Chief Minister said murder cases in the state had reduced from 1,106 in 2014 to 965 in 2024, a 12 percent decline over the decade. He said that since January 1 this year, Haryana Police have killed 13 notorious criminals and injured 157 in 110 encounters. About 75 percent of cybercrimes, he added, originate from outside the state, but strict action has forced many gangsters to flee abroad. Since July 2024, five gangsters have been arrested overseas, and in the last five years, nine such criminals have been extradited.

Saini also warned against the glorification of criminals on social media, saying that projecting gangsters as heroes misleads the youth and undermines the efforts of the police. He urged the media not to publish their names or photographs.

The Chief Minister concluded by saying that ensuring the safety of every citizen and his utmost duty, one he has never shirked and never will. He also assured that Saini praised Speaker Harvinder Kalyan for conducting Assembly proceedings with composure and impartiality. Despite repeated provocations from the opposition, he said, the Speaker has ensured that the House functions with dignity and balance, without the need to name or expel any member. He described Kalyan's conduct as a reflection of democratic values, tolerance, and efficiency.

Minister, MLA Distribute Relief in Flood-Hit Fazilka Villages

Chandigarh/Fazilka Punjab Cabinet Minister Dr. Baljit Kaur and Fazilka MLA Narinder Pal Singh Sawra on Sunday reached the flood-affected villages of Teja Ruhela and Chakk Ruhela, where they handed over relief material, including cattle feed to families struggling in the rising waters.

Dr. Baljit Kaur said that with nearly 1.7 lakh cuses of water released from Harikae Headworks, the Sutlej Creek is expected to swell further by tomorrow, posing additional risk to low-lying areas. She appealed to residents to shift women, children, and elderly people to safer places without delay.

The Minister added that on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, relief camps have been set up across the district, and teams from Health, Animal Husbandry, Water Supply & Sanitation, and Revenue Departments are stationed in villages to assist residents. Special arrangements are also being made to provide nutrition and medical support to pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children.

MLA Narinder Pal Singh Sawra assured that the government is ensuring every possible help for the affected population. He said ration kits, cattle feed, and green fodder are being distributed on priority, while the District Flood Control Room remains active and can be contacted at 01638-262153 for assistance. Earlier, Dr. Kaur chaired a review meeting with district officers at the District Administrative Complex, directing them to work round-the-clock to ensure timely relief. Among those present during the visit were Additional Deputy Commissioner (General) Dr. Mandeep Kaur, SDM Virpal Kaur, DSP Avishank Chander, and Tehsildar Jaspreet Singh.

CM Dhama announces Rs 5 lakh relief package for disaster-hit families in Pauri

Dehradun Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhama on Tuesday announced a relief package for disaster-affected people in Pauri district.

As part of the package, Rs 5 lakh each will be given to the families of the deceased and to those whose houses have been completely damaged due to the recent disaster.

The chief minister said that, in addition to the amount sanctioned under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) norms, the remaining financial assistance will be provided from the Chief Minister's discretionary fund.

He directed the administration to take immediate action and

New Delhi Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini chose the bicycle over a car this morning, leading a symbolic ride from the MLA Hostel to the Vidhan Sabha. The initiative, organized by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, was aimed at promoting a drug-free lifestyle while also underlining the importance of fitness and environmental protection.

Accompanying the Chief Minister on the ride were Speaker Harvinder Kalyan, several cabinet ministers, and a number of MLAs, all joining in to lend weight to the campaign. The unusual yet impactful sight of elected representatives cycling to-

gether sent out a strong message of collective responsibility toward social change.

well-being. He recalled Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call for a "Fit India, Healthy India" and said yoga, exercise, and outdoor activity are essential to staying healthy and productive. "Exercise keeps a person active and alert," he remarked, adding that fitness is closely tied to the strength of society.

Turning to the focus of the event, the Chief Minister made an impassioned appeal to the youth of Haryana to stay away from drugs. He called them the country's greatest asset, but warned that addiction destroys not only individual health but also families and society at large, eventually leading to poverty and disease.

Punjab to study Tamil Nadu's breakfast scheme for schools: CM Bhagwant Mann

Chennai Komal Ramola Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Tuesday said his government will examine the possibility of introducing a school breakfast scheme in the state on the lines of Tamil Nadu's Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme.

Mann was in Chennai as the Chief Guest for the launch of the scheme's expansion to urban government-aided schools. Calling it a proud moment to be part of the event, he paid tribute to former Chief Minister M. Karunanidhi and praised Chief Minister M.K. Stalin for carrying forward his father's legacy of social welfare and state rights.

Thanking the Tamil Nadu government and people for the invitation, Mann said the scheme had already benefited

over 1.7 million children in rural schools since its launch in September 2022, and its urban expansion marks another milestone. He noted that Punjab's cabinet would now deliberate on the feasibility of implementing a similar program

to improve nutrition and learning outcomes among children. Highlighting the impact in Tamil Nadu, Mann said it had improved attendance, enhanced learning, reduced malnutrition, and lowered

disease rates among primary school students. "Such welfare initiatives are the need of the hour, especially for underprivileged communities," he said, adding that the Aam Aadmi Party has consistently prioritized education and health-care.

Turning to Punjab, Mann said government schools were being upgraded into Schools of Eminence and had topped the National Achievement Survey, surpassing Kerala. He pointed out that 848 government school students cleared NIEFT this year, 265 qualified for JEE Mains, and 45 cracked JEE Advanced. Special buses for girls and international training for principals and teachers, he added, are part of his government's effort to raise educational standards.
