NDMC approves FSSAI, GST registrations as deemed licences

The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) on Wednesday approved a landmark reform to simplify licencing norms by treating FSSAI and GST registrations as "deemed licences" under the NDMC Act. The change comes as a major relief for traders, shopkeepers and small businesses operating in the NDMC area. The decision, cleared at the NDMC Council meeting, is expected to reduce compliance burden, cut red tape and end long-standing confusion faced by thousands of establishments over multiple municipal licences.

Under the new policy, businesses holding valid FSSAI registration or GST registration, along with licences issued under the Delhi Shops

and Establishments Act, will no longer be required to obtain separate Health Trade or General Trade Licences from NDMC. Officials clarified that while separate licences will not be mandatory, NDMC will continue inspections to ensure hygiene, sanitation and public health standards are maintained. The deemed licence provision, however, will not apply to cases already pending before courts, which will continue to be governed by judicial orders.

NDMC Vice Chairperson Kuljeet Singh Chahal said the move was aimed at citizen-centric governance in line with the "Viksit Bharat @2047" vision. "This reform will directly benefit ordinary traders and small businesses by simplifying procedures while maintaining public safety through regular inspections," he said.

Another key decision was the extension of cashless medical facilities to all contractual employees of NDMC and their dependents under the Liberalised Medical Health Scheme. Chahal said this was possibly the first instance in the country where contractual staff of a Government body were being given comprehensive, cashless healthcare cover.

Around 878 contractual employees are currently working with NDMC, many of whom have served continuously for 12 to 25 years in roles such as data entry operators, junior engineers, nurses, pharmacists, sanitary inspectors and helpers. With the approval, both employees and their dependents will now have access to quality medical treatment, significantly improving their health security.



The Council also approved an enhancement of financial assistance for regular SC/ST employees under the Hitkari Nidhi Yojana. The assistance for the marriage of each child has been increased from ₹50,000 to ₹75,000, for up to two children. Financial aid in case of the death of an employee has also been raised to ₹75,000.

The Council meeting, presided over by Delhi Minister Parvash Sahib Singh Verma, was attended by

NDMC Chairperson Keshav Chandra, New Delhi MP Bansuri Swaraj and other Council members. A wide range of proposals covering health, housing, electricity, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and road infrastructure were approved.

On the health front, NDMC cleared the proposal to levy minimal charges for OPD registration and dental procedures at its Dental Care Clinic at Palika Health Complex, aligning rates with CGHS, AIIMS, Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences and Jamia Millia Islamia. However, the council clarifies that the NDMC employee registration in OPD will remain free of cost.

For employees, the Council approved revised recruitment rules for multiple posts, including bacteriologists, laboratory technicians, dental assis-

tants, law officers, linemen, special educators and medical officers. Amendments to NDMC Pension Fund Regulations, 2023, were also moved forward, with a proposal sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs.

Major infrastructure decisions were also taken. NDMC approved the construction of 160 Type-III staff flats at Pushp Vihar, Saket, at a revised cost of ₹105.90 crore. Significant investments were cleared to modernise electricity infrastructure, including replacement of ageing 33 kV and 66 kV switchgears, laying of new 11 kV cables, and procurement of 50 MW of renewable power through SECI to meet future demand.

In the water sector, approvals were granted for a new water supply control room at Old RK Ashram Marg,

replacement of old pipelines at Pandara Road, installation of smart water meters and misting systems on major roads to control dust and pollution.

The Council also cleared multiple sanitation and sewerage projects, including rehabilitation and replacement of decades-old sewer lines to prevent collapses and improve public health. Large-scale road resurfacing works using modern hot and cold mix technology were approved across key NDMC roads.

Chahal said the decisions taken reflect NDMC's push towards future-ready infrastructure, simplified governance and improved civic services. "These reforms are meant to directly touch the lives of ordinary citizens by making services easier, safer and more reliable," he said.

SGPC meets DCP, seeks action against Atishi

A delegation of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) on Wednesday met Delhi Police Commissioner Satish Golchha and submitted a complaint demanding registration of a case against AAP leader Atishi over her alleged remark against Sikh Gurus. The delegation met Golchha at the Delhi Police headquarters.



"Highly objectionable words were spoken against the Sikh Gurus by Atishi Marlena, the Leader of Opposition in Delhi Vidhan Sabha, on January 6," the delegation said in its complaint. Vidhan Sabha Speaker Vijender Gupta has released the transcript of the proceedings, according to which Atishi has "disrespected the revered Sikh Gurus", it said.

Reacting to this, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) pointed out while the Delhi Police found time to meet a delegation of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC), it has consistently denied time to discuss the complete collapse of law and order in the national capital, despite repeated requests from AAP MLAs. The party said that as murders, shootings and extortion rackets spiral out of control across Delhi, the police leadership has remained unresponsive to elected

representatives raising urgent public safety concerns.

Citing the transcript, the complaint by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) said the religious sentiments of the Sikh community worldwide have been seriously hurt by the "highly objectionable utterance" of Atishi.

The leader of the Opposition has refuted the charge, saying a video clip of her shared on social media had been tampered with by the BJP. The AAP-ruled Punjab has registered an FIR based on a forensic examination conducted in the State that termed the video clip "doctored".

The SGPC delegation stated in its complaint that the former Delhi Chief Minister has not shown regret over the incident and held her "fully accountable and responsible" for hurting the sentiments of the Sikh community.

Governor inaugurates fountains at Dwarka, Aarambh library at Vikaspuri

In a major boost to the urban aesthetics and beautification of Dwarka Sub-City, Delhi Lt Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena on Wednesday inaugurated state-of-the-art column fountains at prominent road junctions at the Sector 6/7 and Sector 5/6 crossings in Dwarka. The Lt Governor also inaugurated the 'Aarambh Library' at Vikaspuri — the fifth in the series under the Aarambh initiative in around a year.

The project, executed by the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), is part of the Lt Governor's ongoing mission to transform Dwarka into a world-class residential and commercial hub with

enhanced green spaces and urban landmarks.

"We are committed towards providing holistic development of the national capital to address Delhi's growing urban requirements and planning aligned to the needs of the people of Delhi while making sustained efforts to make Dwarka Sub-City cleaner and greener, provide essential amenities, and enhance its overall aesthetics," he said.

Palam MLA Kuldeep Solanki, Matiala MLA Sandeep Sehrawat, Vice Chairman DDA N Saravana Kumar along with other DDA officials were present on the occasion.

The newly inaugurated column fountains combine contemporary design with environmental sensitivity.



Rising 2.8 metres high and set within a 4.5-metre-diameter sandstone tub crafted from Teak and Rainbow sandstone, the fountains feature sleek column structures that serve as striking visual landmarks during the day.

As night falls, dynamic LED illumination transforms the installations into vibrant focal

points, enhancing the overall streetscape. Complemented by thoughtfully developed floral landscaping, the water features not only elevate the aesthetic appeal of the junctions but also contribute to cooling the surrounding micro-environment, offering a refreshing experience for commuters and residents alike.

The Dwarka Golf Course has emerged as a major asset for nurturing budding golf talent, while the centre of excellence in sports is aimed at nurturing sporting talent and promoting a healthy lifestyle.

In addition, several new projects are currently under development to further enhance Dwarka's appeal. These include the upcoming Bharat Vandana Park, envisioned as a major cultural and recreational destination.

The Lt Governor also inaugurated the 'Aarambh Library' at Vikaspuri — the fifth in the series under the Aarambh initiative in around a year. Developed by the Delhi Development Authority, the library aims to provide students, particularly in West

Delhi, with a dedicated and affordable environment for focused learning. The library is equipped with modular study tables with integrated power points, high-speed internet connectivity, secure lockers, CCTV surveillance, air-conditioned and well-lit interiors, and separate wash-room facilities for male and female students.

An accessible toilet has also been provided. To support extended study hours, 'Café Vardaan' has been introduced within the premises to provide students with light refreshments. This 24x7 Aarambh Library is designed to cater to students, researchers, and lifelong learners, offering a well-equipped and student-friendly environment.

Parking fees to double during GRAP III, IV

Aiming to minimise menace of air pollution in the national Capital, the Delhi Government has decided to increase parking fees.

According to a new notification from the Environment Department, parking fees across the city will double whenever the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) reaches Phase III (Severe) or Phase IV (Very Severe).

The move is part of the city's efforts to discourage vehicle use during days of high pollution. By increasing parking charges, authorities aim to reduce traffic congestion and limit vehicular emissions, which are major contributors to Delhi's worsening air quality, sources said.

This comes a day after the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) on Tuesday announced that



GRAP-4 restrictions have been withdrawn in Delhi-NCR after a slight improvement in air quality. Authorities said the decision was taken as pollution levels showed a downward trend compared to the past few days.

Govt celebrates Statehood days

The Delhi Government on Wednesday organised a grand celebration of the Statehood Days of Manipur, Meghalaya and Tripura at the Delhi Secretariat.
