Irular family of 10 rescued from bonded labour in Vikravandi

Officials said the family had borrowed ₹50,000 from the kiln owner two years ago and were made to work even after repaying it

AN Irular tribal family of 10, including four children, was rescued from bonded labour at a private brick kiln in Kalinga-malai village near Vikravandi on Tuesday evening. Following the rescue, Villupuram Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO)

Murugesan issued Release Certificates and disbursed financial assistance of ₹30,000 to each member of the family on Wednesday.

According to sources, the National Adivasi Solidarity Council (NASC) had alerted senior officials earlier this week after receiving information about the family's plight.

A field-level verification by the council confirmed the presence of bonded labourers at the site.

Acting swiftly, the matter was escalated to the Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Justice Jaichandran. Subsequently, a co-ordinating team comprising the RDO, District Labour Welfare

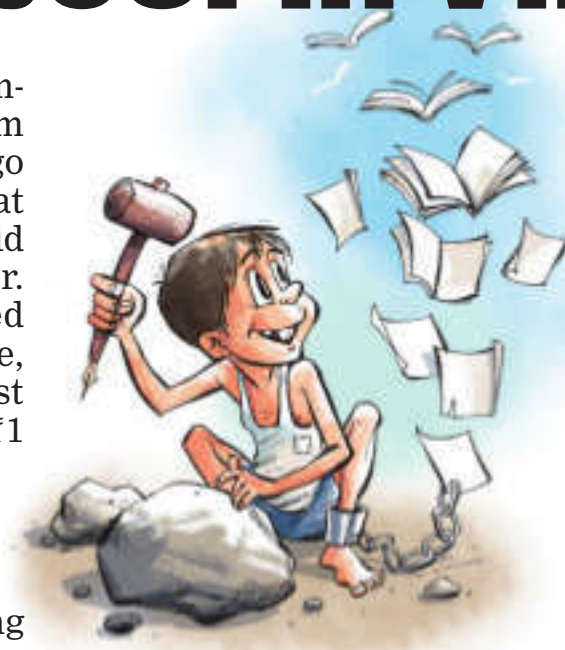
Officer, Vikravandi Tahsildar, and personnel from Kandamangalam police station conducted a late-night operation on Tuesday to rescue the family. The team also lodged a complaint with the police against the kiln owner, identified as K Palani.

Official sources said the family had borrowed ₹50,000 from the kiln owner two years ago and had continued working at the kiln despite having repaid the amount through labour. The owner allegedly forced them to remain in bondage, claiming compounded interest had pushed the debt to ₹1 lakh.

Speaking to *TNIE*, NASC Secretary K Krishnan said, “We received a tip-off from a source, and it was heartening



to witness the swift convergence of various government departments — including the judiciary, revenue, and police — working together to secure the family's release within 24 hours. This shows that if the system truly works for the marginalised, it can bring light into many lives.”

The rescued family has since been sent back to their native village in Cuddalore. However, the kiln owner is yet to be remanded, officials said.

HC junks plea to ban online film review, cites free speech

THE Madras High Court has held that it can't prohibit online movie reviews as it will amount to curbing the fundamental right to free speech and expression.

Dismissing the petition filed by Tamil Nadu Active Film Producers' Association seeking prohibition of online movie reviews for three days from the date of release, Justice N Anand Venkatesh on Thursday said such an order cannot be issued by the court as it is unsustainable.

He also remarked that if any such relief, as sought by the pe-

tioners, is granted, it will amount to curbing the right to free speech and expression which is a fundamental right enshrined in the Constitution, and review of the movies on social media is such a fundamental right.

Justice Venkatesh noted that even judges are not spared from criticism on social media.

In the age of fast-growing social media, none could be possibly prevented from posting negative reviews on movies, he said, adding, however, the people shall not let them be carried away by the online reviews on social media.

Youth killed in country bomb attack

A 25-year-old man was killed after a gang of three flung a country bomb at him at Perambakkam near Mappedu in Tiruvallur on Wednesday night. The gang also attacked him with sickles to make sure he was dead, according to the police.

The victim was identified as Mukesh, who works as a LPG cylinder delivery agent. His friends, Deepan and Javid, who were chatting with him at the spot, were also injured in the attack and are currently undergoing treatment at a government hospital.

According to police sources, the gang hurled two country bombs at the trio, one of which exploded and killed Mukesh on the spot. He was rushed to the Tiruvallur government hospital, but was declared dead. The accused escaped from the

spot on two-wheelers.

ADSP G Harikumar and Tiruvallur SP R Srinivasa Perumal reached the spot and took stock of the situation with Mappedu police personnel. Sources said the

crime was owing to enmity between two groups of youngsters in the locality, one led by Mukesh and another by his 'friend-turned-foe' Akash, who is also of the same age.

Akash is the prime suspect in the case, police sources said, adding that he is a college dropout involved in petty offences.

The immediate trigger for this crime is believed to be an attack on Akash by Mukesh and his friends, in which the former lost his ear. Though the police had rounded up the accused and presented them before a magistrate court, they were let off with a warning, sources said.

Only 12K street hawkers vote in vending panel membership poll

ONLY 36.8% of registered street vendors in the Chennai corporation limits cast their votes in the zonal town vending committee elections on Thursday. Out of the 33,389 registered street vendors in the city, 12,290 cast votes. The results will be announced on Friday.

The elections were held for 90 members, six for each of the 15 zones. Of them, 42 were elected unopposed, which included all six members in Madhavaram, Alandur and Perungudi zones.

According to the city corporation, Royapuram, Manali, Thiru Vi Ka Nagar and Kodambakkam zones saw the highest voting percentage of registered vendors.

The turnout in Royapuram was 3,492 (44.2%) and Kodambakkam 2,994 (52.49%). Manali saw a 49.4% turnout and

Thiru Vi Ka Nagar 45.37%. “This year, the turnout was better due to increased awareness,” said Chennai Street Vendors Association president C Thiruvettai.

Of the six members in each zone, one member has to be from the SC/ST community, one from

other backward classes, one in the general category, one in the minority category, apart from one woman and one differently-abled member.

“We've selected a candidate who is one of us (street vendors). We're confident that we'll now have a say in matters that concern us,” said Kala P, a street vendor who voted at the Tondiarpet election booth.

According to sources, interference from local councillors created brief disruptions during polling at a few places including in T Nagar.

“Earlier, there was a 15-member Town Vending Committee covering all the zones in Chennai. But now, we'll have a six-member committee for each zone, making it easier to address street vendors' grievances,” said Meeran Moideen, a street vendor and one of the candidates contesting in the Tondiarpet Zone.

BY 12 MONTHS Building regularisation scheme for education institutions extended

THE Tamil Nadu government has granted extended its building regularisation scheme for educational institutions operating in non-plan areas by one more year, offering relief to schools and colleges facing regulatory hurdles.

A government order issued on Thursday by the Housing and Urban Development Department confirmed that the previous deadline, which expired a day earlier, would be pushed forward by 12 months. The move aims to help institutions struggling to secure formal approval for buildings constructed before January 1, 2011 — a requirement for official recognition and compliance certifications.

The delay in securing approval from the Directorate of Town and Country Planning (DTCP) had left many institutions across the state in regulatory limbo. The regularisation scheme, first introduced in 2018, was designed to bring such buildings under the ambit of planning regulations following a Madras High Court directive.

Medical emergency on flight from Abu Dhabi

Chennai: An Etihad Airways flight from Abu Dhabi to Chennai requested immediate medical assistance on arrival Wednesday morning after a passenger onboard reportedly fell seriously ill mid-flight, according to Chennai Airport sources. As soon as flight EY0342 touched down at 8.54am, a medical team and ambulance that were on standby attended to the sick passenger. However, further details on the passenger's condition were not immediately available, sources added. ENS

Madurai pontiff booked for making false claims

Chennai: The Greater Chennai Police's cyber crime wing has registered a case against the Madurai Aadheenam pontiff for falsely claiming that an accident he was involved in May was an attempt on his life, sources said on Thursday. Police sources said that the case has been registered under four sections which pertain to uttering words that create public disorder and promotes enmity between different groups. Sri La Sri Harihara Sri Gnanasambanda Desika Swamikal, the pontiff, had alleged that the car he had been travelling in near Ulundurpettain was hit by another car. Cops had then produced CCTV footage to debunk his claims. A complaint against the pontiff had been filed with Greater Chennai Police that his claims were creating enmity between different communities, police said.



HC tells collector to file plan on clearing encroachments

Madurai: The Madras HC on Thursday directed the Karur collector to file a detailed affidavit containing an action plan to clear encroachments including illegal quarries and brick kilns in the Amaravathi river bed and bunds in Karur district. A special bench comprising justices G R Swaminathan and B Pugalendi, which initiated the suo motu proceedings over the issue recently, also wanted the affidavit to include details of the action to be taken against the authorities who failed to prevent the illegal activities.

Four Nagai fishermen attacked by 'SL' gang

A group of four fishermen from Nagapattinam who put out to sea on Wednesday came under attack, allegedly from a gang of five Sri Lankan nationals, while fishing about 20 nautical miles off Kodyyakarai coast in the early hours of Thursday.

The injured fishermen, identified as M Senthil (47), D Mohan (33), M Arockia Dass (28) and Michael George (26) — all from Seruthur — were admitted to the Nagapattinam Government Medical College Hospital.

According to sources, the four ventured into sea in a fibre boat on Wednesday. Early on Thursday, when the group was about 20 nautical miles east off Kodyyakarai coast, the Sri Lankan nationals intercepted them and attacked them. They then decamped with the group's fishing nets weighing about 500 kg.

GPS equipment, a mobile phone and a 12V battery, sources said.

While Senthil sustained an injury to the forehead, others reported pain from the attack without open wounds. All the four were admitted to the Nagapattinam Government Medical College Hospital.
