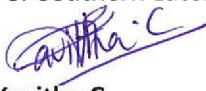

Marsh propels Lucknow to 33-run victory

Ahmedabad, May 23: Mitchell Marsh's blistering 117 and a disciplined bowling display helped Lucknow Super Giants register a commanding 33-run victory over Gujarat Titans in the 64th match of the Indian Premier League at the Narendra Modi Stadium here on Thursday.

Chasing a mammoth target of 236, Gujarat could only manage 202 for 9 in their 20 overs despite valiant knocks from Shahrukh Khan (57 off 29) and Sherfane Rutherford (38 off 22).

Earlier, Marsh was the architect of LSG's imposing total of 235 for 2. The Australian all-rounder, dropped early in his innings, made Guja-

rat pay with a punishing 117 off 64 balls, laced with 10 fours and 8 sixes. His innings was the cornerstone of a 121-run partnership with Nicholas Pooran, who remained unbeaten on 56 off 27 balls (4x4, 5x6).

Electing to bowl first, Gujarat failed to make early inroads. Aiden Markram (36 off 24) and Marsh added 91 for the opening wicket before the South African was dismissed by Ravirivivasan Sai Kishore in the 10th over. From there, it was Marsh and Pooran who tore into Gujarat's bowling attack, with both pacers and spinners struggling to contain the flow of runs.

No Gujarat bowler

managed more than a single wicket, with Rashid Khan proving unusually expensive, conceding 36 runs in just 2 overs. Mohammed Siraj (0/37), Kagiso Rabada (0/45), and Prasad Krishna (0/44) all failed to make breakthroughs, and LSG capitalised to post their season-best total.

In response, Gujarat began briskly with Sai Sudharsan (21) and Shubman Gill (35 off 20) adding 46 in the power-play, but the introduction of William O'Rourke (4-0-27-3) turned the tide. The Kiwi pacer removed Sudharsan, Rutherford, and the dangerous Rahul Tewatia (2) in a telling spell.

Shahrukh fought

back with a 29-ball 57 (5x4, 3x6), briefly raising hopes for the hosts with a 86-run stand with Rutherford, but once the latter perished in the 17th over, the chase unraveled. Avesh Khan (3.5-0-51-2) and Ayush Badoni (1-0-4-2) wrapped up the tail efficiently.

For LSG, it was a collective bowling effort backed by a record-setting batting display. O'Rourke's three wickets and economical bowling proved pivotal, while Akash Maharaj Singh (1/29) and Shahbaz Ahmed (1/41) provided support at crucial junctures.

Indian squad for FIH Hockey Pro League European leg

New Delhi, May 23: Hockey India on Thursday announced the 24-member Indian men's hockey team for the European leg of FIH Hockey Pro League 2024-25 (Men), which is scheduled to take place in Amstelveen, the Netherlands and Antwerp, Belgium from June 7 to 22.

Experienced dragflicker Harmanpreet Singh will continue to lead the side as Captain with midfield maestro Hardik Singh joining him as Vice-Captain.

India will begin their European leg with two matches each against the Netherlands on June 7 and 9 followed by the double header against Argentina on June 11 and 12 at the Wagner Stadium in Amstelveen.

The team will then travel to Antwerp to face Australia on June 14 and 15 before they end their campaign against hosts Belgium on June 21 and 22.

The squad includes Krishan Bahadur Pathak and Suraj Karkera as the goalkeepers. Sumit, Amit Rohidas, Jugraj Singh, Nilam Sanjeev Xess, Captain Harmanpreet Singh, Jarmanpreet Singh, Sanjay and Yashdeep Siwach will occupy the team's defence.

In midfield, the team features Raj Kumar Pal, Nilakanta Sharma, Vice Captain Hardik Singh, young prodigy Rajinder Singh, Manpreet Singh, Vivek Sagar Prasad and Shamsher Singh while Gurjant Singh, Abhishek, Shilanand Lakra, Mandeep Singh, Lalit Kumar Upadhyay, Dilpreet Singh and Sukhjeet Singh will be the attackers for team India.

India played the home leg of the FIH Hockey Pro League

2024-25 (Men) in Bhubaneswar earlier this year where they secured fifteen points with five wins in eight games and now stand third in the points table. With the highest-placed team of the league securing a spot in the 2026 Men's FIH Hockey World Cup, India will be hoping to improve upon their performance and win maximum points in the remaining eight matches of the tournament.

Speaking on the squad selection, chief coach

Craig Fulton stated, "We wanted a bit more experience in the squad this time around and I am really happy with the selection. The team has been training well as we're looking to try and push as hard as possible and win the Pro League. Since there's qualification for the World Cup on the line, we want to try and get as many points to put ourselves in a good position for that."

Reflecting on the Bhubaneswar leg and the

way ahead, Fulton said, "We haven't drawn any games so far in the tournament and I believe we need to turn our losses into draws and then go for a shootout, so if we don't really get the desired results, we can still get points on the board. We also need to improve our penalty corner conversion rate so yes, we've got some good objectives to try and achieve this time around."

This event was inaugurated jointly by Joseph Selva Kumar, Correspondent,

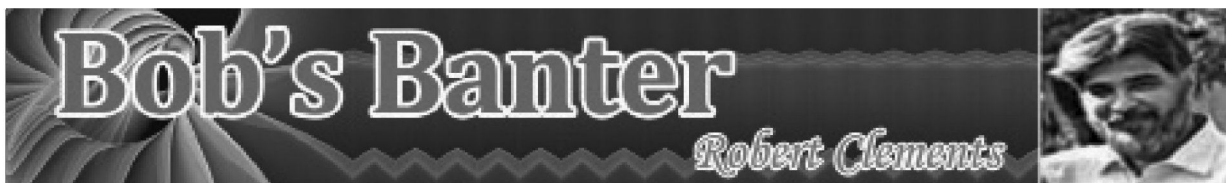
Annai Arul Public School and Christopher Antony Joseph, Dean, Annai Arul Public School.

Ceremonial Power, Colonial Palaces..!

Some years ago, I had the privilege—or perhaps the irony—of being accommodated in a guest house inside the Rashtrapati Bhavan compound. Yes, the President's house. It was just one of those rare opportunities that came my way.

Woke up the next morning to the sight of peacocks strolling past my window as if they had full Z+ security clearance. There was dew on the well-manicured lawns, and I half expected Lord Mountbatten to emerge from behind the hedges for a morning stroll. The breakfast that followed was served by immaculately dressed waiters—so crisp and clean, I almost apologised for wrinkling the air around them.

But what struck me the most were the bathrooms. Yes, the bathrooms. Gilded fittings. Hot water flowing smoother than Parliament sessions. And the sheer size—each one bigger than a Mumbai 2BHK! I nearly got lost trying to find the flush.

And all this lavishness, for whom?

For ceremonial figures. Yes, you heard right—ceremonial. The Rashtrapati Bhavan, and its

mini-cousins, the Raj Bhavans in every state, are colonial relics meant for rulers who actually ruled. The British didn't just govern India, they did it with a throne and a rod.

Their homes needed to match their delusions of grandeur.

But here we are, three-quarters of a century later, still gifting the same opulence to posts that are meant to do nothing more than sign on dotted lines and smile politely at flag hoistings.

And therein lies the problem.

Give someone a palace and suddenly, they start believing they're meant to rule.

They stroll through teak corridors, glide past oil paintings, and somewhere between the chandelier and the chef's soufflé, they forget they're supposed to be symbolic. They begin to imagine themselves as CEOs of the state, not realising they're barely on the board.

And that's when the overreach begins.

One fine morning, a governor thinks he's a parallel chief minister. Another day, the President forgets he or she is

not the Prime Minister. They reject bills, summon CMs, and generally cause as much friction as possible—all while perched on antique chairs worth more than an MLA's constituency fund.

So maybe, just maybe, we need to bring the living quarters in line with the job description. Modest 2BHKs in the suburbs. Let the governor live next to a retired bank manager and the President, a smaller accommodation than the Prime Minister.

It might just help them remember that in a democracy, power flows up from the people, not down from the domes of grand buildings.

And think of the savings! No more millions spent on polishing marble floors or trimming lawns big enough to land a chopper. That money could go to schools, hospitals, or even better—public toilets that don't smell like colonial hangovers.

Let's make democracy modest again. Starting with its palaces which are giving a wrong message to its occupants....!
