India pavilion: A sizzling experience in freezing Davos

New Delhi, 30 January

World leaders, corporate honchos, economists, and scholars from around the globe, who had congregated for the 56th World Economic Forum last week at the Alpine hamlet of Davos, were in for a treat at the India pavilion.

Chef Manu Chandra, who founded Single Thread Catering in March 2022, was back at the conference after three years to whip up Indian treats for those in attendance.

“We had a lot of learnings from the last time and knew that with so many global heads of state present, planning was sacrosanct. Nothing could be left to the last minute. While we made everything fresh, it was all prepped in advance,” said

Chandra, who flew to Davos two days ahead of the event.

Staying at the apartments of Davos residents, which are emptied before the event starts, Chandra and team used to trek for over an hour in the snow to reach the kitchen. They were sharing it with another London-based chef and his team.

With a three-day networking extravaganza in -10 degree celcius, the idea was to serve hot and wholesome food that could be had on-the-go.

With no sit-down buffet type provision, form and presentation mattered as much as the taste and quality, he says. And so, the days kicked off with a *dal tadka* soup shot, made of a *moong* base with the *tadka* oils used as garnish.

Chandra curated a different

gus pallya, a *pullimunchi* with black salsify — a Spanish root vegetable, and a *bajra khichdi*, among others.

“It was local Indian food, with a touch of Europe but did not compromise the soul,” he said.

In a nod to Bengaluru’s bakery culture, there was filter coffee tiramisu, biscuits from the famous Iyengar Bakery replaced the Italian ladyfingers, filter coffee decoction was mixed into the cream, and the dessert topped with a filter coffee

foam instead of cocoa powder.

When serving food from Assam, West Bengal and Bihar, mustard in the *shorshe* prawns were replaced with Swiss mustard and the traditional *kheer kadam* was reimaged as an Austrian Linzertorte, with a raspberry flavoured *rasgulla* wrapped in *sandesh* and a layer of biscuit crumb on top.

When serving food from Punjab, UP, and Delhi, there was a bowl of piping hot *rajma chawal*, “which reminds me of winter lunches after school in Delhi,” he says.

To make sure the Indian flair to the dishes was perfect, Chandra carried with him three different types of rice from different regions for each day, *nachni* (ragi) from the southern states, and *radhuni* and *kashundi* from Bengal, among others.

His favourite moment was when former UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak visited the pavilion and tried several of the creations.

“In an environment where people are always on the move, it is difficult to catch someone’s attention. Luckily for us, Rishi Sunak spent some time exploring our menu,” Chandra says.

Food really is soft power, he added. “And this year, the gravitas was even greater with US President Donald Trump, Ukrainian head of state Volodymyr Zelenskyy, and even Elon Musk. It was also monumental, considering the state of the world today,” he says.

He adds, “Events like these also add a lot of credibility to what we do, and small wins like showing people how far India has come all make for endearing memories.”

Menstrual health integral part of right to life and dignity: SC

The Supreme Court on Friday held that menstrual health is an integral part of the right to life and dignity under Article 21 of the Constitution, directing a nationwide rollout of free menstrual hygiene facilities for adolescent girls in schools.

The Court ordered pan-India implementation of the Union government’s Menstrual Hygiene Policy for School-going Girls for students from Classes 6 to 12, making its directions binding on all schools, both government and private, in urban and rural areas.

A Bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan mandated that every school must be equipped with functional, hygienic and gender-segregated toilets with running water, soap and washing facilities at all times.

Toilet infrastructure, the Court said, must ensure privacy, accessibility and dignity, including for children with disabilities. States and Union Territories were directed to ensure the free provision of oxo-biodegradable sanitary napkins compliant with ASTM D-6954 standards.


These must be made easily accessible to girl students, preferably through vending machines within toilet premises or at clearly identified locations in schools. Schools were also instructed to establish menstrual hygiene management (MHM) corners stocked with spare uniforms, innerwear, disposable pads and other essential materials to address emergencies during menstruation.

“This pronouncement is not just for stakeholders of the legal system. It is also meant for classrooms where girls hesitate to ask for help. It is for teachers who want to help but are restrained due to a lack of resources. And it is for parents who may not realise the impact of their silence,” he said.


“We wish to communicate to every girl child who may have become a victim of absenteeism because her body was perceived as a burden when the fault is not hers,” he added.

The Bench examined the issue through the lens of Articles 14, 21 and 21A. Schools found in violation of RTE norms would face derecognition, while the State would be accountable for lapses in government-run institutions.


The failure to provide basic enabling conditions such as clean washrooms, menstrual products, disposal mechanisms and awareness, the Court said, converts a biological reality into structural exclusion, undermining access to education and long-term opportunity.

The Board of the Directors, at its meeting held on December 10, 2024, approved a Composite Scheme of Arrangement amongst Triveni Engineering & Industries Limited ('TEIL/the Company'), Sir Shadi Lal Enterprises Limited ('SSEL') and Triveni Power Transmission Limited ('TPTL'), and their respective shareholders and creditors, under Sections 230 to 232 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('2013 Act') read with the rules made thereunder ('the Scheme'). The Scheme, inter alia, provides for the amalgamation of SSEL into TEIL and the demerger of the Company's PTB Undertaking into TPTL. The Scheme was filed with the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Allahabad Bench ('Hon'ble NCLT') by way of a Company Application under Sections 230 to 232 of the 2013 Act, and pursuant to the Orders of the Hon'ble NCLT dated October 17, 2025 and October 28, 2025, the meetings of shareholders and creditors for the Company were held on December 7, 2025, where the Scheme was approved with the requisite majority. Further, as directed by the Hon'ble NCLT vide the said orders, notices of the shareholders' and creditors' meetings were published in Financial Express (English) in all editions and Jansatta (Hindi) in all editions. Subsequently, on December 13, 2025, the Company filed a Company Petition with the Hon'ble NCLT seeking sanction of the Scheme, and notices inviting representations, if any, were issued to the relevant regulatory authorities in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble NCLT dated December 16, 2025. The Company Petition is listed for further hearing on February 5, 2026, before the Hon'ble NCLT.

4. The Board of Directors of the Company has declared an interim dividend of 150% (₹1.50 per equity share of face value of ₹1/- each) for the financial year ending March 31, 2026.

500 विश्वविद्यालयों को एआई टूल: वैष्णव

कौशल विकास के लिए विश्वविद्यालयों को मिलेंगे एआई इन्फ्रास्ट्रक्चर और जीपीयू



अश्विनी वैष्णव, केंद्रीय इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स और सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्री

केंद्रीय इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स और सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्री अश्विनी वैष्णव ने शुक्रवार को कहा कि सरकार देश के 500 विश्वविद्यालयों के छात्रों को ग्राफिक्स प्रोसेसिंग यूनिट्स (जीपीयू), स्वदेशी डेटासेट्स और अन्य आर्टिफिशल इंटेलिजेंस टूल

उपलब्ध कराएगी।

वैष्णव ने कहा कि ये टूल और जीपीयू विश्वविद्यालयों को उसी ढाँचे के अंतर्गत दिए जाएंगे, जिसके तरह सरकार ने देशभर के 300 से अधिक विश्वविद्यालयों को सेमीकंडक्टर इलेक्ट्रिकल डिस्चार्ज मशीनिंग (ईडीएम) उपकरण उपलब्ध कराए हैं।

उन्होंने कहा कि छात्रों को एआई में प्रशिक्षित

करने के लिए सरकार विश्वविद्यालयों के साथ मिलकर पाठ्यक्रम को अंतिम रूप देने पर काम कर रही है। वैष्णव ने कहा, 'हम एआई इन्फ्रास्ट्रक्चर उपलब्ध कराएंगे, जहाँ छात्रों को एआई के अवसरों में बहुत अच्छी ट्रेनिंग मिल सके।'

उन्होंने कहा कि सरकार इंडिया एआई मिशन के तहत बड़े शोध कार्यक्रम भी शुरू करेगी। इससे पहले मंगलवार को वैष्णव ने कहा था कि 16 से 20 फरवरी तक दिल्ली में आयोजित हो रही आगामी एआई इम्पैक्ट समिट दुनिया का सबसे बड़ा एआई कार्यक्रम होगा, जिसमें 1 लाख से अधिक लोग भाग लेंगे।

उन्होंने आगे कहा कि अगले छह महीनों में सरकार इंडिया एआई मिशन का दूसरा चरण शुरू करने की योजना बना रही है। वैष्णव ने कहा कि एआई इम्पैक्ट समिट में पिछले दो वर्षों में गुगल, एमेज़ॉन, माइक्रोसॉफ्ट और अन्य कंपनियों द्वारा किए गए लगभग 70 अरब डॉलर के निवेश के दोगुना होने की संभावना है।

इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स और सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्रालय के सचिव एस. कृष्णन ने कहा कि एआई इम्पैक्ट समिट पांच दिवसीय आयोजन के दौरान 10 ठोस नतीजे सामने आ सकते हैं। उन्होंने कहा, 'हम इस समिट के माध्यम से तकनीक, विशेषकर एआई को लोकतांत्रिक बनाना चाहते हैं।'

छह और राज्यों में जापानी भाषा केंद्र खोलने की तैयारी

एनएसडीसी इंटरनैशनल मध्य प्रदेश, हिमाचल प्रदेश, मिजोरम, त्रिपुरा, अरुणाचल प्रदेश और मणिपुर के साथ साझेदारी का कर रहा प्रयास

नैशनल स्किल डेवलपमेंट कॉर्पोरेशन (एनएसडीसी) इंटरनैशनल जापानी भाषा प्रशिक्षण केंद्र स्थापित करने के लिए मध्य प्रदेश, हिमाचल प्रदेश, मिजोरम, त्रिपुरा, अरुणाचल प्रदेश और मणिपुर के साथ साझेदारी करना चाहता है। कौशल विकास और उद्यमिता मंत्रालय के तहत आने वाले एनए-सडीसी का उद्देश्य छोटे शहरों और ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों के युवाओं को प्रशिक्षित करना है ताकि उन्हें अंत-राष्ट्रीय गतिशीलता कार्यक्रमों के तहत आजीविका के लिए जापान भेजा जा सके।

मंत्रालय के सूत्रों के अनुसार, जापानी भाषा प्रशिक्षण केंद्रों में ऐसे लोगों के लिए पूर्णकालिक जापानी भाषा और नौकरियों से जुड़े कार्यक्रम संचालित किए जाते हैं, जो विशिष्ट कुशल श्रमिक और तकनीकी इंटरनैशिय जैसे वीजा पर जापान में काम करना चाहते हैं। ये कार्यक्रम सीधे तौर पर एनएसडीसी इंटरनैशनल या भागीदारों के माध्यम से चलाए जाते हैं।

एनएसडीसी इंटरनैशनल (एनएसडीसीआई) लिमिटेड की



स्थापना अक्टूबर 2021 में हुई थी, जो एनएसडीसी की पूर्ण स्वामित्व वाली सहायक कंपनी है और कौशल मंत्रालय के प्रशासनिक नियंत्रण में काम करती है। एनएसडीसी इंटरनैशनल ने गुरुग्राम और मणिपुर विश्वविद्यालय समेत कई जगहों पर जापानी भाषा प्रशिक्षण केंद्र स्थापित किए हैं।

इस सप्ताह की शुरुआत में एनएसडीसीआई ने दोनों देशों के बीच अगस्त 2025 में लागू मानव संसाधन विनियमन कार्य योजना के तहत लगभग 40 युवाओं को जापान भेजा। यह संगठन 8 से 9

महीने की अवधि वाले भाषाई और नौकरी से जुड़े जापानी कार्यस्थल शिष्टाचार और सांस्कृतिक संवेदीकरण कार्यक्रम चलाता है। एनएसडीसी के मुख्य कार्यकारी अधिकारी अरुण कुमार पिल्लई ने विदाई समारोह में कहा, 'इन जैसी साझेदारियों के माध्यम से हम अपने युवाओं के लिए सार्थक अंतरराष्ट्रीय करियर बनाने का रास्ता तैयार कर रहे हैं। ऐसा करके, वैश्विक कार्यबल की जरूरतों के लिए भारत की प्रतिष्ठा को विश्वसनीय, भविष्य के लिए तैयार भागीदार के रूप में मजबूत कर रहे हैं।' वर्ष 2025 के भारत-जापान

वार्षिक शिखर सम्मेलन के दौरान दोनों देशों ने सरकार, उद्योग और शिक्षा जगत में विभिन्न संस्थाओं के प्रयासों को बढ़ावा देने का संकल्प लिया था, ताकि अगले पांच वर्षों में भारत से जापान जाने वाले कुशल कर्मियों और संभावित प्रतिभा पेशेवरों की संख्या 50,000 तक बढ़ाई जा सके।

अब तक, इस पहल के तहत लगभग 400 उम्मीदवारों को प्रशिक्षित किया जा चुका है, जिनमें से केवल 185 इस समय जापान में काम कर रहे हैं।

India pavilion: A sizzling experience in freezing Davos

New Delhi, 30 January

World leaders, corporate honchos, economists, and scholars from around the globe, who had congregated for the 56th World Economic Forum last week at the Alpine hamlet of Davos, were in for a treat at the India pavilion.

Chef Manu Chandra, who founded Single Thread Catering in March 2022, was back at the conference after three years to whip up Indian treats for those in attendance.

“We had a lot of learnings from the last time and knew that with so many global heads of state present, planning was sacrosanct. Nothing could be left to the last minute. While we made everything fresh, it was all prepped in advance,” said

Chandra, who flew to Davos two days ahead of the event.

Staying at the apartments of Davos residents, which are emptied before the event starts, Chandra and team used to trek for over an hour in the snow to reach the kitchen. They were sharing it with another London-based chef and his team.

With a three-day networking extravaganza in -10 degree celcius, the idea was to serve hot and wholesome food that could be had on-the-go.

With no sit-down buffet type provision, form and presentation mattered as much as the taste and quality, he says. And so, the days kicked off with a *dal tadka* soup shot, made of a *moong* base with the *tadka* oils used as garnish.

Chandra curated a different

menu for each of the three days, paying homage to three different parts of the country.

Paying homage to states south of the Vindhyas, the chef paired *madur vadas* with a white *aspara-*

foam instead of cocoa powder.

When serving food from Assam, West Bengal and Bihar, mustard in the *shorshe* prawns were replaced with Swiss mustard and the traditional *kheer kadam* was reimaged as an Austrian Linzertorte, with a raspberry flavoured *rasgulla* wrapped in *sandesh* and a layer of biscuit crumb on top.

When serving food from Punjab, UP, and Delhi, there was a bowl of piping hot *rajma chawal*, “which reminds me of winter lunches after school in Delhi,” he says.

To make sure the Indian flair to the dishes was perfect, Chandra carried with him three different types of rice from different regions for each day, *nachni* (ragi) from the southern states, and *radhuni* and *kashundi* from Bengal, among others.

His favourite moment was when former UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak visited the pavilion and tried several of the creations.

“In an environment where people are always on the move, it is difficult to catch someone's attention. Luckily for us, Rishi Sunak spent some time exploring our menu,” Chandra says.

Food really is soft power, he added. “And this year, the gravitas was even greater with US President Donald Trump, Ukrainian head of state Volodymyr Zelenskyy, and even Elon Musk. It was also monumental, considering the state of the world today,” he says.

He adds, “Events like these also add a lot of credibility to what we do, and small wins like showing people how far India has come all make for endearing memories.”

Menstrual health integral part of right to life and dignity: SC

The Supreme Court on Friday held that menstrual health is an integral part of the right to life and dignity under Article 21 of the Constitution, directing a nationwide rollout of free menstrual hygiene facilities for adolescent girls in schools.

The Court ordered pan-India implementation of the Union government's Menstrual Hygiene Policy for School-going Girls for students from Classes 6 to 12, making its directions binding on all schools, both government and private, in urban and rural areas.

A Bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan mandated that every school must be equipped with functional, hygienic and gender-segregated toilets with running water, soap and washing facilities at all times.

Toilet infrastructure, the Court said, must ensure privacy, accessibility and dignity, including for children with disabilities. States and Union Territories were directed to ensure the free provision of oxo-biodegradable sanitary napkins compliant with ASTM D-6954 standards.




These must be made easily accessible to girl students, preferably through vending machines within toilet premises or at clearly identified locations in schools. Schools were also instructed to establish menstrual hygiene management (MHM) corners stocked with spare uniforms, innerwear, disposable pads and other essential materials to address emergencies during menstruation.


“This pronouncement is not just for stakeholders of the legal system. It is also meant for classrooms where girls hesitate to ask for help. It is for teachers who want to help but are restrained due to a lack of resources. And it is for parents who may not realise the impact of their silence,” he said.

“We wish to communicate to every girl child who may have become a victim of absenteeism because her body was perceived as a burden when the fault is not hers,” he added.

The Bench examined the issue through the lens of Articles 14, 21 and 21A. Schools found in violation of RTE norms would face derecognition, while the State would be accountable for lapses in government-run institutions.

The failure to provide basic enabling conditions such as clean washrooms, menstrual products, disposal mechanisms and awareness, the Court said, converts a biological reality into structural exclusion, undermining access to education and long-term opportunity.

The Board of the Directors, at its meeting held on December 10, 2024, approved a Composite Scheme of Arrangement amongst Triveni Engineering & Industries Limited ('TEIL/the Company'), Sir Shadi Lal Enterprises Limited ('SSEL') and Triveni Power Transmission Limited ('TPTL'), and their respective shareholders and creditors, under Sections 230 to 232 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('2013 Act') read with the rules made thereunder ('the Scheme'). The Scheme, inter alia, provides for the amalgamation of SSEL into TEIL and the demerger of the Company's PTB Undertaking into TPTL. The Scheme was filed with the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Allahabad Bench ('Hon'ble NCLT') by way of a Company Application under Sections 230 to 232 of the 2013 Act, and pursuant to the Orders of the Hon'ble NCLT dated October 17, 2025 and October 28, 2025, the meetings of shareholders and creditors for the Company were held on December 7, 2025, where the Scheme was approved with the requisite majority. Further, as directed by the Hon'ble NCLT vide the said orders, notices of the shareholders' and creditors' meetings were published in Financial Express (English) in all editions and Jansatta (Hindi) in all editions. Subsequently, on December 13, 2025, the Company filed a Company Petition with the Hon'ble NCLT seeking sanction of the Scheme, and notices inviting representations, if any, were issued to the relevant regulatory authorities in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble NCLT dated December 16, 2025. The Company Petition is listed for further hearing on February 5, 2026, before the Hon'ble NCLT.

4. The Board of Directors of the Company has declared an interim dividend of 150% (₹1.50 per equity share of face value of ₹1/- each) for the financial year ending March 31, 2026.
